"Corporate vs familyowned funeral homes, does it matter?"



A matter we want to answer for readers this month is in relation to a comment that appears from time to time in the news. This is the reference to "Corporate Funeral Homes vs. Family-

Owned funeral homes". Is there really a difference? Is it really a point of differentiation? For a family dealing with a death, does it really matter?

There was a time in New Zealand, when practically all funeral homes were family owned with the business passing down from generation to generation. - · and most importantly safeguard your decisions by choosing a funeral home that is a member of the Funeral Directors Association of New Zealand (FDANZ).





Van Lier Nurseries is recovering well from a large fire during the last weekend of August. It lost about 7000 square metres of equipment which included a heating system vital for propagating mainly tropical plants.

The story "A Growing Business" detailed how Walter and Maria Van Lier started in Glen Eden in 1952 a year after arriving from post-World War Two Holland.

In 1961 a Chamberlain Road property was acquired in Massey, growing and selling mainly carnations then roses. The Riverhead Road nursery was established in 2001

Kaipara Moana Remediation



Kaipara Moana Remediation has signed an agreement with the Department of Conservation (DOC) which will environmentally benefit waterways around Auckland.

Kaipara Moana Remediation Pou Tātaki Justine Daw says her team is welcoming the agreement as another significant collaboration to benefit the Kaipara Harbour.

In the Auckland region, DOC administers 45 kilometres of marginal strips which border waterways that flow into the

Kaipara Harbour says Alex Rogers, Director Operations, Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland. "With this agreement, DOC is welcoming local-led conservation on a swathe of small but crucial strips of public conservation land."

Through the agreement, KMR and DOC are making it easier for landowners with neighbouring land to protect and restore 45km of rivers, streams, wetlands and coastal margins, and reduce sediment flowing into the Kaipara Harbour. "Further benefits of native planting include restoring habitats for valued species, creating healthier places to swim and recreate, and building greater resilience to storms and floods. "This is what DOC's recent call to get out naturing is all about - working together for the benefit of natural places like Kaipara Harbour, in every way we can," says Alex.

"As New Zealand's largest harbour system, the Kaipara Moana includes 6,000 km2 of catchment across Auckland and Northland regions, and over 8,000 km of waterways flowing into the harbour - so protecting the Moana is critical," says Justine. "The Kaipara has deep environmental values, with some of the rarest ecosystems in New Zealand, including sand-dune, seagrass, freshwater and estuarine wetland ecosystems. As the breeding ground for New Zealand's snapper fishery, and home to many taonga species, the Kaipara Moana also has major economic, cultural and recreational value," she says.

Under the agreement, KMR supports landowners and groups to access its grant funding and expertise to plant suitable natives on neighbouring marginal strips and maintain the planted areas through weed control.

Justine says to take part, your land must be in the Auckland region and within the Kaipara Moana catchment, while meeting specific KMR and DOC requirements.

"Your land must also be next to land administered by DOC which borders a river, stream or wetland, or the Kaipara Moana itself. There must be an existing fence between your land and the marginal strip administered by DOC," says Justine.

All projects under the Agreement focus on planting natives on the marginal strip and maintaining the planted area through suitable weed control. To find out more, contact hono@kmr.org.nz and ask about the KMR/DOC Agreement.

- Thin trees (with 3-6 meters between crowns) for at least 30 meters from house, this reduces how far and fast a fire can spread

Additional tips

- Ensure your house number is easy for emergency services to find.
- Make sure your driveway is wide enough to accommodate emergency vehicles (at least 4 x 4 meters).
- When building or renovating, consider using fire retardant or non-flammable materials, such as corrugated iron roofs, metal fences and double-glazing.
- If you live closer than 30 meters from your neighbor, it will pay to talk to them. What occurs on their property will impact on yours.

Don't wait until you smell smoke in the air and see flames on the ridgeline to make a plan, because it will be too late. Take steps to understand how fire may affect your property, your home and your buildings. Consider the advice above and develop a plan of action that you can put into effect before an event. Unlike floods, hurricanes or earthquakes, there are simple and often inexpensive ways to make your home safer and increase its chances of surviving a fire.



Hazards 10-30 metres from your home:

- Put away outdoor furniture covers when not in use.
- Screen vents and enclose decks so vegetation and debris can't collect, and embers can't enter.
- Use stone, cement, tiles and green grass to create a 'clear zone' around your house so surface fires can't reach your house.
- Prune tree branches to a height of 2 meters or more so

However Al can make things up and provide information that sounds accurate or factual but is incorrect. Scammers are now using Al to create very convincing scam stories, create fake videos or convincing-looking photos. Scammers can use AI to write convincing emails or texts that appear to be from a trusted source. Be sceptical and always verify contacts and content carefully via official or trusted channels.

Privacy. Al tools often collect and store your data to improve their functionality. This can compromise your privacy as it could be shared or used without your knowledge. Avoid entering personal or confidential details (like bank information or passwords) into Al tools.

Warning tips. Are you surprised at a message? Is it unexpected, urgent or emotionally changed? Is there controlling behaviour? Are you being pushed to act quickly, click on a link or not consult others? Is access requested? Are they asking for personal details or access to your account or device? Is money requested? Are they asking for payments or gift cards? Stop and seek support. Stop communicating and contact someone you trust, or contact Netsafe on netsafe.org.nz or call 0508 638 723. Anxiety has quietly become an epidemic not just in people, but in our pets too. Dogs are emotional mirrors: they sense our stress.

inconsistency, and uncertainty. When we're frazzled, so are they.

One of the simplest yet most powerful antidotes is healthy boundaries. A fence doesn't just keep things out; it keeps things safe within. Boundaries provide predictability and security - the same way a child feels calmer with bedtime routines and clear rules.

Inconsistent training confuses animals. Without structure, an anxious dog begins making its own decisions, which can spiral into fear-based aggression. Consistency isn't control – it's compassion through leadership.

A routine - same feeding times, daily walks, known bedtime - tells the nervous system: "You're safe." I often teach new puppy owners the art of gentle containment - hold your pup calmly until it relaxes completely, then release. Make relaxation part of their norm. That moment of surrender builds lifelong trust and is far easier to instil in puppies, compared with adult dogs.

A relaxed, confident dog with clear boundaries is a joy to live with and a positive presence in the community. But a confused, anxious, or fearful dog can become a ticking time bomb. Let's make calm, connected, compassionate dog training normal again - and give our pets the leadership and love they need to thrive.

Trade Me Property listings up 24%

Hopeful vendors surged into the market in September. with the number of new listings on Trade Me Property up a whopping 24% compared to August, and up 5.9% compared to September last year.

Enduring Powers of Attorney

As you age, it can get harder to make important decisions about your welfare and about your property. This can happen because of loss of mental capacity, or even just additional difficulties in navigating banking systems, contracts and the medical system.

An Enduring Power of Attorney (EPA) allows you to appoint someone you trust to act as your attorney in certain circumstances and endures beyond any loss of mental capacity. There are two sorts of EPAs under New Zealand law. One for Health (dealing with matters relating to your general care and welfare) and another for Property (dealing with your property affairs). In each case, it is essential that you give your EPA to a person you trust completely to uphold your financial or health interests.

Your EPA must be given before you have lost capacity to understand and appreciate your own property or health interests. It is possible for someone to instead apply to the court to be appointed as your property manager or welfare guardian if you lose capacity without granting an EPA. A property manager or welfare guardian can make many of the same decisions as an EPA. However, that process can take very long and involves significant costs. The court order will also need to be extended every 3 years.

Rental report



Improving elements of your property so you can charge more for rent makes economic sense if the long-term gains will easily offset the improvement costs. Understanding all obligations mortgages by Tina White



The word mortgage comes from 'death pledge'. It's not as gloomy as it sounds, but it does hint at the seriousness of what you're signing up for. When you borrow money from a bank to purchase your home. the bank will usually register what's called an all obligations mortgage on your property title as security for the loan.

One of the most common forms of mortgage security; it doesn't just cover the loan you're currently taking out; it secures all current and future debts with that same bank. This includes your new home loan, any personal loans, credit cards, loans you've guaranteed for someone else, joint accounts with others and company loans where you're a director.

We recently acted for a de facto couple purchasing a home together. Their bank required an all obligations mortgage. During our meeting, we explained the implications of this type of mortgage. One client mentioned he already owned another property with his siblings, and it too was mortgaged with the same bank. Because both properties were secured by all obligations mortgages with that same bank, the bank could treat them as connected security. This meant that if the siblings defaulted on their loan, the bank could choose to sell either property to recover its costs-including the de facto couple's new home-even if their loan was in good standing.

To reduce your exposure under an all obligations mortgage, you could consider using different banks for different loans or financial relationships (e.g. business vs personal) or ask your bank for assurance that they would treat each property in isolation.





Mortgagee Sales Double

A sharp increase in the number of mortgagee sale properties has emerged over the last few weeks.

Interest.co.nz has been tracking the number of mortgagee sales on the market each week since November 2022. Mortgagee sales have hovered between 50 and 60 for most of last year, then began rising again this year. The increase in mortgagee sales has been particularly strong since late September this year. At the beginning of October it went past 90 for the first time since interest.co.nz began collating the numbers. By mid-October, the numbers had surged to 109.

The timing of the increase is surprising because it comes as mortgage interest rates have been falling. However, Reserve Bank data shows the total value of impaired loans held by banks increased by \$15 million in August to \$563 million.

However, the fact the number of mortgagee sales has been rising even as interest rates fall suggests the most likely reason is borrowers have faced an unexpected drop in income, usually due to job loss or business failure.

In such situations, no amount of mortgage restructure can make up for the fact the borrower simply has no money coming in. The borrowers who will be most vulnerable in such a situation will be those who bought during the 2021/22 housing boom, particularly those who purchased their property with a low equity loan at the maximum term available, and then suffered a loss of income.

As well as losing their ability to make their mortgage payments, these people may also have faced the indignity of being tipped into negative equity, as the value of their home declined in the face of a weaker housing market, leaving them with little wriggle room to restructure the loan.

The Joy and Power of reading with young people: A playful path to vocabulary and understanding


Reading with young people is a little bit like planting a magical seed-you never quite know how it will grow, but with care, imagination, and a few good storybooks, something wonderful always happens. 

For Eyes Optometrists are sharing a range of case histories detected with their specialised examination equipment.

Today's patient had no symptoms, but his Optomap wide-field scans showed a subtle dark patch just under the

left optic nerve (marked with an arrow in the image 1). The blood vessels crossing the area suggest it is raised, so optical coherence tomography (OCT) scans were performed to provide a cross-section view of the retina and confirm this. A raised lump can be clearly seen in image 2.

This patient had seen an eve specialist 5 years prior and there was no record of a lump, suggesting it could be of recent onset (although being subtle, it may simply not have been observed on that occasion). Optometrist Molly Whittington sent a report to the original eye specialist who referred the case on to an oncology ophthalmologist at Greenlane Hospital for specialised tests, as a dark, raised lump of recent onset is suspicious for an early melanoma.

The diagnosis was good news: a choroidal hemangioma. These are not cancers and never metastasise. Typically. they are reddish to orange coloured but can have areas of increased pigmentation like this one, which can make them difficult to differentiate from choroidal melanomas.

Hemangiomas can grow within the blood vessel layer beneath the retina called the choroid. If located in the macula (centre of vision) or if they leak fluid which causes a retinal detachment or cystic changes in the retina, they can affect visual acuity. However, many choroidal hemangiomas never grow or leak fluid and can be observed without treatment. This one will be monitored annually, with referral made if any changes occur.

Is Botox® reversible? Anon. Kumeu

No. It is understandable to want reassurance that if you try a treatment and don't love the result, there's a way back, but Botox® isn't reversible the same way dermal fillers

Most fillers are made of

hyaluronic acid, and if needed, can be dissolved instantly with a special enzyme called Hyaluronidase. Botox® is different. Once it's placed into a muscle, it binds to the nerve endings and blocks their signals. This relaxation is what softens expression lines and prevents new wrinkles from forming. There is no medication that can "erase" Botox® once it's there.

That doesn't mean you're stuck if you don't like the look. The effect is temporary. Your body naturally breaks down the toxin over time, and the nerve endings regenerate, returning to full function once it wears off gradually over three to four months. In some cases, if there is any imbalance, a small adjustment can be made with additional units to restore symmetry.

If you're nervous about trying Botox®, the best approach is to start with a light dose and build up gradually. That way you can ease into the treatment and feel confident about how your face responds.

The key takeaway? Botox® isn't reversible in the moment, but it's never permanent. With careful, conservative treatment, the results should feel natural and reassuring.



And if you decide it isn't for you, your face will always return to its normal movement as the effects wear off.

Perioral dermatitis is an increasingly common skin condition that



St Chad's church 100th celebrations

It was rung by builder Allan Wallace who had helped restore the belfry both before and after a fire destroyed the original church in 1990. More about the belfry and fire and many other events were featured in an exhibition put together by Mrs Marcia Gason, displayed at the church along with a model of the original church.

A reading from the "Church Gazette" in November 2, 1925, was included in the service. The Bishop's message was about the importance of community and 'abiding in the vine'. It can be read on the church's website. After the service, a special cake was cut by the longest-continuous and most senior member of the church, Mrs Pat Appleton.

The original church building was opened in 1925 on the corner of SH16 and Oraha Rd (now MacDonald's). Previously services had been held in various locations around the Kumeu/Huapai district.

St Chad's continues to play a major role in the community with church services and many community events including Christian Meditation, Coffee and Craft, Board Games, Selwyn Centre, Chinese Language, Yoga, Fellowship Group, Kumeu Friendship Club and Senior Net.



Your Local Justice of the Peace



The Kumeu district is fortunate to be served by 18 dedicated locals who generously volunteer their time to support our community. Some members have served as Justices of the Peace (JPs) for over 30 years, a testament to their commitment and the trust they've earned as valued members of our area.

The Kumeu JP group spans a wide age range-from individuals in their mid-thirties to those in their eighties. Their role goes far beyond signing, stamping, and witnessing important documents. JPs are also called upon to support vulnerable youth during police interviews, authorize warrants, and, as judicial JPs, preside over minor cases and deliver sentences.

Kumeu's JPs are proud to be the first group nationwide to achieve full accreditation. They volunteer at local libraries, malls, courts, and even at the Whenuapai Air Force Base. Many also open their homes to anyone needing documents witnessed, declarations made, or affidavits sworn or affirmed.

At a recent gathering, long-serving JP Russell Brown was recognized for 15 years of dedicated service to the Kumeu area. Remarkably, one member of the group has served as a JP for over 38 years!

"It is a great experience being a JP," says Area Coordinator Helen Peterson. "You meet people from all walks of lifestudents starting new journeys, families reuniting from overseas, young couples buying their first home, and those facing hardship. It's an amazing way to see what's happening in our communities. When you see many people withdrawing KiwiSaver for hardship, you know times are tough for some. Other times, you share in the excitement of first-home buyers starting a new chapter."

We are truly fortunate in Kumeu and the surrounding areas to have such a knowledgeable and dedicated group of JPs. They carry out their duties and open their homes, often for decades, without expectation of reward.

But if you ask them why they do it, they'll tell you: it's about supporting their local community and making a real difference in the lives of their fellow citizens.

Sayers Says it

A major law change is being proposed to prevent new housing being built in flood-prone areas.

In 2022, the previous Labour

Government introduced Plan Change 78, which altered Auckland's Unitary Plan to allow most single-house residential sections to be split into three lots, each with a three-storey home. The aim was to boost housing supply and affordability, potentially increasing Auckland's housing capacity from 900,000 to two million homes.

However, the rules also permitted intensification within flood-prone areas and banned "downzoning," meaning land at risk of flooding could not be rezoned to stop inappropriate development. Auckland Council has long been forced to approve such consents if landowners could show they could keep occupants safe. When the Council tried to decline applications, landowners took Council to court - and won.

Now the Coalition Government plans to reverse these provisions through a new Plan Change 120, reverting zoning in flood-risk areas back to one house per property. Building multiple three-storey homes would no longer be permitted as of right and would instead need resource consent under stricter rules.

While the Government still aims for up to two million homes across Auckland, higher-density development will be focused in the central city and along major transport routes. Flood-risk areas would face tougher standards, including higher floor levels and safer evacuation routes, or risk consent refusal altogether.

The Government will not buy back privately owned floodprone vacant land, as that would be too costly. Instead, such properties would be limited to one home needing to pass far stricter consent controls.

Public consultation on Plan Change 120 runs from November 3 to December 19, with final decisions expected around mid-2027.

This is your opportunity to have your say on whether these flood-zone housing rules should remain – or be made much stricter.

Kumeu Rotary Christmas Parade 2025

The change of direction is basically the parade needs a new assembly point organisers say.

The parade went into recession for several years and was

revitalised in 1974 by Barrie Herring of Huapai Hardware and Laurie Wallace when more businesses were around.

A two-person wheelbarrow race was added from Kumeu to Huapai with placegetters earning a well-deserved beer at the Huapai Hotel.

Santa rode on a fire truck after the Huapai fire station was built.

Organisers say the parade is now "the best night of the year".
