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HOT ROD HEAVEN

Ken and Desma Galvin love cars. It's what brought the two Kumeu Classic Car and Hot Rod Festival organisers together 40 years ago.Desma's car was broken into in Auckland and wiring pulled out. "I was walking down the road crying and Ken and his brother were leaning over their fence. I thought 'here's a guy who can fix my car," Desma recalls.

Both were interested in cars early on. Ken grew up in a family of car enthusiasts and was so keen he fudged his age to get his driver's licence at 14.

"I've always been into cars," he says. "I love old machinery and talking to the people involved."

The self-confessed "tinkerer" will tackle anything with an engine.

They have seven vehicles at their Kumeu home, including a 1948 Ford truck Ken's working on for their son. Their children and grandchildren have the car bug too. Ken's doing up a kid's drift kart for grandson Indiana Galvin-Pates, aged 1, already showing a fascination for machinery. Some vehicles are used regularly, like the 1938 Chevrolet coupe Ken got Desma on Mother's Day in 1987. Others need work, such as the Pontiac yellow taxi used in Sir Peter Jackson's King Kong movie.

"It's a way of life," Ken says. He's a life member of the New Zealand Hot Rod Association and Wheels Incorporated, as well as being a National Street Rod Association member. Ken's passion, particularly through custom painting and pin-striping cars, led to him own a corporate branding company. He did many of the 1990 Auckland Commonwealth Games signs.

The couple have been involved in the Kumeu hot rod show from the outset and are already preparing for its 25th anniversary in 2019. Meanwhile, they're hard at work on the 23rd festival on January 21 and 22 at the Kumeu Showgrounds, with more than 40,000 people expected.

At least 5500 classic cars and hot rods feature outdoors. Indoor

exhibits include a construction shed with cars in various rebuild stages, one for custom built and painted cars where the People's Choice award winner is usually found, and a model car display. Last year's People's Choice, a Mad Max style "Volksrod salvage wagon", is on festival posters.

A Miss Kumeu contest has been introduced for girls 10 and under. Other categories include up to 21-year-olds and a Mrs Kumeu, contestants dressing 1950s style for prizes. The same theme is carried through the "Retro-o-rama" market area.

A Jimi Hendrix Tribute Show features on the Saturday and a Fleetwood Mac Tribute Show is on Sunday, 11am-5pm.

American style dragsters or "funny cars" fire-up at Gasoline Alley. Visitors can explore more than 70 trade stalls, check the "swap meet", sample 26 food stalls, or test children's rides and a firefighters' Wendy House. Collections are taken for surf life-saving.

Show entry is \$15 adult and under-12 free on Saturday 7am-6pm and Sunday 8am-5pm. Parking's free. Motorcycles, dogs, and showground "cruising" are banned.

BERRYLICIOUS

Strawberry season is here, and many love the delicious small, red fruit for Christmas feasting. But this summer's not been a good one for the berries, no thanks to a prolonged wet start. So you'd better check or order early to ensure you have some





for Christmas Day.

The strawberry season is about three to four weeks behind because of the weather, Huapai based Best Berries general manager Phelan Pirrie says. He says the weather is similar to last season so the fruit could be hard to get for Christmas.

Best Berries supplies Foodstuffs' North Island stores, growers providing mainly strawberry varieties like Camarosa – a big, flavoursome fruit, Ventana – an early fruiter with eye appeal, and Camino Real – a good export crop.

Many of these are derived from Californian varieties which usually prefer cool night and warm days, don't like the wet and tend to produce most fruit around late November to early December, Phelan says. "January and February can be too hot for the plants."

Phelan says while many are changing from the traditional Christmas dinner, there's still plenty of demand for strawberries at this time.

North West Auckland is one of the biggest strawberry growing areas in the country, but Phelan sees changes coming. One is that Auckland land prices are so high some strawberry farms are going into housing, like one near the NorthWest shopping centre, with growers either moving further out or discontinuing.

Then there's the likelihood of more industrialisation, including automation and growing more under cover.

Tunnel houses are common in parts of the world like the United Kingdom, but Phelan says growers there can get subsidies, whereas here the capital outlay is high. He believes though that many strawberries here could end up being grown in greenhouses like tomatoes and capsicums. Advantages include supply reliability. That could mean fewer family strawberry businesses and larger companies involved, Phelan says. Under cover growing could also reduce reverse sensitivity issues, particularly with more residents moving into traditional growing

Huapai – which means good fruit – is one such area already seeing increasing development and productive land loss. Local grower Phil Greig, pictured, intends carrying on, despite the pressures and a poor start to this season. He's been growing strawberries for 26 years, beginning at Whenuapai and then based at Phil Greig Strawberry Gardens on State Highway 16's city-side entry to Kumeu for 23 of those years. He employs up to about 450 people from September to the end of January.

"It's been a struggle this year," Phil says. Exports are going well though, with big demand from Thailand, Hong Kong, Singapore, the United Arab Emirates and the USA.

Phil supplies markets throughout New Zealand too, and his highway shop front is renowned, with visitors also stopping for real fruit ice-cream, berry jam, their family farmed UMF manuka honey, and coffee. Highway congestion is noticeable, but the car park is busy throughout summer, including pick-your-own after Christmas. Phil's seen the pressure on local growers from



development, increased costs and compliance. He says it's possible the strawberry industry will become more automated and be done largely under cover by bigger companies in the future. So perhaps it won't be "strawberry fields forever".

WAIMAUKU WINERY TRADITIONS CONTINUE

Friends of the former Matua Valley winery's original owners are carrying on the Waimauku estate's traditions.

It will continue as a winery and vineyard, host functions and weddings, provide a family zone with interactive events for children, run musical events and provide a beautiful setting for family picnics. A wine tasting afternoon and a chance to do some Christmas shopping at the Waikoukou Valley Rd venue on Saturday December 10, 1pm-4pm, gives visitors a taste of what's to come.

That includes the release of eight wines under The Hunting

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Lodge brand from winemaker Pete Turner, pictured, and his team. They include Marlborough pinot noirs, an albarino and a pinot gris, plus a Gisborne marsanne/viognier blend and a Hawke's Bay syrah.

The historic hunting lodge established by the Kerr-Taylor family will be open and serve as a temporary cellar door until reconstruction of the former Matua winery cellar door is completed, later resuming as a restaurant. All the revitalisation and new work should be ready by mid-January. The 31.68 hectare property was bought by former dairy products exporter Sutton Group Holdings earlier this year from Treasury Wine Estates. And the new owners, who formed Brix and Co, a contract wine-making and bottling operation, will market the estate and its wines under The Hunting Lodge brand.

They have big plans. "We want a place where families and visitors can come for picnics and enjoy the setting," spokeswoman Rachelle Sutton says. The Suttons are long-time friends of the Spence and Margan families and have great memories of the estate.

The vineyard was founded by Bill and Ross Spence who planted some of New Zealand's first sauvignon blanc vines.

The Hunting Lodge wines will continue that innovative trend, producing new varieties and blends, and serving them not just in the standard bottles but in 1.5 litre magnums and 3 litre jeroboams as well for those special occasions.

An on-line VIP wine club is also starting on December 10, and Pete expects the first crop of Waimauku chardonnay will be available this season from vines planted about six years ago. There's much more in the pipeline too. Pizza and pinot events will start again in February, Rachelle says. And perhaps musical events, like the UB40 visit earlier this year, can be reintroduced. The new owners are also working with the North West Country promotion group to once again establish the estate as an important visitor drawcard.

BANG FOR YOUR BUCK

A big bang for your buck is what David York delivers.

The Taupaki resident has been involved with fireworks most of his life, after his father Gerald set up Universal Pyrotechnics Ltd, part of the York Group of Companies, in 1948. The fireworks were made in Henderson, but since 1989 David's company has been importing them from China under a joint venture, with several hundred tonnes arriving annually.


"We supply many retailers and display operators around New Zealand, particularly for Guy Fawkes and New Year," David says. Many of the company's fireworks are destined for the retail market through its Bad Boy Fireworks brand (including Shogun and Vulcan), and a number of display fireworks are used for public and private events. These include charity occasions, like the Monster Fireworks October display at the Kumeu Showgrounds, a major fundraiser for Taupaki School for 31 years. David donates the fireworks' cost, valued at about \$40,000. He and son James, who manages the fireworks business, also assist with the display's set up and computerised firing.

They have been involved in displays world-wide, winning an international event in Oman. "About six or seven countries are invited to put on displays running over a number of days, and some enormous prizes are put up," David says. "It gives us an opportunity, for James especially, to work on some very big shows." These are set to music and may include light shows and other entertainment. One in Hanover draws about 100,000 people each night. "What we do in New Zealand is minor by comparison," David says "We're talking millions of dollars and months of planning and set up." He'd like to see something similar here, perhaps for a major event or anniversary.

David sees public displays becoming more popular but doubts calls to ban retail fireworks will see them restricted to just public events. "Some New Zealanders have been trying to ban fireworks here since 1948, but the laws have made it a lot safer now," David says. Skyrockets and crackers were banned in the 1990s, so roman candles which fire balls of flame into the air are now among the most popular fireworks, David says. People who remember the Mighty Cannon, Jumping Jack and Double Happy are often nostalgic and seek something similar. "Many still want the best and loudest," David says.

Large ground cakes and shells fired into the air from mortar-like devices are now very popular, bursting into patterns way overhead. But for safety reasons these are limited to displays put on by professionals. All such displays are electronically or radio control operated. David says major fireworks shows are heavily regulated, involving permits, site inspections, and may include notifying agencies like Civil Aviation and emergency services all at considerable cost. Adding traffic management and security can mean displays like the Taupaki School fundraiser have to raise a huge amount to help cover costs while providing enough for the school.

SAFER COMMUNITIES

With all the new building developments happening in the Huapai, Riverhead and Waimauku areas, Police have seen an increased rate in thefts and burglaries happening at various building sites around these areas. There is a misconception from the general public that 111 is purely an emergency telephone number. This is not always the case, and Police urge members of the public to call 111 or *555 when seeing any suspicious persons, vehicles or other incidents in your neighbourhood.

It is better and more likely Police will speak to or apprehend suspects and offenders if it is reported on these numbers at the time, not waiting until the next day to report to the local Police Station. It is for the call dispatchers to decide the priority given to the incidents, so please do not feel you are wasting Police time calling 111 or *555 for what you think are trivial incidents.

Remember, registration numbers, colour, type and make of vehicles are important.

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

RELATIONSHIP PROPERTY AGREEMENTS

Relationship property is something which must be shared equally between the parties at the end of a relationship. However, there are three sorts of relationship property agreements. The first is often called a prenuptial agreement because it comes before the relationship is one which qualifies for the equal sharing provisions under the property relationships act 1976 ("PRA"). The 2nd is often made during our relationship and endeavours to contract out of the equal sharing provisions for various reasons. Reasons include protecting assets to ensure children from a prior relationship are protected. The 3rd sort is usually made at the end of a relationship and usually allows for any equal sharing of the relationship assets as at the end of the relationship. Frequently, it will involve a division of actual assets as between each party as an alternative to an outright sale of all of the assets.

In each case, a PRA agreement is not binding unless it has a lawyer's certificate. It could therefore allow your ex-partner to ask for further assets from you at a later date. 

FINDING AN INJURED ANIMAL

Imagine you're on the way back from the shops and you spot a cat lying on the side of the road. You pullover to check on it, but can't see it moving. You need to check if it's alive, but how do you do that on an animal?

If you're shocked that you're not sure what to do don't worry, you're not alone. Even though lots of us have pets many wouldn't know what to do! This



article will teach you the basics of helping an animal whether it your own or someone else's.

First thing you need to do is look out for any signs of movement as you're approaching the animal. If the animal moves at all it is

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alive and you need to get it to the vet.

If there is no obvious movement then focus on whether or not you can see the chest rising and falling, this will show if the animal is breathing. If you can't see the chest moving then try putting your hand in front of their face to see if you can feel their breath. If they are breathing then they are alive so get them to the yet


If they are not breathing it is time to check for a pulse to see if the heart is still beating. Just like us you can feel for an animal's pulse on their neck but they have a lot of extra skin and fur there so it could take a while. The easiest thing to do is to feel for the femoral pulse on the inside of the animal's back leg.

If the animal had a pulse then their heart is still beating but you need to get them breathing again so start rescue breathing. If there is no pulse the heart has stopped and you need to start compressions. Unfortunately rescue breathing and compression can't be explained in this article but attend a PET First Aid course and you will learn these essential skills as well as many others. SUMMER DOG CARE

With the weather heating up we can all look ahead to summer again.

I want to share with you some useful tips to make summer easier on your furry family member.





great to pop your dog in the car with you as you drive around to do jobs, but as the weather heats up your car becomes an oven for your pet. It's best to leave them at home where they have access to shade and water.

When you are popping out and leaving your pup at home to relax, leave out at least two water bowls in case he gets really thirsty or knocks one over. If they are inside leave a few windows open for airflow or leaving the air conditioning on low is also a great option to keep your dog comfortable.

When walking your dog try and get out early in the morning or later at night when the pavements are cooler. Not sure if the pavement is too hot for your dog? Place the back of your hand down on the concrete and hold it there for a count of 5 - if you can't them it's too hot and you will burn your dog's paws.

But what do you do if you need to walk them when it's hot? Take your dog to a dog park where it can walk on grass or to one of Auckland all year round dog-friendly beaches so they can get in the water (Kennedy Park or St Leonards beach) and remember to take a bottle of drinking water with you for them too.

HEALTHY SKIN & COAT FOR CATS AND DOGS

We're well into spring and that's usually associated with allergies for both humans and pets. Scratching and biting can quickly impact on the condition of your pet's skin and coat, but it's important to take into account the bigger picture, beyond just the allergy season.

The condition of your pet's skin and coat is a good indicator of their overall health. As the skin



provides protection, sensory data, regulates body temperature, prevents dehydration and produces vital nutrients, looking after it year round is essential for your pet's well-being. Your pet's skin should be soft, smooth and free of lumps, flakes or raw red spots. The coat should be shiny and smooth, without bald patches or excessive loss of hair.

The Vet Care Group has teamed up with Animates to bring you the Top Five Tips for skin and coat care.

Top 5 Tips from the Vet Care Group

- 1) Allergies: Allergies can be difficult to diagnose with symptoms varying greatly. If you have any concerns or notice your pet excessively scratching or licking, thinning hair, bald patches or red skin see your vet for advice.
- 2) Brushing: All pets benefit from regular grooming sessions

which should be carried out at least once a week. It's important that you use the correct tools for your pet's coat type. We recommend using a brush with widely spaced teeth for the outer layer, and a finer soft-bristle brush or comb to maintain their inner layer of fur and the fur around your pet's face. Using a slicker brush is a great way to finish grooming as it smooths down the top layer of the coat.

- 3) Bathing: How often your pet needs to be bathed depends on their lifestyle, age and coat type. The average dog only needs to be bathed every 4-6 weeks when they get dirty. Cats only require bathing when their coat is particularly greasy or dirty with grime or a sticky substance they can't remove themselves. It is important that you are not bathing your pet too regularly and are using a shampoo designed specifically for your pet.
- 4) Nutrition: A balanced diet with adequate quantities of protein will help strengthen your pet's fur as it's mainly made up of protein. Dull, fragile hair which shreds excessively can be an indication of ill health or that your pet isn't getting everything they need from their diet. The first ingredient on the food label should be a source of easily digestible protein.


Omega-3 fatty acids in flaxseed and fish oil may reduce itching and inflammation in skin and add shine to a pet's coat. Zinc and vitamin A can help pets that have dry scaly skin, however it's important to always get your vet's recommendation on supplements suitable for your pet as excessive amounts may cause harm if given for long periods of time.

5) Flea and parasite control: Keeping your pet's flea and parasite treatments up-to-date is vital to their health. The presence of parasites can lead to allergic reactions, infections and itchiness and discomfort for your pet, all of which are avoidable with regular treatment.





HOW DO YOU MOULD AND STRETCH A PAIR OF SHOES TO FIT YOUR FEET WHEN YOU ARE SHORT ON TIME?

This is Shoe Talk's guide on how to make your new shoes fit your foot shape when you have purchased something new that you need to wear soon after purchase. Please note this only works if the footwear actually fits your



foot correctly to start with - shoes will only ever give in width a few mm and not at all in length.

So follow the following tips:

- If the shoes pinch your heels you can soften the heels by gently rolling the back of the heel over with your thumbs to soften the edge.
- Put on a pair of socks; grab your new shoes and your hairdryer. Turn the hairdryer onto warm and gently direct the head towards the shoe, approx. 15cm away be careful though as you do not want to burn the leather, if it's suede put the heat even further away. Heat the leather up to where it feels malleable. Put the shoes on your feet and walk around them as they cool. The heat will soften the leather and allow it to mold to the shape of your foot. Repeat if required.
- Finally notice any points that feel like they will rub on the first wear and put a plaster on this will ensure you have a great night

WHY AM I SORE AFTER MASSAGE?





NEW BEGINNINGS AT COUNCIL & BOARD

The October Local Body elections made substantial changes for Rodney both at the Board & Council level.

The existing Board now has only 3 out of 9 of the previous Board members returned with Brenda Steele, Phelan Pirrie & Beth Holbrooke for a future 3 years.

The biggest change has been with our Councillor Greg Sayers, a previous member of the Rodney Board for 2 terms, being elected with a large majority over the previous incumbent Penny Webster. The Board Chairperson is now from the North with Beth Holbrooke taking over from Brenda Steele. The Board and Local Councillor will give a fresh look to the District which is needed.

The opportunity exists to put a case in front of the Auckland Council for a transport solution and structure planning for Kumeu-Huapai.

The traffic solution is still in a draft stage with options not final-

ised for release to the public at this stage. The bizarre situation is now land zoning have been confirmed by the Auckland Council increasing the values of properties around Kumeu-Huapai in the 'Future Urban' areas, but the Council have not firmed up on the infrastructure details. Clearly with zoning increasing values, it is going to cost the Council and the ratepayers more for purchase of roading, land, infrastructure & school sites etc.

The 'Future Urban' zoning has been confirmed, also encouraging land owners to provide for 'ad hoc' zone changes because the Council has not progressed 'Structure Planning' for our District.

Whenuapai's 'Structure Plan' on the other hand was approved mid November 2016. The concept was paid for by the developers and hence the advancement of their area for zoning changes. The Whenuapai area will be with Rule & regulations being advertised in April 2017.

Kumeu-Huapai has been promised a 'Structure Plan' in 2018 which I believe is far too late for the District. The development pressures are on us and with the Auckland Council confirming on 15th November 'live zoning' for the 'Countryside Living' zone around Taupaki, Waitakere & Pomona Road areas.

Development can now occur in these areas as there are no appeals against the zoning. The lack of a 'Structure Plan' for Kumeu-Huapai leaves the infrastructure options and solutions unresolved. The Association will be making an application early 2017 for funding to be set aside for the 'Structure Plan' process. Delaying this work is not an option.

COMPLAINING IS IMPORTANT

I'm never sure if it's because we live in a largely rural area and are



used to being self-sufficient, or whether we don't like to complain that people put up with some pretty poor service levels from council in our area.

Roads are the best example. I'll frequently see people taking the time to complain on Facebook about a persistent pot hole or poorly done maintenance, but that doesn't change anything as the people they need to be complaining too aren't watching a local Facebook group.

Perhaps we all need to look at this differently. We need to see ourselves as customers who are paying for a service that we aren't getting. If your telephone stops working you phone your teleco to get it sorted, it's the same with roads.

Logging issues with council, and encouraging your neighbours to do the same, is a vital part of insuring the services we are provided with are of a high standard, and that the contractors who carry out the work are doing this to the standard council expects.

Council has made it easy to do this, there is an app available through the Apple or Android App Store or you can also simply go online and fill out a form. The app is especially convenient because it allows you to take a photo of the issue to attach to the complaint.

An online or in app complaint will generate an automated response with a job number and this will be followed up within 10 days. This information also feeds into annual maintenance assessments so is important in assessing the levels of service required.

We're entitled to the same levels of service across Auckland whether we're in Remuera or Waitoki, but it does rely on us all taking the time to bring issues to the attention of council staff. If you're finding you're not getting a satisfactory response you are welcome to email the reference number to me so I can follow it up for you: phelan.pirrie@aucklandcouncil.govt.nz.

IF IT DOESN'T FEEL RIGHT — THEN DO IT

There is a part of our brain, a way we operate has humans that wants to keep us safe. Some people call it our ego, some call it our unconscious brain. But it's keeping us stationary. This part of us wants us to stay in our comfort zone and doesn't want us to feel uncomfortable - ever. Believe me, if we just ignored this little wee voice the forward momentum in our lives would be extraordinary.

Most of us will live within our comfort zone our whole lives without ever realising it. Often the way we are 'being' hides from us. My personal experience and what I have seen in clients is that life feels somehow dissatisfying, there is anger and sadness - we ask'ls this it?' Not realising that the gift of life has been right in front of us and we choose to stay where it feels 'right'. But it's not that it feels right, it's that it feels familiar. We are allowed to say no to someone, we are allowed to start that business, we are allowed to wear the funky dress in the wardrobe that we never wear. But we choose to stay where it feels comfortable. Almost everything in our lives right now is a bunch of lovely comfortable habits. Our perspective (or lack of) keeps us right where we are.

Most of the time new ideas or changing something in our lives is NOT going to lead to our demise or death. Usually once actioned, we would be either in the same position we are in now, or BETTER. Rising to a challenge usually brings deep satisfaction. We have all had fantastic ideas, and inspiring in the moment thoughts and it's us being creative and brave and authentic. Then the damn ego gets wind of it and we reason our way to 'it doesn't feel right, 'I don't have time' it's just not me' it's too expensive' I don't believe in it' I'll start tomorrow' I will look silly' or will even give us anxiety. We think about this future event and emotionally embrace it in negative self-debilitating ways. What we are resisting right now is our biggest teacher!

But how do we know the difference between intuition or gut feeling and negative self-talk? Gut instinct is different from thinking. Perhaps intuition or inner knowing happens in the present moment. It's what propels us to do something or not to do something, or it gives us that inspired idea. The negative after voice is thinking. It's us thinking about a future outcome. Mulling over how something might be in the future is not intuition

That place where we make decisions from and reason from is not logical – it's emotional. Over 70% of the time our thoughts are negative, and keeping us stationary. Our thoughts come from our past. They only mean what we make them mean. Once we get our head around this we can start to take control. And this is just a habit too. Changing the thought and feeling is just practice. The old saying "children are like sponges" is very appropriate in this instance.

Recently, we celebrated Diwali, the Festival of Lights, and the children were able to experience some traditional Indian snacks (provided to our centre by a parent), traditional hand painting and designs (similar to the henna designs), and the making of candles and mandalas using natural and creative mediums. 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
