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# SIXTY FIVE YEARS OF SAVING LIVES

Situated on a fifty kilometer stretch of Auckland's rugged west coast, Muriwai is renowned for it's stunning scenery, abundant wildlife and its sparkling black sand. The Muriwai Volunteer Lifeguard Service found its origins in 1948 after a series of near tragedies encouraged the local community to form a lifesaving club. For over sixty five years Muriwai lifeguards have patrolled this isolated paradise, preventing injury and loss of life on one of Auckland's most popular beaches. Lifesaving is the club's foremost concern and Muriwai is patrolled each weekend by volunteer guards throughout the summer months from Labour weekend until Easter. From December, paid lifeguards watch over the beach during the weekdays, ensuring beach users are safe. Surf sports keep members fit and Muriwai has a strong team of athletes competing in all disciplines of surf life saving. Whether it be surf sports, boat rowing or IRB racing, Muriwai athletes are highly successful regionally, nationally and internationally. The Junior Surf program or 'Nippers' is where it all begins for many Muriwai Lifeguards with many of the

members involved since childhood. Nippers take to the beach each Sunday morning to develop their surf skills as they work towards becoming lifeguards. A proud part of the Muriwai and greater Rodney community and holding an immense gratitude for each of the sponsors and supporters, without whom the job would be impossible. Muriwai strives to live the motto, that of 'Great Since '48' in celebration of the founding members and their successes. Members also align to the mission with that of the governing body, Surf Life Saving New Zealand who endeavor to preserve life on New Zealand beaches. Along with the seventy five other lifesaving clubs in New Zealand, this club continues to be passionately In It For Life. Want to Join?

It's been a busy month of meetings for the Local Board as newbies get our heads around the 'machinery' of Council.At our latest business meeting Portfolio holders were confirmed. I am the lead portfolio holder for; Street Environment & Town Centres, Civil Defence & Emergency Management, Communications & Engagement, and the alternate for; Iwi, Arts & Culture, Built & Natural Environment, Parks, Transport & Infrastructure and Finance.

There are ongoing discussions about the proposed Triangle Special Housing Area proposed for Huapai. I share peoples concerns about whether sufficient infrastructure can be provided for the proposed 2000 homes in a timely manner. The local schools are at capacity, there are growing traffic problems in Kumeu, and then there are recreational and parks facilities. There are challenges but also opportunities and your Local Board will be ensuring that the community's voice is not lost in the rush to build new houses.

If you have issues you need help with I will be available for face to face meetings at the Huapai Service Centre on the 2nd & 3rd Thursday of the month from 4-6:30pm.



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


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# MIKE'S MESSAGE - MARKET CHANGE

On the 1st of October the Reserve Bank implemented its Loan to Value Ratio restrictions to slow the galloping Property market. So what has changed in the market? There has been an impact and a slowdown, without. Primarily those most hurt are the first time buyers. With a deposit now at least twice as much for a first home, as it was before October, these young Kiwis are somewhat disillusioned over their ownership plans. By them not buying in the lower price ranges it has a domino effect on the existing home buyers wishing to buy in the \$5-700,000 bracket and in turn this has a negative effect on the \$1M sales and so on. I believe the official result for October is a 4% reduction in number of real estate sales across the nation but with little effect on values with increases recorded in Auckland and Christchurch and surrounding areas. Some provinces are still lagging here though. Auction rates around the country have only seen marginal reduction in more attendance numbers than results. So what would I be doing if I was selling a home now? I'd be realistic on price, present it well and market it well. There's a slightly lesser demand in some areas but with these three ingredients you'll be ahead of the others in your range. Shortage of supply continues to fuel pricing in both Auckland and Christchurch. Vendors may need to increase their marketing to assist in the profiling to compete with others in attracting qualified purchaser's. Auction rates around the country have only seen marginal reduction in more attendance numbers than results. # **KUMEU-HUAPAI RATEPAYERS**

We have all recovered from the Minister's Nick Smith's shock announcement of the special housing area in Huapai. It is time for all of us to think about the potential impact this form of housing will have on the District and whether we have the infrastructure to match.

When this development is contemplated, along with the 30 year residential growth around Kumeu & Huapai in the proposed Unitary Plan by the Auckland Council, it is easy to see that the proposed growth will have a significant impact on infrastructure for the area. The provision of infrastructure in my view has to match this projected growth,

otherwise the area will not cope.

Additional traffic, schools both Primary & Secondary, areas for passive and active recreation need to be provided. These major infrastructure issues unfortunately are not all the responsibility of the Auckland Council, nor have they been provided by the former Rodney District Council.

The Education Board and New Zealand Transport Authority have control over the Education sector and State Highway Roading respectively. What is clearly needed is a local based community input on what infrastructure issues we have and need for the future. This would form the basis of a submission into the Unitary Plan and to the Local Board for action.

The Association is to make a submission to the Rodney Board for funds for infrastructure concept plans. The funds for this work we intend to present to the Board in December. The lack of infrastructure issues have been clear to the community for some years. The lack of progress on aspects like the southern bypass road, new recreation reserves and room for Primary School growth, and a Secondary School are

but a few issues. The real concern is that the Council will focus on the subdivision growth without addressing the infrastructure necessary to provide for the efficient growth and operation of the District. 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

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

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# THE WEB UNSPUN - SEMANTIC SEARCH

In the traditional SEO world that we have been learning about over the last few months, there are two main areas of focus that we can work on to achieve a reasonable result in the search engine (SERP). SEO is pretty much about keywords and links. Keywords are necessary to get the website to show on the search engine results page and links are needed to help that website rise in the search rankings. This is a bit of a simplified view on the Google search engine algorithm as there are over 200 factors that are involved in the ranking process. The "new" SEO focuses as much on the quality of the business offerings, the online visitor experience once they get to the company website, and the perceived reputation and authority of the business itself as much as it focuses on the traditionally technical aspects of search engine optimisation. It has therefore been divided in to two different types of SEO, technical and non-technical SEO. Technical SEO addresses specific onsite issues that prevent a website from being indexed by search engines. This could be the website structure, the underlying coding, excessive use of javascript, slow server responses etc. Non-technical SEO looks at the company's or brand's marketing strategy, the evolving nature of marketplace communication, content creation, social media outreach, and the way a company connects with its customers in the online environment. 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# CITIZENS ADVICE BUREAU CHRISTMAS WISH

Wishing all our clients Seasons Greetings with a reminder that Facebook can be a great way to keep up with what your friends and acquaintances at this time of the year and while you're there, you could get some shopping done too!!. "If you buy goods or services from someone via Facebook, then what your consumer rights are pretty much boils down to whether the seller is considered a professional trader or not." says Joy Florence of Citizens Advice Bureau Helensville. "You're covered by the Consumer Guarantees Act and the Fair Trading Act for goods or services sold by a trader, unless you bid for it in an auction. If the seller is not a trader then it's classed as a private sale, which means you don't have much protection.

In general, if someone is selling a lot of items online, then they are a trader. If you're not sure about a particular Facebook seller, check out their Facebook page. If they seem to sell a lot of similar kinds of items, and have sold a lot of items in the past, then they are probably a trader rather than an individual just having a household clear-out. Joy says there are things you can do to minimise your risk when considering buying from a private seller, for example:-

- if at all possible try to inspect the item before you hand over your money;
- · ask the seller a lot of questions about the item so you know what to expect;
- look for feedback from past customers;
- for the expensive items (like a car) it would pay to check the Personal Property Securities Register in case it has been used as security for someone's debt.
- also, pay by credit card or, if it's going to a New Zealand account, by Internet banking rather than by cash or telegraphic transfer so your payment can be tracked.
- lastly, it makes good sense to get the full name and address of the seller in case the trade goes pear-shaped and you need to track them down.

If you have a problem with something you've bought it's always best to talk to the seller first. But if you haven't been able to sort it out by talking to them, come and see us at 27 Commercial Road, Helensville.

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# LIOUIDATION "INSOLVENT TRANSACTION"

When a company goes into liquidation, a liquidator has the power, in certain circumstances, to require a creditor who has received a payment from the company to pay that money back. These are known as "insolvent transactions", and while it is designed to help ensure that unsecured creditors share equally in a liquidation, for the creditor who is being asked to pay money back, it can be a frustrating situation. A creditor can, however, defend a liquidator's attempt to claw back a payment by relying on a statutory defence under s296 of the Companies Act 1993. It is this defence that the Court of Appeal was recently called upon to consider in the case Madsen-Ries v Rapid Construction Limited [2013] NZCA 489. Both the High Court and the Court of Appeal provided a very useful summary of the three elements that need to be established in order to successfully raise the s296 defence. In particular, the creditor must prove that, when they received the payment, they (1) received it in good faith, and (2) did not have reasonable grounds for suspecting insolvency, and (3) gave value or altered its position in a belief that the payment was valid and would not be set aside. Since trading with companies is an inevitable part of business, it pays to be aware of, and understand, insolvent transactions, and the power a liquidator has to claw back certain payments. While the creditor can argue the s296 defence, there are important time limits that apply, and more often than not, the issues are strongly contested on both sides. Accordingly, it is prudent for a creditor to seek advice early on. For more information, contact Chad Danswan on (09) 412 7348 or chad@danswan.co.nz.


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### WATER THIEVES ARE ACTIVE IN THE AREA

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# COUNTRY BEARS CHILDHOOD NATURE WALKS

New Discovery Session 3-5 year old – free 8-12 or 12.30 - 4.30pm (5 x a week) As part of our new programme we are introducing "discovery sessions' for 3-5 year olds. These sessions have limited numbers and will operate from 8-12pm and 12.30 -4.30pm, with children attending 5 mornings/ afternoon a week. The programme will be made up of both discovery time and more formal group focus time as we believe that children of this age are filled with curiosity and an eagerness to learn. (special conditions apply.)

We remain the providers of original and inspirational early childhood experiences. We continue to be inspired by meeting amazing people that enjoy seeing children joyful in the wonders of discovery. As parents, whanau and teachers we can inspire children to take the time to see, listen, smell and feel the world around them. Through our support we hope to install a love and appreciation of the wonderful world we live in. From day one, Country Bears has always strived to reinforce our core value of respect in the everyday things we do and in everything around us, from all living things to the very air we breathe. It is our obligation as adults to ensure that all the wonderful things that we experienced when growing up, are preserved and provided for our children to enjoy. Just a snippet for your information from Peggy Ashbrook, the author of Science Is Simple: Over 250 Activities for Pre-schoolers, she teaches preschool science in Alexandria, Virginia, and leads workshops for early childhood teachers throughout USA..

Time out and turning any walk into a nature walk

Keys ideas taken from Peggy Ashbrook book 'Science is Simple'.

Every walk is an opportunity for children to learn about the natural world. Walking around the block with my child when he was 2 years old could take an hour because there was always something new to explore.

As you explore your neighbourhood:

- Be open to the wonder of noticing small details and new growth.
- Leave electronic toys at home so that children can focus on the world around them.
- Bring paper and crayons so children can draw what they see.
- Walk at different times of the day or night to increase your chances of seeing something new.
- Ask, "What's different about what you see today?" each time you and your child walk outside.
- Model using all five senses. You might say, "I'm seeing the big clouds,"



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"I'm touching the wet grass," "I'm hearing the jets of an airplane," or "I'm smelling the fallen pine tree needles." It's not safe to taste many things outdoors, but you can "taste" the air.

- Carry along an inexpensive magnifying glass so children can get up close and personal with nature.
- Make dressing for the weather part of the learning experience by singing songs about the weather as you and your child put on sunscreen, hats, or several layers of clothing. Try "You Are My Sunshine," "It Ain't Gonna Rain," or "The Mitten Song". Let your child work to figure out how to zip a zipper or put on boots just long enough so they can learn these tasks and not so long that they become frustrated.

Observe the weather: - On the walk, use your magnifying glass to look closely at drops of rain hanging from a leaf or to examine the structure of snow. If it has recently rained, take a medicine dropper so your child can suck up rain from puddles and squirt it back out again. Watch where the water flows and ask, "I wonder where it will go from here?" If it is sunny, make shadows with your body or jump over the shadow of a family member. Use sidewalk chalk to draw the shapes of the clouds you see.

Animals: - Use your magnifying glass to look closely at small wildlife such as non-poisonous spiders, roly-polies, worms, and any non-stinging insect that will hold still long enough. Ask your child to show you how the worm or ant moves, and join in as he wiggles or crawls. Count the number of larger animals you see on your walk. Is the neighbour's cat in the window again? Look for birds in bushes and on electric lines. Are there cows in the field, or dogs going for a walk around the block? Talk with your child about what these animals are doing.

Plants: - Look closely at the different shapes, sizes, and structures of leaves and flowers. Collect leaf shapes and then make rubbings of different types of leaves. To do this, put a piece of paper over a leaf resting on a hard surface, then rub or wipe the paper with a crayon held sideways to reveal the leaf's veins and edges. Collect fallen leaves and seeds by pressing them into the sticky side of a loop of tape. If a plant has a bud on it, ask your child to guess how many days it will take to open. Rocks: - Use your magnifying glass to see the tiny shapes of crystals or pieces of sediment that make up the rocks in your neighbourhood. Compare sizes and colours.

The celebration of 20 years as preschool educators and carers within our community, has seen the present Country Bears children experience an educational programme with a difference.
