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# FUNDING FOR STRUCTURE PLAN

The Association has been concerned for some time over the problems offunding and the lack of a 'Structure Plan' for the Kumeu-Huapai area. The confirmation by the Board that a 'Structure Plan' is at least 2 years away before it is started is unacceptable. That timetable, if adhered to, isgoing to create problems in Huapai-Kumeu area as it precludes normal planning considedration with what is occurring at present with S.H.A. areas. The Association believes, for the reasons set out below, that the 'StructurePlan' needs to urgently be advanced so that some of the key elements are identified before development proposals are approved. The following are issues to be addressed in а 'Structure Plan'. 1.Need for a definitive Structure Plan to cover projected growth areas in Kumeu-Huapai area. 2. Identification in the Structure Plan of the different density needs for housing within the Proposed Urban Boundary identified under the Unitary Plan proposed by the Auckland Council. 3. Identify the timeframe of growth areas within the RUB zone to coincide with the approved and indentified infrastructure to match growth. 4. Estimation of population for the District as a result of approved densities and a determine need for associated infrastructure for schools, reserves, sewerage and water reticulation. 5. Identify the main and secondary roading structure to serve the residential growth in the District. 6.Resolve the needs of through traffic created by the State Highway bisecting the Township of Kumeu & Huapai. Identify the traffic solutions, that not only provides for this traffic, but also enables the growth of Townships to serve the expanded District. 7. The need for a solution to the Rail & Bus Transport needs for the District as both are currently substandard or non-existent. 8. The recognition of the changing nature of Huapai-Kumeu from a farming/ orcharding rural town centre serviced by rail, to a rural town centre for lifestyle blocks and urbanisation serviced by a new motorway system from central Auckland, 9. The need for transformation of the rural town centre to a distinctive and new rural based shopping complex that requires a future building and streetscape layout concept. 10. The Structure Plan must recognise the commercial/industrial potential for growth and the ability of roading and other transport options to service and enhance those areas. 11. The Structure Plan must take into account stormwater flow paths and potential flooding areas. 12. Town Centre image, streetscape and

gateway recognition needs to be identified within the plan. 13. The proposed new 'Future Urban' areas don't have any basis for inclusion at present into full urban areas. The Unitary Plan process is being used to convert 'Future urban' areas into high density terrace or medium density housing without local consultation by Government approval (SHA Areas). 14. The 'Special Housing areas' (SHA) have been approved by the Government to fast track planning consents with little or no input from the Council or the community. The isolation of design and processing without a structure plan in place has resulted in wider infrastructure and design issues not being considered by the community, and is being left to outside agencies and designers to solve. 15. The collective impact as a result of all of the above will be that there is no overall structure plan in place in time for the formal Unitary Plan hearing in 2015.

Electric blankets

•If your electric blanket or cord is showing any signs of wear, have it checked by a competent service person or have it replaced. Don't take the risk.

•Always make sure that your electric blanket is switched off before getting into bed.

•Never use pins or sharp objects to secure the electric blanket to the bed and never tuck it in under the bed.

•If the blanket becomes soiled, sponge it lightly and allow to dry naturally on a flat surface. Do not dryclean or use a washing machine or spin dryer.

•When putting your electric blanket away for summer, don't fold it – roll it.

Heaters

•Remember the heater-metre rule – always keep furniture, curtains, clothes and children at least one metre away from heaters and fireplaces.

•Don't store objects on top of your heating appliance.

•Never cover heating appliances.



# **BUILDING CONSENTS**

Not all building work requires a building consent. The rule of thumb is that its ok to replace "like with like". However, replacing a major component of existing consented building work may not be exempt work. Exempt building work is defined in schedule 1 to the Building Act 2004. Examples include closing in an existing veranda if floor area does not exceed 5m2 (assuming the veranda itself was consented). Other exempt categories include pergolas, insulation, awnings, retaining walls below 1.5 m , water storage tanks and sheds of a certain size located away from the house. In each case, check your proposed building work with your lawyer or someone helpful at the Council. This will mean your building work cannot later be cause for objection by any incoming purchaser or the Council as the case may be.Luke Kemp LLB, BCOM, DIP. HORT. ### HOW TO FIX SPLIT ENDS

There's no hair enemy as fierce and unyielding as the much-dreaded split end. Whether you're young or old, have chemically treated strands or a completely natural hue, you're always at risk of experiencing the phenomenon. "Split ends occur when the protective

The longer you wait to trim, the greater chance you have of split ends worsening and traveling up the shaft. It may sound counter-intuitive, but this is why it's actually best to get frequent trims if you're trying to grow longer, healthier hair. 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# A LITTI F BIT OF KUMFU HISTORY

The kumeu – riverhead railway 1875 – 1881 "Old Railway Road really was a Railway!"

The Kumeu-Riverhead section was a short-lived railway line in the north-west of Auckland. It was built as part of the Kaipara-Riverhead Railway, which was isolated from the national railway network until 1881, just before closure of this section. Construction - The Kaipara-Riverhead Railway was built to link the eastern Waitemata Harbour at Riverhead with the western Kaipara Harbour at Helensville South, to provide more convenient access between the northern districts and Auckland and to improve export prospects for the timber industry in the Kaipara area. The first sod was turned on 31 August 1871 by the Auckland Provincial Council, but at the start of 1872 the national government took over the job. The railway was only 25 km long, and specific delays with acquiring rails and the general difficulties associated with the relative isolation of the time meant that construction dragged on for a few years. On 29 October 1875, it finally opened. Brief operation and closure - The section had no intermediate stations, and operated for slightly less than six years. Construction of the North Auckland Line was proceeding steadily, and on 13 July 1881 it reached Kumeu from Auckland. The Kumeu-Riverhead section became the Riverhead branch, but it did not last even a week. Between Kumeu and Auckland the North Auckland Line was far superior to shipping, so the Riverhead branch closed on 18 July 1881. The line today - Despite the line being closed for well over a century, some faint remnants still exist. The embankment on which it left Kumeu diverges from the North Auckland Line near the Kumeu River Number 1 Bridge. Old Railway Road is on the formation of the line, and at the T-intersection with State Highway 16 the road ends and the formation continues straight ahead. At Riverhead no substantial relics remain.

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# FENCE 'VS' BOUNDARY

This month we review a recent Real Estate Agents Disciplinary Tribunal decision about real estate agents' obligations in respect of identifying boundaries on a property. The name of the case is Fitzgerald & Anor v Real Estate Agents Authority & Anor [2014] NZREADT 43, and the facts are relatively simple. In 2010, the purchasers purchased a cross-leased rear property that had a fully fenced back yard. As it turned out, the fence was in the wrong position and did not represent the correct boundary for the property (unfortunately for the purchasers, the boundary was several metres nearer the house than the fence was). It was accepted that the purchasers did not ask about the fence or boundary, and that the agent did not make any representations about the boundary. The purchasers, however, claimed that the agent should have been aware of where the real boundary was and should have made them aware that the fence line was not on the boundary. At paragraph 21, the Tribunal noted that, while an agent must make every effort to know the product that they are selling, an agent is not required to anticipate problems where a problem might not exist. In the Tribunal's view, "[i]t would be unduly burdensome if in every case where there is no apparent cause for concern an agent was required to verify the boundary or be liable for failure to do so." Accordingly, the Tribunal ruled that the agent in this case was not liable for unsatisfactory conduct. Importantly however, the Tribunal emphasised in the same paragraph that "... there is an obligation on an agent to be proactive where they are asked or might reasonably be expected to be asked about a boundary, for example where there is no clearly marked fence, where the boundaries appear to be in bush land or where a title is 'limited as to parcels." So, had the agent been asked in this case whether the fence constituted the boundary, the agent would then have been obliged to make enquiries about that and either confirm where the boundaries were or advise the purchasers to obtain a surveyor's advice. While the Tribunal's decision is short, it is well worth a read as it provides further clarity for both agents and potential purchasers around the issue of identifying boundary lines on a property. 

Part of the challenge is matching the beer to the dish. When we worked through the beer matching we found that something extraordinary happened with Dopplebock and the buffalo, that the other beers couldn't achieve. We had our herb supplier in Woodhill grow

edible native daisy (in the dim sum and as garnish), Karu Parera potatoes (as the crisps) and Gorse flowers (infused in the parsnip milk and as garnish) from our Māori foods forager Mark. Then we asked Garry, our creative onsite builder to produce a corrugated iron plate to fit with the rural rustic theme in the spirit of the competition and have decorated The Riverhead to compliment the theme.

# WINTER HAS ARRIVED!

For homes on smaller land parcels, down to section size, there are "Clean Air" implications which restrict the amount of allowable emissions released into the atmosphere. Because of this and because of the cooling effect a larger capacity wetback unit is recommended for most wood burners. However, a 3-kw coil will generally produce excess hot water after prolonged and continual burning.

This excess hot water can be utilized to heat wall radiators. Again, the secret to an efficient clean-burning wood fire is to use good dry wood, free of any moisture. 4 Kumara cut into cubes
4 Potatoes cut into cubes
1 onion diced
1 Can coconut cream

2 Chicken Oxo cubes or chicken stock
Salt and pepper to season

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# **MEMORANDUM OF WISHES**

Do you have a Memorandum of Wishes for your family trust? A Memorandum of Wishes is a document in which the settlor (person who creates the trust) sets out for the trustees of a trust how they want the trust managed particularly after death. This document helps ensure that your trustees know which of the beneficiaries you want to receive trust assets and when they are to receive them. Whilst a Will deals with property in your personal name, a Memorandum of Wishes deals with property that is owned by the trustees of your trust.

It is important however to align both your Will and your Memorandum of Wishes so that there is no conflict.

If you do not have a Memorandum of Wishes, the trustees left after you pass away have no clear guidance on how you want the trust managed. While not legally binding, a Memorandum of Wishes is unlikely to be ignored by prudent trustees.

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# **POWER OUTAGES AND SURGES**

We have been out and about this month assisting clients with the aftermath of the storms and resulting power outages and surges. These surges resulted in at least one customer needing to replace most of their domestic appliances, the TV and DVD player. In most instances, this can easily be prevented by installing surge protection devices but to be effective, these really need to be installed in the distribution board, cheaper plug-in ones are not as effective.

With the early power outage being so long in Waimauku and Muriwai we have been talking to customers about generators and inverters. These can be set up to ensure that at a basic level you have hot running water despite the lack of power. This is especially important in a house with young children. An inverter runs clean quiet, as required, power from a battery bank. It requires enough battery capacity to provide the power required over a given time period. Alternatively, a generator is less quiet, requires fuel and starting. It runs consistently regardless of whether it is actually being used.
