Economists throughout the region are highlighting the continued sales value spike in residential house prices in the area. "We are seeing 35% of the residential listings coming to market of previous years" says Graham Mcintyre, Principal of LJ Hooker Huapai. "This sellers market is definitely the result of council's inability to stimulate the release of residential land and very few building consents issued over the last four years. We now face a shortage of builders and resources due to the Christchurch rebuild and this will

continue to influence the market, reduce supply, and increase residential house prices.

Battle heats up on reserve spend


To Bob Howard, Chairman, Rodney Local Board.


Busy time all round with community events

Unitary plan and the R.U.B

The Council on the 15th March released the draft 'Unitary Plan' which is now available for public comments. The submission period is up to the 31st May which gives us 2 months for comment. The formal notified 'Unitary Plan' will be released in Sept-Oct 2013, just as the Councillor & Board members go out for re-election. The ideas floated in the 'Unitary Plan has some major changes for the next 30 years. The significant change is the higher density in residential areas with high rise in Westgate & Henderson. Kumeu & Riverhead have not had major changes to existing urban areas, however, the future urban extension has been proposed up to Puke & Tawa Roads. The Council have acknowledged that the extensive consultation which occurred in Manukau hasn't occurred in Kumeu or Massey. The R.U.B. (rural urban boundary) which has been indicatively applied but not finalised by Council is located around the future urban areas. The promise from the Board and Penny Hulse is that consultation will take place with the community. None of the existing zoning in Kumeu-Huapai have been changed, however, smaller residential sites have been proposed. Only Huapai North urban zoning has been confirmed as a new urban extension. The community have to decide quickly where the R.U.B. boundary will be. Areas outside that line will be prohibited from urban or countryside living zoning. There will be notice of a public meeting to discuss the proposals. The next Ratepayers meeting is on the 3rd April at the Community Centre. Cont from pg 1...Bob, what 'I am on about' - specifically - is a formal request for your Board, and Ward, and Council Representatives to show us Riverhead Residents the differences between the latest Amendment of Riverhead Future Urban development land and how this differs from our Riverhead Structure Plan setting our growth. Was there any consultation for "some sort of play area" as you state? This supposed play area will be outside of our designated town centre and central War Memorial Park. Have you referred to our Riverhead Structure Plan (SP) at all? Or even talked with your local people? Show us this new development plan vs. the SP development plan so we can be sure that all is as per PLAN, how it should be. I would be very happy if I were wrong. Show us too that there was no "trade off" as alleged and admitted (then reneged) by you. Simple. As a public servant, you do need to open your Council books when requested. As a constituent, I can request this and reasonably expect you to send me the information without you referring me to "the Web". All these developments have paid 'Development Contributions' (DCs) and I am once again requesting a tally of these DCs paid. You are welcome to confer with your superiors in order to correctly advise us of what funds Riverhead has contributed to the pool... and where these are to be spent. This is not "out of your control" as you complain. You were elected to a responsible role and are answerable as such. To email me "thanking me for my input" when I am requesting information and specific answers is simply not good enough. To then email me and ask me "what am I on about" takes the cake. Your role is to seek the answers your constituents raise questions to and look after your local area in doing so. Further to that, the attached proposed Rural Urban Boundary (RUB) 'shift' distinctly shows planned growth outside of our Riverhead Structure Plan (SP) set area. Are you at all familiar with our SP? The new proposal shows our Riverhead spreading beyond the development growth area all the way to SH16. Is this to satisfy your own personal realtor at Harcourts needs, and the want for more sales?? Perhaps your role is a conflict of interest with regards to future planning of our local district? Penny Webster (our Rodney Ward Councillor) and Len (our Mayor), I look forward to a formal update on these issues, as I have emailed you both previously, the issues of Development Contributions going nowhere here in Riverhead as originally promised during the SP process, and also that of a massive shift in Rural urban Boundary (RUB) that may join Riverhead to Kumeu. This simply does not reflect the substantial growth that we at Riverhead have already accepted and are now suffering under duress with no promised DV's coming back to support us locals. Power outages can damage your computer

Over the last month we have seen more damage as a result of power outages. In one case a component blew off the motherboard, rendering the computer useless. Valuable data can also be lost as a result of this. Damage can be prevented using an appliance between the computer and the power socket. This acts like a buffer when there are power fluctuations. The appliance is called a UPS (Uninterruptable Power Supply). A typical consumer UPS is a surge protector that contains a high-capacity rechargeable battery. Many businesses use uninterruptible power supplies to keep their equipment running in case of a power failure. While a UPS may only keep a computer running for 15 minutes after the power is lost, it is usually sufficient time to save all necessary documents and properly shut down the computer. 

Fire represents a real threat to our community

Over the past 3 months the Auckland region has dealt with 3 large fires at Great Barrier Island, Dome Valley and Tapora on the Kaipara. The 3 fires destroyed approximately 300 hectares of bush and forest and cost over 1.5 million dollars to extinguish. The Waitakere Brigade contributed 250 hours to the fire control efforts with crews working long days building fire breaks, helicopter operations and working with fire fighting equipment to extinguish the fire. The 2 main land fires put a lot of pressure on the local fire resources with Karekare, Bethells, 'Muriwai and Kaukapakapa all contributing to the fire control effort. All 3 of the fires were started by human activities which is why it so important to take care with out door fires and follow the advice from the fire authority. The importance of current teaching practices



At Country Bears we are always researching up to date theory and new practice from around the world, as we feel it is important to be aware of new findings that maybe important to consider in our teaching practices. More recently there has been some interesting research and findings in the toddler years that we feel is of interest to all parents of young children. We would like to share a small snippet with you. Feelings: Feelings are crucial. Why? Because feelings lead to behaviours. Feelings motivate us. Feelings result in actions .Our society frequently overlooks the importance of feelings. We focus on behaviour rather than on the feelings which cause the behaviours. We are often still blind to feelings. When exploring the embryology of feelings, we find that our earliest feelings – and how these early feelings combine with each other and with experience to form our adult emotional life. Intelligence: Over the past decade, studies have shown how bright infants and young children really are. It turns out they are much smarter than we used to think. This creates a tremendous opportunity to get their cognitive development off to a good start. But just as important, is intel-

ligence also allows us to give the emotional development of children a huge head start. Language: Young children usually begin to talk somewhere between the ages of one and three, long before this, they can understand words. As they begin to talk, their psychological world changes dramatically. We use the term translation for the process of linking children's words to their feelings. Translation exponentially enhances the child's capacity for self-soothing, tension-regulation, and character-building. Summary: These three elements – feelings, intelligence, and language – comprise the foundation of human development. They interact in important ways, giving us a remarkable opportunity to enhance development. However, too often these elements are presented individually, as if each one is an answer unto itself. This is unfortunate – for the whole truly is greater than the sum of the parts. The interaction of feelings, intelligence, and language presents us with a remarkable opportunity. It is the interaction of these processes which is creating the Revolution in Infant and Child Development and helping us understand the embryology of human motivation. 



1 1/4 cup flour 2 table spoons cocoa 2 teaspoons Baking powder 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 1 1/4 cup flour 2 table spoons cocoa 2 teaspoons Baking powder 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Sift flour, baking powder, cocoa and cinnamon.

Rub in butter, add brown sugar.

Beat milk and egg together.

Use a wooden spoon to mix until just combined (don't over-mix or your muffins will be tough). Spoon batter into cases so each is one-third full. Place an unwrapped Easter egg into the middle of each muffin. Spoon over remaining muffin batter.

Bake at 180 for 10-15 minutes.




Kumeu art centre is going off
