Greetings

'tis the season to be jolly - and damn careful on the roads.

Speed limits are expected to soon drop on many roads around Auckland following the Auckland Transport Board's bylaw approval, but New Zealand's Christmas holiday road toll may still be high.

That's because many people travel outside of Auckland, especially to beach and holiday places at this time.

Nine people were killed during New Zealand's official holiday period last year from December 24-January 3, and 11 prior (December 22-January 3, which was longer), mostly through loss of control, followed by driving too fast for the conditions, with alcohol/drugs and inattention thrown in.

Will lowering Auckland speed limits make a difference?

That's the whole idea behind the Speed Limits Bylaw which includes sections of many roads around the northwest.

The NZ Transport Agency also plans to cut at least 10km/h off most State Highway 16 speed limits - meaning travel through Kumeu and Huapai will be 50km/h instead of 60, Huapai to Waimauku will drop from 100 to 80, and speed limits through Waimauku will be 60 rather than 70.

Public consultation on SH16 speeds was due to close on November 26.

Then there's the safety improvements planned by the agency for SH16, likely early next year, expected to reduce speeds during works.

Auckland City speed limits will be reduced under the AT bylaw to 30km/h in the city centre (Nelson, Hobson and Fanshawe Streets will be 40).

The bylaw applies to 700km of the city's rural roads - except for 20 roads in Rodney and Franklin, deferred to allow more consultation.

The reductions aim to cut Auckland's death and serious injury toll of about two people daily - three times higher than other New Zealand areas.

The changes targeting the highest-risk roads are forecast to stop 87 deaths or serious injuries over five years.

While some agencies welcome the changes - saying lower speed crashes improve survival rates, others like the transport industry believe investing in proper road infrastructure would be better.

People may ignore the speed limits anyway, resulting in more fines and revenue for road upgrades perhaps.

A driving force behind Riverhead

George and Tilly Yelavich of Riverhead celebrated their 60th (diamond) wedding anniversary with a party at the Dalmatian Cultural Society where they first met.

It was known as the Yugoslav Club and was in Hobson Street when they first set eyes on each other in about 1958.

They were married a year later in St Patrick's Cathedral in the city centre on November 14, 1959.

Their diamond anniversary saw the pair partying with about 80 people at the Dalmatian Cultural Society centre in Eden Terrace, also receiving congratulatory messages from the Queen, Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and Governor-General Dame Patsy Reddy.

Born in Kaiataia and raised just north of there on a Waiharara dairy farm following the gum digging boom, George came to Riverhead in 1947 and soon became established in his local community.

He formed Yelavich Bros carrying company there with brothers Wally, Bob and Lou – another brother 'Bunny' Branko settling in Australia.

So began a life-long association with the Kumeu Rugby Club (previously Riverhead then Western United), the Riverhead Tennis Club and the Riverhead War Memorial Reserve committee, starting the committee for the latter in 1950 to fundraise for the park which opened in 1956 and was run by volunteers until the then Waimemata City Council took over maintenance.

George instigated the annual Anzac Day commemorations at the memorial reserve gates about 20 years ago. He recalls the first one involved playing a tape of the Last Post and the flag flying at the Scout Den flagpole.

Tilly (Theresa Mary) grew up in Grey Lynn in the Vujnovich family and learnt sewing at school – something she's done all her life.

She began in baby's wear and moved into women's clothing, her sewing skills also useful for a growing family of three daughters and now four grandchildren.

Tilly became involved in the Riverhead community too, her clothing selling for charities such as Riverhead School galas and Riverhead Plunket fundraising stalls where she served for 17 years.

Her dressmaking and sewing also won her many prizes at the Kumeu Show and the Royal Easter Show.

Tilly's a life member of the Dalmatian Cultural Society and was its "wardrobe mistress" for 13 years.

George and Tilly enjoy traditional South Slavic kolo dancing – "It's good to keep up cultural traditions," Tilly says.

In fact, George has remained active in his later years, playing tennis at the Waimauku Tennis Club up until about a year before his 90th birthday. He played rugby until he was 51 as well.

Both have also been closely associated with Riverhead School, noting its growth over the years.

George was on the school committee for 10 years, including four as chairman. Tilly even made "Dally doughnuts" for the school as well.

They were invited to cut the ribbon to officially open a new two-storey classroom block.

Both say they're in exalted company with former Prime Ministers Helen Clark and John Key officially opening facilities there.

Noting other changes in the area, including the extensive housing developments around them, George is astounded about the traffic congestion.

"I never thought I'd see the day when you had to queue up to get on the highway (State Highway 16) with traffic backed up past Boric's (Boric Food Market)."

They had a museum collection of mementos from the area in their previous home but cannot fit them all in their new Riverhead residence – one reason George as a member of the NorWest Heritage Society was keen to see it establish a district museum.

Says George: "I'm quite proud of all the contributions the Yelavich family have made to the area."

Brenda Steele: say it like it is

After nine years on the Rodney Local Board, Brenda Steele has moved to the political high ground.

"If I have an opportunity to make change I'm going to go for it and give it my best shot," she explains.

A northwest resident all her life, living in Wharepapa in Woodhill for the past 30 years, Brenda remains actively involved in the community while being approached by various Government ministers to help with reviews.

She recently passed a commissioner's course and can sit on resource consent hearings, but her heart lies in helping Defence with cadetships working with the Ministry of Social Development offering six-week courses for young people to gain confidence in job seeking.

"They're like work-ready courses, taking a back-to-basics approach, challenging them physically and mentally to look at themselves," Brenda says.

"Talking about giving young people opportunities really lights my fire."

Brenda works with limited support volunteers (LSVs) and says she can contribute by connecting businesses and Defence to help get cadets into apprenticeships or job opportunities.

"I said we're the only ones with a bombing range in our backyard," Brenda told questioners about her credentials for such a role.

She reckons about 2000 pass through the services annually for training.

Known for her straight talking, Brenda caught the attention of several Government ministers after she was appointed by Whanau Ora Minister Peeni Henare to help with a review which provided a "warts and all" report.

As a result, Brenda's also been added to an independent review committee on benefits and is presently attending a workshop on understanding the role including Housing New Zealand issues.

Her skills for such roles have been honed through many years of work in local body politics and on community groups.

She's chair of the Ngati Whatua Whiti Ora Charitable Trust, for instance, the social arm of the Kaipara settlement trust Nga Maunga Whakahii.

Speaking of the Kaipara, Brenda rates as one of the highlights of her involvement with the former Rodney District Council (where she was the Ngati Whatua liaison officer for four years) and later the Rodney Local Board to establish the Kaipara Moana Co Governance meetings, which started out as the Kaipara Political working party.

"We had the blessing of the mayor of the day (Len Brown) and support from Rodney to set up a committee of representatives of all the councils around the harbour to start the discussions on environmental impacts from land use, water, and fisheries. This also gives the Integrated Kaipara Harbour Management group a platform to speak to all the councils in the one place and vice versa.

With the staff, the group has been working with farmers and landowners on planting and sediment control, coastal management plans, sand movement, invasive pests and more towards what will it take to restore the harbour environment, water quality and fisheries.

"Collectively, all the data about the harbour and its environs are now compiled in one place so we better understand what's happening to the harbour," Brenda says.

"That also gives us a platform to leverage off and have ministers come to the table because we're speaking with one voice."

In August, the Kaipara Harbour was the first to tap into the Government's \$12 million clean waterways fund.


"If all goes well, the Kaipara Harbour will be the first North Island harbour to have a settlement deed that has a co-governance entity for the whole harbour," Brenda says. And let's get real, up till now it has been under the legislative responsibilities of regional councils and clearly that has not worked so a co-governance entity is a great way forward."

She's also proud of her efforts around Helensville's Rautawhiri Park in encouraging community groups to relinquish their leases for the council to pay and maintain the park. "We had community groups – all volunteers – struggling to pay for insurance, maintenance and to find funds. Why should they have to do it when some other parks in the area were being paid for by the council and ratepayers?"

Brenda's proud too of local organisations such as Lions, the Helensville Museum, Rural Women and others who work hard for their communities

If there are any regrets about her council involvement, Brenda says earlier decision makers had the chance to avoid many of the Kumeu-Huapai district's traffic issues associated with growth. She believes a lack of foresight and planning evident then still exists to





some extent today.

She first served on the Rodney Local Board in 2010, then became chair for three years before not seeking re-election to the board in 2019, explaining she did not always see eye-to-eye with the Rodney First ticket on various issues.

"I'm also a strong believer that you shouldn't stay in the position too long - we need to let new blood come in because parts of the community are changing fast."

She sees a divide growing between urban centres and rural parts of the district, especially in the area's representation.

Brenda's all for bringing people together and admits her ability to motivate people for a cause is among reasons she's been chosen for ministerial review panels.

She's demonstrated that in her own life, gaining considerable experience along the way.

After living in Muriwai Beach, Brenda moved to Kumeu when her father Percy Monk became a poultry farm manager in Tawa Road.

Her dad was heavily involved in the local community, coaching Kumeu Rugby (then Western United) with Merv Castle, and in the Kumeu Lions, four-wheel drive and fishing clubs.

"We'd get dragged around as kids and have to do things like help on the gates at the local shows."

Attending Kaipara College at first, Brenda went to Massey High School following the Kumeu move "because the Massey bus went down Tawa Road".

Told she'd better not leave college without a job, Brenda became an apprentice boat builder, working with wood and fibreglass until her skin reacted to the materials.

Brenda then did fencing with Cam Crawford and went to Gourmet Paprika to pick and grade basil before that company got into capsicums.

"I became the classic young Maori unmarried mother for a while," Brenda says.

"My partner's family were very supportive, then he died at 23 of an asthma attack."

Brenda went on a benefit and then did a nurse aide course provided by Work and Income New Zealand for rest homes.

She met husband Aaron Steele 32 years ago and had three more children.

"As a mother you become involved in your children's school, sports and other organisations," says Brenda who remains associated with Woodhill School through the Woodhill Hall committee, recently attending a meeting called to consider its demolition for health and safety reasons. She's also still involved with the South Kaipara Hippy (Home Intervention Parenting Programme for Youngsters).

Her move into the local body political sphere didn't come about

because great, great grandfather Richard Monk had been Waitemata MP for 10 years in the 1880s, or because her father-in-law David Steele had been a long-serving Rodney councillor.

No - Brenda got involved because she wanted to understand how and why decisions were made for the district.

Citing the lack of earlier planning as a reason for standing, Brenda says there was little forethought about the later impact of some decisions.

"I was watching things happen with little consultation with the community and groups and I wanted to learn about the processes and structures and what was required in decision making.

"Serving on a board of trustees was a good foundation for my council role."

Her experience should now serve her and the community at large well in her new roles.

"I am very grateful for the support of this district who voted for me which give me their voices to speak on their behalf at the Rodney Local Board and Auckland Council for nine years. It has been a privilege and thank you."

Kumeu hot rod show's new features

"Lots of different things" are planned for the 26th Jack Daniel's Classic Car and Hot Rod Show at the Kumeu Showgrounds on January 18 and 19.

A revamped show sees some old and some new – and that's not just the cars.

Organisers Ken and Desma Galvin of Kumeu say plenty of different attractions are planned, including the "fire breathing" Wild Bunch NZ drag cars of yesteryear performing startups, a pedal car display, and The Inflatables run where people race in blow-up costumes such as dinosaur and sumo wrestling outfits.

"It's very funny," Ken says of the run which is restricted to those aged 18 and over and involves few rules with pushing allowed.

Two days of the New Zealand Strongman contest will be held with more than 30 entrants.

A massive 45 teams have entered the Jack Daniel's National BBQ Championship with about 35 judges selecting winners in four categories, Sunday show goers expected to be able to sample some of the food.


"We hold the biggest one of that competition and it has a huge following worldwide with people coming to the event from all over," Ken says.

A Retro Caravan display features more than 30 back-dated and novel caravans, including one made out of car parts.

A Retro-O-Rama Alley has 1960s style clothing and fashion, while an indoor motorcycle display has about 35 motorcycles on show supporting Paw Justice to help rescue and rehome our furry friends.

More than 1000 classic cars and hot rods will be displayed indoors and out, with show sheds including unusual cars rarely seen now on the roads, like a Studebaker painted metallic gold.

About 120 trade sites and 300 swap sites are in the show, a website map helping people locate such features.

Milwaukee Tools, for instance, will be selling products at special prices during the festival, and Mega Mitre 10 Westgate is also a show supporter.

There's plenty more to see with live music, a food hall, and a merchandise stand included.

Many events are planned on the Sunday to attract more visitors that day, say the Galvins who have just bought a 1963 New Zealand assembled Plymouth Belvedere sporting blue crushed velvet upholstery which was sitting in a Henderson garage for about 25 years.

'Meet the Makers' dinner

Shortly before the Prince of Wales (Charles) and Duchess of Cornwall (Camilla) visited Waimauku's The Hunting Lodge, the venue hosted about 200 people for a 'Meet the Makers' evening showcasing Rodney producers who contribute to the menu.

Executive chef Des Harris and team brought out a stunning array of dishes while Des introduced some of the suppliers during the event which began around the fire pit where Kaipara Lamb from farmers Richard and Dianne Kidd and Linda and Phillip Hill was barbecued over Mincher Gardens' apple wood using a special spit roast method.

Later describing to guests in the Barn function centre how Kaipara

Lamb is born, reared and raised on their farm, the Kidds explained they are also in their fifth year of supplying North Island Countdown supermarkets with their brand.

Richard says it's "fantastic to see The Hunting Lodge back to how it is now".

"We used to come here in the 1980s and remember it as a great place to bring quests," he says.

The Kidds outlined how they farm sustainably and fence streams and plant to help improve and protect the Kaipara Harbour.

"Our lambs don't have large food miles either and we process them and bring many of them here," Richard says.

Kaipara Lamb tartare was served with Kaipara Oysters crème as a starter, and as a main with Whangaripo Buffalo labneh with Nat (Nat Rose Tettei) and Dave's (David Mercer) farm vegetables.

Oysters were also served separately as a delicious cold smoked starter and buttermilk fried, Biomarine director Jim Dollimore explaining how the Kaipara Oysters brand features oysters grown in a "vigorous" but clean tidal water environment near the Kaipara Harbour mouth where they are "tumbled about", adding to their taste.

Massimo's Italian Cheeses from Dairy Flat also graced the menu, Massimo saying "I do the best I can and hope people like it". His stracciatella was served with parmesan shortbread as a starter while an entrée comprised Massimo's buratta with sweet peas, asparagus and coppa served with focaccia and whipped brown butter.

Whangaripo Buffalo also make cheeses, a delicious buffalo blue cheese with macadamia nuts and John Tucker's honey and medlar fruit paste on the menu to finish.

John from Kaipara Natural Honey has some hives round The Hunting Lodge's permaculture gardens, which also provides salads, vegetables and other produce for the menu and functions.

He plans to sell his multiflora honey to the public through The Hunting Lodge's cellar door.

Chris and Pam Wills started farming buffalo near Wellsford and their daughter Annie Wills and husband Phil Armstrong told guests about how they were venturing into a mobile abattoir and that the buffalo cows, which provide milk for 20 years, all have names.

Bruce Spooner, wife Angela and son Daryl detailed the history behind their Georgian-style home and the orchard and gardens around Mincher in Coatesville.

The garden of national significance is open by appointment throughout the year, Bruce saying they'd had 600 people through in one day as part of a six-garden Coatesville Garden Ramble fundraising tour by the Rotary Club of Albany raising about \$30,000 for Glaucoma NZ Awareness and other Rotary projects.

Fire but not as we know it

As we go to print the latest figures have come out on the recent loses attributed to the NSW fires over the last month. A staggering 1.6 million hectares burnt or on fire. A staggering 48 houses lost and almost 1600 sheds or barns lost to fire. And most frightening is the five lives that have been lost to fires and several people unaccounted for.

Flame intensity that spanned over 30 meters tall and embers that were transported by wind and convection to start new fires almost 30km away from the fire head. If you think this is new and unchartered information, you are right. We are in an environment that the droughts are longer, the fuel is dryer, the wind is gustier and the humidity is far less than ever before.

I attended a complex of fires in the Clarence valley over the last two weeks an hour's drive north from Coffs Harbour in the role of safety advisor and worked with almost 300 strong minded, resilient fire fighters that work the fire line with a drip torch, fire appliance and hand tools. Three primary actions, scrap in a firebreak, burn back to the fire from the firebreak in small controlled patterns, and then extinguish with water to provide a solid black-out area to try to minimise fire spread. When it comes to saving homes, they use the same principle when they can, when they can't, they get amongst the fire with small volume high pressure water hoses to suppress the flames.

It's a hard business and many are pure volunteers, giving back for the good of the community. In this day and age I am really amazed by the readiness and the resolve of these people. So if you ever think you're having a bad day, best you



look at some others over the ditch that are doing it really tough and put things in perspective.

Stay safe, and checkitsalright.nz before you light.

Kumeu wins Harbour Club 7s

Kumeu Rugby won the North Harbour Sevens Club Championship for the first time in its history.

The On Target Drilling Kumeu team was not one of the fancied teams going into the tournament at Helensville



Rugby Club in November based on previous results.

But the team went through the tournament unbeaten, knocking over notable clubs in the process.

The first pool game versus hosts Helensville was approached with caution as the traditional rivalry of neighbouring clubs is always there.

After trading early tries, Kumeu ran out 36-12 victors. Next up and the team really got into their stride versus a strong Takapuna side, winning 31-17.

Last year's winners Northcote has been a bogey team for Kumeu at 15-aside, and a tight contest was won 14-12.

That left Kumeu topping its pool going into the knockout stages.

Marist in the quarter final were fit but Kumeu's power and support play showed in a comfortable win.

Fifteen-aside champions East Coast Bays proved a huge game in the

semi-finals.

Kumeu scored arguably the try of the tournament with Pita Volavola breaking out from Kumeu's dead ball area. Great support play led to a length of the field try levelling the scores.

Another Bays try put the pressure on. Then, more than a minute after the final hooter sounded, Peni Buakula broke the Bays defence to score. The conversion left Kumeu the winners at 19-17.

Five games gone and the Kumeu players were tired, with just one last push in the final.

North Shore has always been strong, but Kumeu's grip on possession in the first half produced two well-constructed tries against a stubborn defence to lead 10-7 at the break. Shore came back in the second half to lead 14-10. With a couple of minutes remaining Buakula did it again, scoring under the posts to give Kumeu a 17-14 lead.

A very tense couple of minutes followed, the players out on their feet. Shore got possession, but with the defence just holding they kicked with the ball gathered by Kumeu to hoof out and the trophy was Kumeu's.

It was a huge effort from a team that was underrated by most but believed in each other and took a never say die attitude into all the games, Kumeu coach Mark Hall says.

From the winning Kumeu team, three players are now training with North Harbour 7s team – Dillon O'Leary, Pita Volavola and Peni Buakula.

Playing in the National Club 7s tournament in Wellington next February is also being considered, with some fundraising to be done. All-in-all a great way to finish the season, Hall says, with Kumeu looking forward to the 2020 season with increased confidence and pride.

Need to negotiate with Santa to get onto the nice list?

Do you need some help negotiating with Santa? If you find yourself not on Santa's Nice List this year then you have a variety of options. Property market report

Auckland residential listings jumped by 30% from 1 September and 30 October, which has set the scene for a more "active" market in the run to the year's end.

Listings jumped from 1204 in September to 1605 last month - the highest number for 2019, with March the second busiest month of 2019 and 1571 listings. A feature of the market since March 2019 has been the limited number of listed properties for sale, and in September, the number of properties on the market was at its lowest for more than two years. In October that changed, with new listings being 30% higher than in September, and more than 40% higher than the average for the previous three months. Sales for the month increased to 824, up 6.9% on the previous month and over 3% higher than the average for the previous three months.

Prices also edged up with the average price at \$939,132 an increase of 1.6 per cent on the average for the previous three months and the median price at \$845,000 up by 2.2% on the average for the previous three months. October's data signals both vendors and buyers are coming to accept is that the market conditions that have prevailed for more than two years now are the new norm, and that there is no big price increases or major price declines on the horizon.

So, in short a careful and sustained market with a good choice for buyers and sellers that should be mind-full that the days of month on month price increases on property have gone.

Disclosure about trust assets to beneficiaries

Trustees now have a clear obligation to tell beneficiaries about the assets and investments contained within a trust. A further issue is the extent to which many trust deeds provide for not just the children of the settlor but more remote categories such as charities and the de facto partners of the settlors' children. These provisions were intended to ensure that there was a broad range of people or organisations who could benefit from the trust. Usually, however, those beneficiaries beyond close family will be oblivious to their mention in a trust deed. Against this, most modern trust deeds try and make sure that the only beneficiaries are the settlors' children and grandchildren.

We accordingly recommend a close review of any trust deed with legal assistance to establish who the beneficiaries are. Secondly, to consider the extent to which the settlors have power to remove discretionary beneficiaries. Removing the remote beneficiaries should have the effect of reducing the burden of disclosure and avoiding unwanted enquiries from those remote categories of beneficiary.



Central's Tips December 2019



The holidays are here and it's a great time to escape out to the garden. Plant edible flowers to bring some extra wow to your salads, harvest ready garlic and protect tomatoes from getting blemishes.

And don't forget to take some time out and relax.



Harvest ready garlic

Make sure to let garlic dry out in the sun after you've pulled it up. Plaiting it and hanging in a cool, dry area will not only look great but will help preserve it to be used over the coming months.

In the Edible Garden

- Sun scorch on tomatoes: an unsightly blemish can form on tomatoes where plants are situated in bright sunlight. Cover with shade cloth over the heat of the day to keep them nice and red
- Harvesting garlic: when the tops of garlic begin to wither it's a sign that the cloves are ready. Pull out the entire plant, then let it lie on the soil in the sun for a few days to dry off. Storage by hanging in a cool dry area (plaiting is great), will keep it ready to use for months
- Flowers for food, bees and butterflies: edible violas, calendulas and nasturtiums look great in the vegetable patch as well as the summer salad. Add lavenders and flowering thyme plants for bees. When it comes to butterflies include plenty of blue echium and salvias that are attractive to them
- Last chance to throw some sunflower seeds in

 they are available in both tall and short types,
 great fun in the summer garden

The rest of the Garden

- Create a pretty shade garden by planting fuchsias and impatiens beneath tree canopies or amongst shrubs. These plants flower happily in low light over summer and autumn
- **Top up a birdbath** or an elevated dish of water during the hot summer months to give the birds and beneficial insects some respite against the heat.
- **Recycle:** Use grey water (washing up water from floors, handwashing or a bucket in the shower) to top up pots and prized plants. It's amazing how this can get you into a good 'watering routine' when your plants need it most
- **Blue** is a very cooling colour for heat which is why we see hydrangeas, tall salvias and agapanthus used around gardens for summer blooming. It can also give an illusion of depth in a garden
- Liquid feed everything around the garden, particularly newly planted annuals and perennials, and potted plants

Canine body language

According to ACC - New Zealanders reported over 14,379 dog bites in 2018, costing over \$5,925,000. Women are more likely to be bitten than men 7,722 compared to 6,657. People aged between 55-59 are more likely to be bitten, 1,069 reported. Children under the age of 14 received 2,495.



Many bites are unreported or are not captured in ACC reporting for multiple reasons. But the fact is that dog bites are on the increase.

Coming in to summer we are going to again see an increase in dog bites if we don't start to implement a few basic rules.

1. Never try to touch a dog without the owner's permission.

Basically this means - ask first. Don't approach a dog if it is on its own, for example if it's outside a supermarket, shop, café or wherever.

We hear this all the time but what does that mean and can we rely on the owner to understand if the dog is happy to be touched or not. Most times yes ...but; as is always the case there are the exceptions. At a dog show a few years ago I watched as a couple of children approached an owner to ask if they could stroke her dog. The dog hid behind the owner. She told the children that it was ok and then dragged her dog around so that the children could pat it. Fortunately one of the people I was with intervened and asked the children if they thought the dog wanted to be patted as the owner had just dragged the dog from behind her? They said no – but even though they knew that the dog did not want to be patted they were still going to pat it as the owner had said it was ok. The dog had done everything in its power to move away from a situation it did not like but because of the circumstances it was in it couldn't. This could

Ice cubes can be fun for cats. Watch your cat push them around and pounce. Fill a hot water bottle with cold tap water for your cat to lie on. Put



some ice cubes in their water bowl. Rinse out a balloon, fill it with water, tie a knot and freeze overnight. Remove the balloon and place in a baking tray.

Keeping your cat safe - Never lock pets in cars: Pets can quickly overheat and develop heatstroke. Water: Make sure fresh water is available, have a few bowls inside and out.

Sun Protection: If your cat is fair skinned and goes outside, apply a cat safe sunscreen on nose and ears.

Fleas: Especially bad during the hotter months.

Elderly, obese and kittens: These cats are less tolerant of heat.

Signs of heatstroke - Cats can get heatstroke and develop skin cancer from sunburn like people. Some signs of heatstroke; Agitation, stretching out and breathing rapidly, extreme distress, skin hot to touch, glazed eyes and vomiting and drooling.

If you cat is behaving oddly and you notice any skin changes during hot days contact your vet.



Be sun smart

As we approach the summer months I thought I'd write something about the importance of protecting our skin from the sun. The skin is not often thought of as an organ, but this is exactly what it is. It



plays an important role in protecting us from the environment - from water, heat, infections, and the sun. It also keeps everything where it should be. But like any organ, it can be damaged and one of the main causes of damage to the skin is the sun. In this country, we are aware of the risks of the sun, that being said, I still see several cases of severe sunburn every year. Probably most worryingly, however, is that New Zealand has the highest melanoma rate in the world (Ministry of Health NZ).

This statistic is due to a number of factors, but the main issue I want to put across here, is that we need to be cautious in the sun. I am fully aware that we love the sunshine. It is part of the New Zealand culture to spend time outside when the sun is shining. That being said, please plan ahead. Wear suitable clothing. Wear a hat with a wide brim. When selecting a sunscreen, choose one with a high SPF (such as 50+). The World Health Organisation recommends reapplying this every 2 hours, or after working, swimming, or exercising outdoors. They also recommend avoiding the sun when it is at its strongest. This is between the hours of 10am and 4pm. Babies should always be kept out of the sun. Please remember that children's fragile skin is particularly susceptible to the sun. I completely understand how difficult it is putting sunscreen on a toddler. I have found that making a game out of it can help, and explaining to my child that if she wants to go outside she must put on her cream, wear a hat and cover up. Unfortunately this is the price we pay for living in this beautiful country. Dr Isabelle Duck is a GP at Silverdale Medical.

"What's in my foot?!"

Feel like you have glass or a thorn in your foot but don't remember standing on anything? You may well have a corn or a verruca. While these two lesions produce similar symptoms in the foot, they are quite different from each other and therefore their treatments differ. A corn is a densely packed cylindrical mass of dead tissue, with the tip pointing into you. They generally form over areas of high pressure,

such as bony prominences or scar tissue. Corns are generally found on the toes and forefoot but can also be on the heel or midfoot. They can be easily and painlessly removed by a Podiatrist. The difficulty with corns is that if the pressure that caused them is still present, they will return, your Podiatrist should discuss with you ways in which you can reduce the chance of them returning.

Verrucae are viral lesions that have a cauliflower like appearance. Like all viruses, they are contagious so can be picked up from other family members or at communal bathing or changing facilities. The virus takes over the skin cells and starts growing larger. The body is always working to clear viruses, and sometimes verrucae clear on their own. If they don't it tends to be either because the immune system is unaware the verruca is there (because they are on the skin it is harder to detect the presence of a virus), or because the immune system is focusing on other more pressing matters e.g. growing, keeping you well etc. If you are continually sick, the body will not prioritise clearing the verruca, it will instead focus on getting you well. Treatment of verrucae therefore is dual sided - supporting the immune system to do what it does well - clear viruses, and applying a topical treatment to treat the verruca from the outside. Generally topical treatments work effectively if the verruca is young, however if it has been there for longer than a few years surgical and laser treatments are the next options. Both of these work well, provided the immune system is strong!

- 2. Maintain good posture when sitting in the car. Try not to slouch and use the lumbar support and headrests.
- 3. Have regular breaks during the drive. Our spines need movement, so stop half way for a stretch.
- 4. Know when to stop and have a break. If you are feeling a little stiff and sore, stop and have a rest.
- 5. Stretch before and after the trip.



Shoe Talk's tips

How do you mould and stretch a pair of shoes to fit your feet when you are short on time?

This is Shoe Talk's guide on how to make your new shoes fit your foot shape when you have purchased something new that you need to wear soon after purchase, please note this only works if the footwear actually fits your foot correctly to start with shoes will only ever give in width a few mm and not at all in length .

So follow the following tips:

• If the shoes pinch your heels you can soften the heels by gently rolling the back of the heel over with your thumbs to soften the edge.



- Put on a pair of socks; grab your new shoes and your hairdryer. Turn the hairdryer onto warm and gently direct the head towards the shoe, approx 15cm away be careful though as you do not want to burn the leather, if it's suede put the heat even further away. Heat the leather up to where it feels malleable. Put the shoes on your feet and walk around them as they cool. The heat will soften the leather and allow it to mould to the shape of your foot. Repeat if required.
- Finally notice any points that feel like they will rub on the first wear and put a plaster on this will ensure you have a great night and no sore feet or blisters!



Getting back to basics harvesting

At Country Bears we are very fortunate to have space, so gardening and growing of vegetables, flowers and herbs are a very popular activity for our children. Ask a child where fruit and vegetables come from, and their response might possibly be "the supermarket" or "the freezer". Giving the



children repetitive experiences centered on the growth cycle from seed to harvest, empowers the children in their understanding of where fruit, vegetables, flowers and herbs come from.

Part of our outdoor programme is our garden; this plays an important part within our curriculum. The children learn many things from this experience, including what work is involved in keeping a garden; different types of plants and seedlings and how to care for these so we have fruit and vegetables to eat; working in a natural environment and understanding the impact the weather has on the growth of our garden; the language and words that they may not

have heard before, such as generic plant names and processes such as composting and worm farming; it is an activity that can be both solitary and group based. Gardening is a very sensory experience incorporating some, if not all, of the senses at different times, creating a holistic and rewarding experience for children.

Using empty strawberry and blueberry containers and our numerous gardens around the centre, we are teaching the children how to grow, maintain and watch the growth of our produce. A variety of vegetable and flower seedlings were recently planted, giving the children opportunities to learn that from a seed, produce or beauty begins to grow. Throughout this experience, the children will use mathematics, science and physical skills, along with communication, information gathering, problem-solving & social, co-operative skills.

This project required the children to transfer the dirt from the bag into the containers to plant the seeds in, top them off with more soil and water them. They took turns with their peers, followed instructions from the teachers, and used their gross and fine motor skills.

We will be watching in anticipation for the sprouts to appear and then will measure their growth, waiting patiently until the time is right for us to harvest. Then we shall reap the rewards; natures healthy, vibrant, beautiful bounty!

Phelan's Local Board update

It is a huge honour to have been elected Chair of the Rodney Local Board at our swearing-in meeting in early November.

Last terms' Chair, Beth Houlbrooke, has been a tireless cheerleader for Rodney. She developed an excellent working relationship with the Mayor and Councillors, staff and management and most of all with the Board. Beth has most importantly ensured we maintained a focus on delivering our three-year plan, and worked with the Board to form a consensus on our goals, clearly demonstrated by the fact that in three years only three votes weren't unanimous.

I am encouraged to see that the Mayor intends to take a hard look at Council Controlled Organisations (CCO's). Auckland Transport is a source of frustration for many in Rodney. There are some great staff in that organisation who are as frustrated as I am with the mixed results. In a democracy, you cannot have an organisation spending billions of ratepayers dollars that appears not to communicate, engage or be accountable to the community that funds its activities.

It is now almost two years since the Local Government Commission released its report on the North Rodney breakaway application. We have yet to see meaningful progress on the recommendations which included better engagement and communication; Local Board offices in Rodney so our community has better access to our meetings and Board members; and a balancing of the funding inequalities we have compared to other parts of Auckland due to Rodney District Council constrained ability to fund facilities. I would like to see these recommendations need to be acted upon over the next twelve months.

Over the last five years, the population in Rodney has grown by over 10,000 making us the second-fastest growing ward in Auckland. This growth is set to continue. The Local Board must ensure we

are focused on meeting the needs of our growing towns while not neglecting our rural residents, this requires thoughtful balancing.

I look forward to continuing the excellent work of our previous Chair and the Local Board to maintain productive relationships, consensus and a focus on delivering results for all Rodney residents.

Shake up or shape up

The Auckland Council elections are completed and Phil Goff has been returned to power as the mayor of Auckland. So, the topical question is, what might be different under his reign from the previous three years?

Under his first term, Councillors were divided into two factions. Those supporters of Goff, were called by the media the "A



team" and those who were not in the clique were dubbed the "B team".

One change we are likely to see is the mayor employing a far more inclusive leadership style with all the Councillors.

This has already been evidenced to me in my early meetings with the mayor. There is no doubt in my mind of his intent to improve on his first-term relationships. This will be beneficial for NorWest Rodney. By way of example, through the mayor employing a listening ear, advocating to central government to alleviate SH16 traffic congestion, gaining better roading maintenance standards, and dramatically increasing the rate of delivery of the road sealing programme have all been endorsed as projects he will champion with me. These endorsements and support are very different from what I experienced last term. My job is to ensure these are indeed delivered as wins for NorWest Rodney.

It is my opinion a key action the mayor must undertake, in order to instill greater confidence and trust about the council, is to commission an independent review of the performance of the Council Controlled Organisations (CCOs). This is something he promised on the election hustings.

There is a strong undercurrent of concern that ordinary ratepayers are being marginalised and citizens' rights' increasingly over-ridden by all-powerful CCO bureaucracies. To his credit Mayor Goff has formally announced that he will be reining in the city's CCOs. This should be seen as more good news.

The people of Rodney have expressed frustration with the CCOs' performance and delivery, along with their poor levels of responsiveness when issues are lodged with them. The five CCOs are Auckland Transport (AT), Panuku Development Auckland, Watercare, Auckland Tourism Events and Economic Development



(ATEED), and Regional Facilities Auckland (RFA). Collectively they control over 50 per cent of all council's (your rates) spending.

The review will be conducted independently of Auckland Council staff and will include, amongst other things, if any of the CCOs should be abolished, or downsized, or even amalgamated back into Auckland Council. The primary driver is what value for money are each really delivering?

Mayor Goff wants the independent panel up and running before Christmas with the findings delivered by mid-next year. That's pretty quick!

I'm predicting the review will be good for the NorWest, particularly in the roading space by getting better bang for our buck from Auckland Transport, and better customer service levels in general. I will update you if this "shake up" is "shaping up" as we all might be hoping.

Stopping council's wastage and overspending remains a primary focus for me.


