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
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PHELAN'S LOCAL BOARD UPDATE JULY 2015

Your Local Board has been keen on encouraging community led projects for a few years and now Council is going to start supporting this over the coming years calling the initiative 'Empowering Communities'. We're already well on our way with a community grant round that was focused on pathways just being completed, which saw us support the following community initiatives...

Riverhead Residents & Ratepayers Association received \$20,000 towards a linking pathway on an unused paper road off Alexandra St. This will turn a bit of land from unmaintained mess into a pathway and gardens. The Huapai Domain Reserve Committee got \$22,000 towards a perimeter path, part of a \$150,000 Local Board funded project starting this year.

Muriwai Community Association received \$35,000 for a pathway on a strip of reserve land on Oaia Rd which will link the two ends of the Oaia Rd footpath to complete a loop around Muriwai.

These organisations will be looking for community help in getting the projects completed so keep an eye out in your local papers and Facebook pages for news. Further work on paths is taking place in Riverhead with two new footpaths being approved by the Board for construction this year, one on Maude Street and the other along Great North Rd providing a link between new and old Riverhead. Residents in Kumeu and Huapai will be heading into a series of public consultation meetings in a few months around planning for the future of this fast growing township, an announcement about this work and the steps taking place will be made shortly if not already, depending on when this goes to print. If you are having issues with getting community based projects off the ground and bogged down in bureaucracy, or need help with any issues to do with Council please get in touch with me and I will see what I can do to help... 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BROWNIES AND GUIDES



The 5 team members were Stephen Bishop, Anthony Hellyer, Wendy Paltridge, Jamie Shaw and William Grigg. The total funds raised for Leukaemia and Blood Cancer NZ has exceeded \$1 Million. SALTBROTHERS STRIKE AGAIN

Local Muriwai Plumber and speedster extraordinaire Corey Bertelson is once again off to Utah Speed week to try and break another world record. Speed Week starts on the 7th of August with the first day set aside for tech inspection. This is where they find out if



the bikes are all up to the precise specs required to race.

This year he is taking two bikes, the Honda 250cc which is the bike Corey has broken 5 world records on and a Yamaha 350cc which he has spent the last 2 years getting ready. The 350 has gone well in testing but it's all about how well it goes on the salt.

Speed Week is an annual event held at the iconic Bonneville Salt Flats in Utah, USA and this year will be the fifth year that Saltbrothers Racing has attended.

After they get the tech inspection out of the way racing begins and continues over the remainder of the week. If they complete a qualifying run they are required to do a backup run to secure the record. The new record is taken from the average of the two qualifying runs.

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

COMPUTER GAMES HELP EYES?

For Eyes Optometrists in the Kumeu Village are calling on amblyopes to help Auckland University with a study on vision development. Amblyopia (lazy eye) is characterised by good vision in one eye and blur-



ry vision in the other, even with glasses or contact lenses. (You may have had patching, eye drops, glasses and/or eye surgery in childhood). Once thought untreatable after the age of 7, the BRA-VO clinical study is investigating a new way of treating amblyopia using a videogame that helps the two eyes to work together. The study requires playing a video-game on an iPod touch device for 1-2 hours per day over 6 weeks at home. iPods will be loaned to you by the trial. The study also requires 5 visits to the University clinic over a period of 24 weeks.

SILVER FERN MEDICAL CENTRE

Free for Under-13s - Under the government's proposed new Free for Under-13s scheme, Silver Fern is planning for all children under 13 enrolled with our Practice to have free visits to our doctors and nurses. This will include prescrip-



tion charges and also injuries covered by ACC. We will implement the Free for Under-13s as soon as the final negotiations between the DHB and PHO are concluded, perhaps as early as July 1st.

My child always seems always to have a cold! - We are now well into the season for the common cold. Many parents are surprised that on average a preschool child will get over six colds per year, each lasting an average of one to two weeks – so this means your child might have a lot of "cold" symptoms over the next few months!

Catching a cold - "Getting a chill" doesn't cause a cold. Rather cold viruses are transmitted by touching another person (the viruses survive on our hands for two hours) or by touching surfaces such as door handles (where the viruses can survive for up to a day). Young children in daycare seem to have more colds than children cared for at home – but don't worry - when these children start primary school, they generally catch fewer colds, presumably because they are already more immune.

How do I recognize a cold? - The cold usually starts one to two days after catching the virus and might include a stuffy nose, nasal discharge (this might be clear, yellow, or green), fever, sore throat, cough, irritability, and difficulty sleeping.

The first week will be the worst, but some children continue to have a blocked or runny nose and cough well after this. And it is not unusual to develop a second cold as the symptoms of the first cold are resolving - this can make it seem as if your child has a single cold that lasts for weeks or even months! What can help?

• Try humidified air for nasal symptoms

• For infants, parents can try saline nose drops, followed by gentle bulb suction to temporarily remove nasal secretions. Older children may find a saline nose spray more helpful

- Honey for night-time cough in children older than 1 year
- Drink adequate fluid (but it is not necessary to drink extra fluid)
- If your child is uncomfortable because of fever, consider paracetamol (older than three months) or ibuprofen (older than six months). Do NOT give aspirin.
- Help your child wash their hands before and after eating and after coughing or sneezing

Do they need to stay home from daycare or school? Most children with colds do not need to stay home - it is very likely that they spread the virus before they developed cold symptoms. Do contact your healthcare provider if you have any concerns.

Remember seeing your doctor or nurse will shortly be free once the government's Free for Under-13s scheme is finalised.



Michael Mann in 2013 explained how "we must gradually introduce our children to the natural world and the environment, and the threats to it that currently exist because of what we are doing. But we must pro-

A relevant and interesting approach is the Forest School approach. Forest School is a concept that originated in Sweden in the 1950's to reintroduce nature to children. The concept spread through Scandinavia. Forest Schools not only give urban children a chance to reconnect with nature, they give children a safe space to "develop their own ideas, make decisions, solve problems and take risks" (Cummings, A, 2010, p.1). The philosophy of Forest Schools is steeped in the constructivist approach to learning, which follows a child-led curriculum, giving the children a hands-on approach to learning.

When children are given the opportunity to connect to nature they are able to test out their theories about the natural world whilst in natural forest environments. A child-led curriculum allows the children to develop independence, develop and expand their self-esteem in a positive manner, and learn about team work, whilst also strengthening social skills.

Whilst in nature, children's bodies develop stamina and all five senses are enhanced. They are free to touch everything, gaining an understanding of different textures, smelling the trees, water, mud, leaves, moss, and ferns. The children are being stimulated in every sense of the word (Cummings, 2010).

McKinney (2012) explains that cultures "fuelled by capitalism have greatly severed connections to nature" (p.2) and often urban or suburban families and parents have trouble imagining a Forest School and its benefits. In Scandinavia, however, where there are legal rights and cultural traditions built around being outdoors, "Friluftsliv" or an "open air life" is a way of life, the Forest School concept is an easy concept to adopt. In New Zealand however there is no policy in place that ensures children spend quality time immersed within fully natural outdoor spaces. Often New Zealand is seen from the past, as a country of barefoot and jandles, a culture of beach, bush and camping, yet with more and more parents working longer and longer hours, more of our young children are attending childcare centres and ones that ensure a connection to the nature outdoor spaces are vital for their healthy growth and development.

Cummings (2010) also describes how beneficial Forest School's are for children, reminding us that children need to take risks to develop and grow. Mairs (2000) states (as cited in Cummings, 2010) "A risk is a challenge a child can see and chooses to undertake or not. Eliminating risk leads to a child's inability to assess danger" (p.2). McKinney (2012) agrees with Cummings and highlights the role of adults in risk management. "Exploring may pose risks, but experienced and trained caregivers/practitioners control harms and mitigate risks in order to maximize learning" (McKinney, 2012, p.4).

Cummings (2010) also highlights the many aspects of the child's development that Forest Schools aim to assist with: "Self-awareness, self-regulation, intrinsic motivation, empathy, social skills and communication skills, independence, positive mental attitudes, good healthy self-esteem and confidence" (Cummings, 2012, p.2).

With its foundation in self-directed learning within an ever changing organic curriculum, the discoveries that the children make of the world around them is the learning. Forest Schools allow children the freedom to "develop at their own speed and in their own time" (Gautreau, 2012, p.2). At its centre the learning is immersed in personal, social and emotional development, the development of communication, language and literacy and science, nature and mathematical development, with everyday exploration, investigation and testing out theories to help understand the world (Davis and Waite, 2005).



FROM THE DESK OF THE BASE AUCKLAND Commander, group captain tim walshe



Engaging with the Whenuapai and wider West Auckland communities is important for the Air Force because we have 1400 personnel working at our Base, and most of them live in neighbourhoods close by. We regularly host schools, charities and clubs on Base and this is something we really like to do. Lots of people know of Base Auckland but not many have actually been inside the wire and had a look around, so when we can host groups we try to give them a great Air Force experience. I think Air Force people are well embedded within the West Auckland and wider community; they belong to sports clubs, are representatives on school boards, take part in local activities and support local businesses. As Base Commander I'm proud of the way Air Force personnel interact with their community. Base Auckland is incredibly busy. We're home to the Air Force's larger fixed wing fleets, that's our C-130 Hercules, Boeing 757s and P-3K2 Orion fleets, as well as our naval helicopter squadron who fly the Seasprites. The Hercules aircraft fly almost every day on missions both here in New Zealand and overseas. The Hercules was the first aircraft on the ground in Vanuatu after Cyclone Pam delivering emergency provisions to survivors. The Hercules also recently celebrated 50 years of service with the Air Force, which is a great milestone. Our Navy helicopter fleet are in the process of transitioning from the older model Seasprite aircraft to the new model Seasprite. These are helicopters that embark on Navy ships and conduct maritime surveillance. Currently we have a Seasprite and crew deployed with HMNZS TE KAHA, which is part of the Combined Maritime Forces fleet carrying out maritime security operations in the Gulfs of Oman and Aden and the Indian Ocean region. At the same time we're approaching the twelve month mark on our P-3K2 Orion deployment to the Middle East to support anti-piracy initiatives as part of a combined multi-national taskforce. Just last week our Orion operated alongside TE KAHA in the region. The work the Defence Force is doing is making an important contribution in support of our partners. A lot of new infrastructure is going up

on Base this year. One of the most noticeable is the new No.6 Squadron facility, which you can see from the road by the main entrance to the Base. This facility will house the new helicopters and our flying training simulator. We're also building a new aviation medicine unit, a new gym and a 25m shooting range. Many of our on Base accommodation blocks are 1930s-style, so we are looking to upgrade these as well. It will be great to have new modern facilities for our personnel who live in barracks. 2015 is another busy year of the Air Force and I'm pleased with how well supported we are in the local community.

CATCHING UP WITH MARTIN (LONG TIME Whenuapai resident)



Whenuapai is changing, the number of investors and land bankers coming into the area is increasing the rate of development. I have lived in Whenuapai most of my life, love the airbase. Dad was in the airforce, the RNZAF events and the links with City life but the best of Rural life. I remember thinking it was so funny living on gravel roads yet so close to the city centre. Whenuapai will completely change with the increase in residential Dwellings; it is good that the airbase is staying and provides stability for the area. It the rock that will always be. I would like to see investment in wider footpaths, cycle tracks, walking areas and street lighting. Because Whenuapai is a blank canvas Council can do some great things to encourage the community to walk, run and enjoy the environment. They can really make a difference but it must be done right. I hope that the density is not too great as it will cause some major issues. The Westgate development is very interesting; to see the creation of a new city so close and the links to West Harbour, Hobsonville, and Kumeu. This place is so close to all other areas. Through the development in the area I would like to see some rural elements retained. It is important to plan for cycleways through rural land and different outlooks. Make it interesting and unique, encourage a change to different transport and lifestyle. Walking options to entertainment and experiences rather than a reliance on cars. I am moving soon and will miss Whenuapai. I love the sound of the Hercules overhead and I will really miss that.

WHENUAPAI AIRBASE

kumeuCourier

In 1937 land was purchased by the Crown at Whenuapai to construct an aerodrome able to take heavy aircraft. This was to compliment the lighter facility used for seaplanes already in existence at Hobsonville. The Whenuapai project had been a valuable source of wages for many locals through this time. Reber's transport was the main contractor to carry supplies in the area with much sand and



cement carted from Kumeu Rail siding. Once the war began, activity at Whenuapai increased with 37,000 air passengers and 4,000,000 pounds of freight passing through Whenuapai between February 1943 and September 1945. Whenuapai was at the centre of New Zealand's military organisation, and attention was given to protecting the airbase from possible Japanese attack. One protective strategy was to surround the aerodrome with dummy aircraft and also establish an alternate aerodrome near Whenuapai that would act as a decoy in any attack. Kumeu was chosen as the ideal site lying next to the railway line between Taupaki and Cemetry Roads. Problems around access, rough ground, kauri stumps and surface compaction were overcome with significant works including 4000 nine inch field tiles being laid upon scoria overlaid with turf. Up to ten imitation Hudson aircraft replicas were positioned at the site and the airstrip was in use by a fleet of trainer Tiger moths conducting regular flights in the area. In the 1940's the Air Training Cadets were started in the area and stimulated much interest in flight. One of the most memorable misadventures occurred in June 1942 when a USAAF B17 Flying Fortress aircraft crashed shortly after take off close to the main highway at Brighams Creek close to the home of George Sinton. No one on the ground was injured but all 11 airmen on board died. The explosion was heard in Auckland City and many people thought that the Japanese were attacking.

ANDERSON AND OLEARY LTD EST 1943



The only sawmill left in Auckland today, the mill started in 1943 by Andrew Anderson, his son Neil and Timothy O'leary was about cutting firewood from farms in the Whenuapai and Kumeu areas. In the early 1950's the company moved into earthmoving and was involved in forming many of the local parks and developments including triangle road and Poremoremo interchanges. The hardware store opened in 1977 and has had several names and now is under the ITM banner as Western ITM. The company is one of the larger employers with 79 staff on site in Whenuapai and 128 over the whole companies activities in the district. The company is still family owned and operated by the Anderson Family today. The company has always had a close relationship with the Air base on the sports field, wings and wheels, a real collaboration between business, community and the airbase, The first Wings and Wheels was in 1992 and was a big event on the Auckland air and motorsport-calendar. Another local event that Anderson and O'Leary was responsible for establishing is the Whenuapai ½ Marathon as it is known today. This was started by Bruce Anderson in 1987 in collaboration with the Massey Harriers,(a running club), a popular event that is still well supported today.



As a sawmill with dry kiln facilities we have called upon the fire services of the airbase to extinguish fires or cool down embers which has helped tremendously. One of the things that Andrew Anderson started in 1987 was the Massey Harriers, (a running club) based next to the Massey Rugby Club which remains active today, with a yearly competition being the 1/2 marathon through the area. Whenuapai is embarking on more intensive housing, but with that it is good to see the identity remain with the village. People are recognising the unique aspect of the village and the community. With growth we need to maintain some of the unique aspects, retain the green fields, local flavour and identity. Recently we had a footpath put in which has connected the area and allowed people to get out and walk and enjoy the area more. We have fast narrow roads and it was not safe to walk or bike on the roads. Footpaths bring us together as a community and allow us to feel a lot safer. The school is an important part of the community and should be encouraged to grow in order to support local families. Change will come, pressures will come with that change with the airbase as more people come into the area delivering more expectations and therefore a larger voice for change. We have to develop our operation to ensure we are competitive and grow to meet clients' needs. We are in a great area that is not fully affected by traffic congestion. The company for decades has had a staff slogan "no cars or bus when you work for us" as all staff are picked up and transported home. This is a major part of the culture of the company caring for its staff and providing good service. WHENUAPAI SCHOOL - LIVING IS STRIVING

It all began in 1957 when the Waitemata City Council decided to build a new school. Whenuapai School was to be located on Kennedy Road in Kumeu. The property was just about to be bought by the council when someone pointed out that the school should be situated in central Whenuapai near the Airbase. The Whenuapai Poultry Farm owned by the Andersons was sold to the council and preparations for the school began. It started with just 3 permanent classes which are now rooms 8, 9 and 10. The founding principal of the school was Mr Mcrae, whose wife was also on the staff. They lived close by in the school house on the corner of Totara Rd. The first school committee had many battles in the first couple of years getting classrooms for the already burgeoning school, getting a pedestrian crossing outside the school and having a telephone installed. But from small things big things grow, and 50 years on Whenuapai School has grown and blossomed on those foundations laid in 1957. Whenuapai School is a state, co-educational full primary school with students from Year 0 (5 years of age) to Year 8 (12-13 years of age). Students leaving Whenuapai School at the end of Year 8 usually go to either Massey High School or Westlake Boys or Girls High School. Enrolment Zone Whenuapai School is required by the Ministry of Education to have an identified enrolment zone. The zone is: All of Herald Island and Whenuapai Village. Brighams Creek Road from Highway 16 to Kauri Road including Trig Road and side roads. Highway 16 from the Massey roundabout to the turn off to the Coatesville / Riverhead Highway. All children living in this zone have a right to attend our School. A bus service runs before and afterschool to Whenuapai Village and Herald Island. Depending on factors such as the school roll, out of zone enrolments may be considered. Phone 09 416 8779

THE WHENUAPAI BUS COMPANY

This company began its operations in the area north-west of Auckland city in March 1946, but its origins can be found in a series of events spread over the previous decade. In the 1930's Whenuapai and Hobsonville were largely farming areas, and transport was provided by a service car making one return trip per day between Helensville, about 25 km to the north, and Auckland. The timetable of this service was rather inconvenient for the farmers of the area. In 1935 the licence for the run was taken over by the Auckland Bus Company (ABC), a company well known in west Auckland for the sometimes eccentric behaviour of its proprietor, Mr Robert McCrae. The ABC service ran to the same inconvenient timetable as its predecessor, but in the late 1930's activity at the Hobsonville Air Base increased considerably, and the ABC instituted a service to and from Hobsonville. Because the large number of Air Force and Public Works employees in the area were given priority on the buses the settlers of the area derived little benefit from this service, even after the timetable was extended in 1940. Bus operations commenced on 11 March 1946, with immediate benefit to the residents of the district. Secondary school children, who had previously had to make their 11 mile way to Avondale as best they could, were now able to travel directly by bus, with a saving of at least an hour a day in travelling time. Workers travelling in to Auckland city made similar savings of time. Late in 1946 the company was offered 3 acres of land on the Main North Road (now SH 16) at Brigham's Creek.

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

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NEED BUILDING CONSENT?

Renovating the shower - generally, house maintenance work does not require a building consent. The Building Act 2004 also provides for a list of things for which a building consent is not required - including cluding replacing bathroom fixtures. However, the departmental guideline indicates a building consent is required when removing an existing shower tray and replacing it with a waterproof liner covered by tiles.

Work of this nature adds value to your house and will also help sell the house given that a bathroom zone, like a kitchen zone, is an essential working part and feature of almost any home. However, doing such work without a building consent becomes a risk if you sell because you, in a standard agreement, warrant that any work you carried out on the house was done in accordance with a building consent and that a code compliance certificate was issued.
