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## NEW HOUSING & NEW SHOPS

The biggest change in commercial development since the 1970's in Kumeu, has occurred with the opening of a new Supermarket on the 1st April. That change will bring the pressures on the existing retail area, in that they are now forced to compete with a big supplier. The older style shops despite good service in the past, will be having to complete on price and volume of goods. The second set of lights for the Supermarket hopefully will not add to the traffic congestion, time will tell! In Huapai, local owners, Ben Vallings & Adrian Spraggs are proposing new shops on the south side of the Main Road between the Huapai Tavern and Ambiance. These shops will have all their parking in the front making it easy to see carparking spaces available. These shops will have a modern design and will add to the existing shops in Huapai. The District will need them with the projected growth in Huapai North and around the triangle land on Station Road. Solving the alternative access road to service the growth areas is still an unknown. Auckland Transport are being difficult and haven't disclosed yet their roading options for the District. Given that Auckland Transport have over the last 6 months upgraded Nobilo, Station, Koraha, Riverhead & Dysart Roads without letting anyone know what is happening, means there is a plan, it's just that they don't want the community to know about it. The widening of the Main Road from Taupaki to Kumeu is proposed. Likewise the widening of the Main Road in Kumeu-Huapai is proposed to cope with the extra traffic. We all know traffic in Kumeu is at a high level where it is diffiuclt to access local shops. I am continually told that commuters and locals are already finding their own alternative access to avoid the Main Road in Kumeu. The Association has taken a strong stand in the Unitary Plan on, alternative access, schools, reserves and all the other infrastructure issues that should be out for public inspection and debate. No planning has been completed by the Auckland Council, its predecessor Rodney District Council or the previous and current Rodney Local Board. The Community is entitled to 'planning certainty' before development takes place. We don't have that at present. What we do have, is speculative raw land purchases with no timing of development density or planned infrastructures.

Whether you seek some land for your Hamster or a section with a view of the inner harbour, the one thing that is guaranteed, in the next few years you will have significant choice, land prices should reduce, and mortgage rates and building prices will be more. We suggest a patient and prudent approach to securing your future.


#### TWO DAY BOOK FAIR - APRIL 12 & 13

If you are a parent, be aware of what your child or children are doing online, and keep an eye on who they are talking to both online or through text messaging. If you are the Victim of cyber bullying you may feel embarrassed, angry, sad, threatened or depressed, it is normal to feel that way, and you should make sure you talk to someone who can help you. If you know of someone who is being bullied, offer

#### OCR RISE 0.25% - NOT ALL BAD

Mike Pero founder and director of both Mike Pero Mortgages and Mike Pero Real Estate. The Reserve Bank made the anticipated announcement of a rise in the OCR. The rate has gone from 2.5% to 2.75% and further rate increases are predicted through 2014 that could see the OCR up to 4.50% in 2015. So what might this do for home buyers and home owners with mortgages. If banks choose to pass on this increase, in time, then this announcement could mean an increase in repayments as follows: The interest component will increase payments, for a \$100,000 home loan by \$4.81 a week \$200,000 - \$9.62 a week; \$300,000 - \$14.43 a week and \$500,000 - \$24.04 a week. In my opinion the increase is neither here nor there. It was inevitable it would raise but I do not think it will slow the market. To offset any perceived negativity here the banks are starting to ease their restrictions on high value lending. The LVR restrictions that came in late last year have cooled some sectors and achieved their objectives. For aspiring home owners the outlook has changed slightly but its my belief that the rise will not deter the serious home buyers. The reality is that the two major centres, Auckland and Christchurch still have consistent momentum the demand continues for their own reasons. 
#### **CRAIGWEIL HOUSE UPDATE**

Learning is and should be fun. 10 good reasons your child should attend preschool By Rita Eastell, Country Bears ECC "But my child is so small!" Yes, they're still wee tykes, but a high-quality preschool is designed to set young scholars up for future academic, emotional, and social success. Preschool provides a foundation for learning both socially and academically that will help your child succeed in life.

- 1. Preschool is an opportunity for growth. For many children, preschool is their first experience in a structured setting with teachers and groups of children. It's an opportunity to learn to share, follow instructions and begin the foundation for learning valuable skills needed throughout their lives.
- 2. Preschool prepares children for school. As primary school system becomes more academic, many parents look to preschool to launch their child on the path to success in school. At the

same time, parents may worry that the current trend to focus on pre-math and pre-literacy skills in preschool cuts into important play time and pushes a child to grow up too fast. It's a confusing issue, especially with friends and family offering different opinions and advice. Fortunately, in selecting a preschool, parents aren't forced to choose between protecting a child's play time and making sure they are ready for school. A high-quality early childhood education program will offer children both.

3. Preschool promotes social and emotional development. In order to learn, a young child needs to feel cared for and secure with a teacher or caregiver. Young children are able to spend time away from parents and build trusting relationships with adults outside the family. High-quality preschool programs nurture warm relationships among children, teachers and parents. Teachers build a close personal connection with each child in their care.

4. The preschool environment is structured, although it may not appear that way. A well designed structured environment helps young children learn to make friends and play well with others. This doesn't mean there are lots of rules or that adults constantly direct children's activities. On the contrary, the structure of a high-quality

preschool classroom is largely invisible to children. Classroom space is organized to encourage social interaction, and minimize congestion and conflicts.

- 5. Children get to make choices. Children have several choices of activities; a child who is wandering aimlessly is encouraged to choose one that interests them. Teachers are alert to a child who can't figure out how to enter other children's play and may offer suggestions on ways to join the group.
- 6. Children learn to take care of themselves and others. Children's sense of competence and self-worth grow as they learn to take care of themselves and help others.
- 7. Preschool promotes language and cognitive skills. Preschool-age children's language skills are nurtured in a "language-rich" environment. Between the ages of 3 and 5, a child's vocabulary grows from 900 to 2,500 words, and their sentences become longer and more complex. In a conversational manner, and without dominating the discussion, teachers help children stretch their language skills by asking thought-provoking questions and introducing new vocabulary during science, art, meal time, and other activities. Children have many opportunities to sing, talk about favorite read-aloud books, and act out stories.
- 8. Preschool teachers nurture a child's curiosity Teachers observe, ask questions and listen to children's ideas during these activities "correct" answers are not the goal. To nurture their curiosity and motivation to learn, teachers use children's interests and ideas to create activities. Even a simple, chance event such as a child's discovery of a snail in an outdoor play area.
- 9. Preschool activities boost pre-math and literacy skills. To sustain children's excitement and motivation for learning, high-quality preschool and child care programs introduce early literacy and math skills not as isolated exercises, but in the context of activities that are interesting and meaningful to children. 10. Preschool helps develop motor skills. Physical coordination improves, allowing the child to explore their environment and to challenge themselves-in new ways. Young children are in motion for a good part of the day. High-quality preschool programs provide several opportunities daily for children to run, climb, and play active games. Activities are offered to help children develop fine motor skills, such as threading beads or cutting with scissors. Children are challenged through a variety of activities to build their hand-eye coordination and balance. 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

#### **ENDURING POWER OF ATTORNEYS**

Rest homes almost always ask if you have an enduring power-of-attorney ("POA"). By this, they mean a POA for your health and also for property. Importantly, both POAs allow someone you trust (your attorney) to act for you if you lose your mental capacity. In summary: Property POA - your attorney may pay money and sell property on your behalf. Health POA - your attorney may consult with your doctors. Making a POA – a POA is not valid unless a lawyer witnesses your signature and signs a certificate to say they have explained it to you. 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#### **RESOLVING COMMERCIAL DISPUTES**

It is an inevitable part of the commercial business environment that disputes arise between individuals, companies and the like. I often find that by the time I am instructed to act on a commercial dispute, there has already been a substantial exchange of correspondence between the parties themselves, some of which can be reasonably "heated". As such, more often than not, both parties become so entrenched in their respective positions that they are adamant that they want to go to Court to prove their position correct. While of course some disputes are well placed for Court, there are a number of factors to consider in assessing whether a dispute should go to Court or whether it is better placed for an alternative dispute resolution path. Three factors that I think are particularly important are Time; Economics; and Enforcement. Time: Taking a matter through Court is seldom quick and there are often many legal procedures that need to be attended to before the matter can be heard before the Judge. Therefore, if a guick resolution of the matter is needed, Court may not be the best option. Economics: It is important to consider the amount in dispute. Small amounts can become uneconomic to pursue through Court (even if you are successful in your claim). Enforcement: Thought needs to be given as to whether you will be able to practically enforce the judgment against the other party if you are successful. For example, if you obtain a judgment that orders a party to pay you money, but that party does not have the financial means to pay, you may end up simply having a judgment without a practical result. There are of course many other factors to consider in assessing the best path for resolving a dispute, and it is therefore worthwhile talking with your lawyer early on so that options can be considered. 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#### STOCK UP FOR WINTER NOW

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#### FENCING - THE GOOD, BAD AND THE UGLY?

With some areas showing barren grazing conditions, and an increase in the number of New Zealand Fire Service call outs to stock in waterways, it is timely to highlight the need for effective fencing. If you get this wrong you may have stock in the drain or on the road, this often proves fatal for the animal and uncomfortable for all others involved. As the stock holder you are liable for all stock on your land. We suggest you grade your present fencing. Nothing beats a well-built conventional fence - 8 wires, 4 battens, posts 4 m apart. That design was effective with two barbs to hold the battens in place were commonly used, but that method isn't used much anymore. Cattle and horses are destroyers, and they will destroy a fence too, whether it is 8 or 9 wire, unless the fence is protected by barb or electricity. Many of the fences I see have no barbs, and the battens have been pushed along to the posts. They are still keeping cattle and horses out at this point, but the wires become separated and loose and allow sheep through. Batten displacement on an un-barbed fence. Most sheep and goats tend to burrow rather than jump, and it is the loose wires they find while stretching underneath that will generally let them through. Keeping wires tight and running a barbed wire along the bottom of the fence are the best ways to discourage this behaviour. My preference for a fence now is 9 wires with 3 m post spacings without battens. As long as the wires are tight, the sheep won't get through, and cattle don't like sticking their heads through either. I have also seen 5 wire fences at thigh height (700 mm) that sheep have never broached, with a higher electric wire for cattle. The absence of battens makes repair jobs easier after branch or tree-fall and the wires are also easier to keep tight. It's a good idea to think about where you put your tensioners when you build the fence, as handy access makes the job of tightening wires quick and easy. Kumeu Fencer.
