#### Greetings

It's not often I'll write about a rumour - but this one's pretty persistent.

I hear around the traps an inland port is supposedly planned in the Northwest near the northern railway line with possible access to roads such as Waitakere and Taupaki and perhaps even a link to the planned State Highway 16 bypass so that container trucks can more easily get to and from Auckland.

It makes sense, but I cannot find anyone to verify it for me. My contacts at Ports of Auckland, KiwiRail and even Parliament know nothing about it.

I've even been told the property owner(s) concerned have been give at least three years to continue using the land. Perhaps I'll start door knocking now that COVID-19 restrictions are easing.

The rumour has reached the ears of the Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association (KHRRA) which is concerned about the impact on local traffic - if it's all

Trouble is, it's a tricky one to verify and any property owner(s) involved would probably be sworn to secrecy.

Years ago, then Rodney Mayor John Law (2001 to 2007) talked about the potential for an inland port near Helensville.

Media reports in 2019 say an inland port was suggested in Northwest Auckland where freight could be marshalled, some taken by road to North Shore and West Auckland destinations

The final report of the Upper North Island Supply Chain Strategy Working Group in November 2019 included this recommendation: "5. The new two-port configuration should be supported by a rejuvenated North Auckland rail line and spur to Northport, and a new inland freight hub in northwest Auckland to complement and be connected to Metroport in the south."

It planned to provide more detailed costs and recommendations.

The study came after a NZ First suggestion prior to the last general election to move container operations from Ports of Auckland to Northport in Whangarei by 2027.

Budget 2020 provides more than \$1.2 billion for rail.

Significant investment from the Government's Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) is going into Northland rail, cutting the Auckland freight journey by about 1.5 hours and enabling hi-cube shipping containers to be carried.

### 'Hard slog' ahead for KHRRA

Projects to bring the Northwest on a more even footing with other parts of Auckland may be delayed or no longer proceed.

That's the view put to the Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association AGM by Rodney ward councillor Greg Sayers, Rodney Local Board chairman Phelan Pirrie



The warning comes as budgets face massive cuts in the wake of COVID-19, Greg pointing out the Auckland Council's 'Emergency Budget' has to account for a \$525 million revenue shortfall.

The council is cutting staff, will sell assets, and projects will be deferred, including road sealing, he says.

If a proposed 2.5% rates rise is introduced - rather than a suggested 3.5% - it would mean the average ratepayer contributing about \$70 more a year instead of \$95 and a halt to many works, Greg says.

"Even though those ratepayers are still paying rates and fuel taxes the budget for seal extensions is proposed to be reduced from \$7.35 million to \$1 million if there is a 3.5% rate increase. If there's an increase of 2.5%, or lower, the seal extension budget would be reduced to zero," Greg explains.

He and Phelan warn that public facilities like a toilet with a failing septic system at Puhoi and playgrounds needing repair may close, with even the planned Kumeu indoor sports centre at the Huapai Reserve likely to be delayed, although due for design work and more this year.

Some halls may not get improvements and the Kumeu Library with its leaky building problems may have to close if repairs are deferred and the matter causes a health and safety issue.

If playgrounds or paths fail there will be no contingency money available under a 2.5% increase so they would have to be closed for up to a year until money is available, Phelan says.

"This will be compounded the following year because there will be even more work backed after a year of inaction."

The Northwest had projects planned during the next few years to help to catch up with the rest of Auckland, Phelan says. Those are now unlikely to proceed in the coming year.

The "dire" news from the two local body representative led to several attendees calling for the council to "cut its cloth to fit", Greg saying there were some legal constraints but that councillors like himself had plumped for pay cuts around 20% while staff could also voluntarily cut their pay.

It was explained that the council was second behind Air New Zealand in job losses.

About 1100 council staff have already been laid off with further job cuts to come, while about 4000 have been put off at Air New . Zealand.

Roading projects are also expected to be affected.

Greg says Auckland Transport's budget has also taken a hammering, so the Northwest might not get much - "that's the reality we're

at a 3.5% rate increase, and it's unknown exactly what the impact will be in Rodney until the final budget is determined.

But it is expected to see reductions in renewals and major transport projects.

Some among the 20 people at the AGM heard that SH16 improvements such as Station Road works in relation to the Huapai Special Housing Area, and more at Access Road, are delayed unless the government funds them as "shovel ready" projects.

The "gyratory" extended roundabout for Station Rd was dropped last year for a simpler T-intersection with traffic lights.

Greg says people facing hardship following the pandemic can apply for rates relief.

Holly Southernwood wondered if the Helensville Christmas parade might be among events impacted, adding communities looked forward to such events.

She says ratepayers groups in her area are seeking to combine with others like the KHRRA to provide a stronger voice.

AGM host Tony Soljan says rate rises have been "exorbitant" in recent years and he is sceptical a 3.5% rise would end up as just that, saying it was more likely to be 7%.

Talk of the council borrowing more was dashed with comments that it had already blown its credit levels and that further debt would cost everyone more as it couldn't find the millions needed like central government can.

The meeting heard that times could be tough for the next two or

three years.

Even outgoing chairman Craig Walker, unable to attend the meeting after recovering from an operation, warned in a prepared speech of a "hard slog" ahead.

He says the Kumeu-Huapai area suffers badly in terms of planning and infrastructure, with many hoped for projects now unlikely to happen soon, stressing there's more need than ever for a strong association and a framework plan.

New chairman Guy Wishart agrees, adding many projects now appear to be on hold.

He wants to see the push for passenger trains and more buses for the area continue and the area developed appropriately while maintaining its history, heritage and land use such as vineyards.

Green belts and other areas need to be retained and enhanced to keep a separation from Auckland's sprawl - "or we will end up like Lincoln Road".

Guy is keen to see community projects and events reinvigorated, the framework plan's development continue and more.

He's passionate about the area and wants to increase engagement between the KHRRA and the community.

"With so many major changes occurring and planned for the area, it is critical that our collective voices are heard loud and clear."

From Tauranga originally, Guy's parents were both doctors and he was among six children. He holds a horticultural science degree and has managed orchards in the Franklin region, also consulting



to growers there.

He and wife Michelle have lived in England, India and Thailand.

Guy maintains a keen interest in music and songwriting and has won several national awards for his music, including the APRA Silver Scroll and a Tui for Best Folk Album in 2017.

The couple established Kumeu Live four years ago as an original live music venue for songwriters and musicians at the Kumeu Arts Centre, featuring performances from local and international artists.

They have a daughter and have lived in Kumeu for seven years, Guy retraining as a high school teacher in biological science some years

His association chairmanship is endorsed by Craig Walker who also thanked committee members, especially secretary Mark Hall who didn't seek re-election as he's pursuing other interests.

Pete Sinton was elected deputy chairman and Lizelle Westman is secretary.

#### Matua Ngaru School a year plus on

Huapai's new school has more than doubled its students ("learners") and staff in the months nearly since 15 opening.

Matua Ngaru School opened on February 7, 2019 with 118 learners and 11 staff and has since grown to 270 learners and 24 staff.



There are now three kainga (flexible learning spaces) open that operate in mixed year level groups with the fourth expected to be in operation next year due to rapid roll growth.

The existing build can accommodate up to 560 learners and there are plans for a future Stage 2 which will bring the school's capacity to more than 700 at its three-hectare site in Gilbransen Road.

It will have a roll of well over 300 by the end of 2020, the school's second year of operation.

During the first year, the school had many successes and challenges, Principal Diana Wilkes says.

Matua Ngaru School developed its local curriculum which also involved a hikoi of the local area with iwi from Reweti Marae in Waimauku, grew a "Kahui Values" programme as part of the Ministry

of Education's Positive Behaviour for Learning Contract, participated in numerous Northwest sporting competitions, had a wonderful display for the North West Art Exhibition, became a member of the Whiria Te Tangata Kahui Ako, led a number of powhiri with guidance from Ngati Whatua o Kaipara, hosted the Education Review Office for its first review and established an effective Parent Teacher Association called 'Friends of Matua Ngaru'.

The school also inducted its first parent elected Board of Trustees, hosted numerous visitors, became a Silver Travelwise school, held an epic end of year Celebration of Learning event and graduated nine year 8 learners who went on to Massey High School, Kaipara College and Westlake Boys High School.

However, the biggest event for the school was the tragic loss of its beloved Javier, who died suddenly, aged 10 in July 2019. Javier will always be a part of Matua Ngaru - a special memorial garden was created for him with harakeke donated by the iwi and a memorial

The school also has an annual Kindness award in Javier's name which is to be given annually to a Year 5 learner who exemplifies kindness - which will be presented by his brother Gab (2019 alumni) and his mother Leann.

The Matua Ngaru School team continues to work collaboratively to facilitate learning through workshops, projects and teaching and learning through play.

An example of its curriculum in action occurred when all of the learners in Years 4-8 pitched, hired and created a business that would make a product that could be sold at a market day.

This was learner agency in action using the Research Process and Design Thinking. All of the learners worked collaboratively to innovate a product - beeswax wrapping, facial scrubs, skateboard decals, clay pots, baking, soap, candles and more.

It was a great fundraiser for the school and an opportunity to connect with the community, Diana says.

The school is constantly putting its vision 'Ubiquitous learning, on a wave of change' to the test.

This was especially true during COVID-19 Alert Level 4. The team developed an approach to distance learning 'ULP- Ubiquitous Learning Plan' that involved the use of multiple communication platforms in a responsive manner.

The team worked collaboratively to design and facilitate the



programme and experienced high engagement from learners and their families.

There are aspects of the ULP that were so successful the team has continued to use some of them for face-to-face learning lower alert levels

The unique challenges that the lockdown presented united the team and the community and the school is grateful for the outstanding support it continues to receive from its engaged parent community.

Matua Ngaru is a school for the community and local residents are invited to use the grounds on weekends and after school, including a basketball court, field and playground.

The school hall 'Whare Tapere' is available for long-term hire.

### Northwest speed limits drop

If you think some of the Northwest's back roads are slow, then be prepared for even lower speed limits.

Road speed limits drop by around 10-20kmh and even more around the area from June 30 this year.

More than 600 roads across Auckland are affected by the

new speed limits introduced by Auckland Transport (AT) as part of its Safe Speeds programme which includes some roads in the Rodney Local Board area.

AT says it's reducing speeds on selected road stretches to help bring down deaths and serious injuries to zero on Auckland's road network by 2050.

In 2018, 54 people died on Auckland roads and an additional 595 were seriously injured. In each of these crashes, speed determined the seriousness of the injury, AT says.

AT adds that speed management is one thing it is doing among a range of road safety improvements through to 2028.

"Setting safe and appropriate speed limits is one of the fastest and most cost-effective way to save lives while AT works on other improvements for the road network," the authority says.

"Roads in Auckland's rural areas are tricky to navigate - even for experienced drivers. With several sharp bends, narrow high-speed lanes and low visibility, a simple mistake can lead to devastating consequences. In Rodney, between 2014 and 2018, there were 108

road deaths or serious injuries."

AT wants to make Auckland's roads safe for everyone - whether that's people walking and cycling, kids outside schools, senior citizens or people driving, AT executive general manager of safety Bryan Sherritt says.

"We are guided by the Vision Zero approach to transport safety, which priorities human safety over other measures like minor time savings.

"Setting safe and survivable speeds for our road network is the quickest and most cost-effective way to immediately reduce death and serious injury," he says.

Road speed limit changes in the Northwest include: Taupaki, Waitakere, Koraha and Oaia Roads (60kmh from 70kmh); Coatesville-Riverhead Highway, Oraha Road, Timber Place, Iona Avenue, Sawmill Road Lathrope Road (60kmh from 80kmh); Ararimu Valley, Waikoukou Valley, Peak, Inland, Pinetone, Mill Flat, Waka and Zanders Roads (80kmh from 100kmh); Forestry and Ridge roads (60kmh from 100kmh), Nobilo Road (50kmh from 80kmh), Tasman View Road (50kmh from 70kmh), Constable Road (40kmh from 100kmh), and Barrett and Beacon Roads (40kmh from 80kmh)

Station Road's 80kmh section drops to 50kmh to match the rest of the road, which is also done on some others to even out speed limits.

Roads like Mill Flat Road have sections of road reduced further, such as its 100kmh to 40kmh drop at the Rangitopuni and northern end

Much of Coatesville has speed limits reduced from 100kmh to 80kmh or 80kmh to 60kmh.

AT says most of the roads it is dropping speeds on (about 90%) are rural roads.

Roads selected for change are either high-risk or close to high-risk roads, have high crash rates on them or nearby, have unsuitable speed limits (winding, hilly, no median strip, unsegregated lanes or unsuited to the road layout), AT adds.

"We are introducing safe and appropriate speeds across areas rather than individual roads."

Most Auckland City centre speed limits drop from 50kmh to 30kmh. However, Nelson, Hobson and Fanshawe Streets will each have a new speed limit of 40kmh - down from 50kmh. Some shared streets like Federal Street will continue to have a 10kmh speed limit.

AT encourages everyone driving to be aware of the new and lower speed limits on some of the roads they may travel on and asks people to drive within these new limits.

"We can all make some minor changes while we drive - so that one by one we can all help save lives and keep everyone safe... because everyone deserves to get home safely," Bryan says.

- Don't drink and fry. Alcohol is involved in half of all fatal fires. Instead, pre-prepare a meal, get takeaways, or use the microwave. Never attempt to drink alcohol or take medication that makes you sleepy when cooking.
- Don't leave the room when cooking. If you have to, always turn off the stove first. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of house fires in New Zealand.
- Keep curtains, tea towels, oven mitts and any flammable items well away from the cooking area when you're cooking.

Keeping a clean and safe kitchen

• Clean your stovetop after each use. This

prevents spilled fats and burnt foods from building up.

- Clean rangehood filters regularly.
- Keep a fire extinguisher and a fire blanket somewhere in your kitchen. Make sure you know how to use them.

#### Why not consider arbitration

Arbitration is a process where parties in a dispute agree to somebody being appointed by them to determine their dispute.

There are various benefits which an arbitration offers which court litigation does not. These include being able to choose the arbitrator, privacy and confidentiality of the proceedings, the fact that the proceedings are finalised in a much quicker timeframe and the ability to agree that any finding by the arbitrator is final and binding as if made by a High Court judge.

Property market report

Housing confidence was knocked backed substantially in the three months to June. It seems the economic fallout from COVID-19 has dashed expectations of the big housing upswing moving on through 2020. Confidence is low and this is certainly dampening demand in high value housing stock.

House buying sentiment also continues to stutter however sales in the sub \$1m category is still running buoyant and prices holding. Perceptions of whether it's a good time to buy are generally closely linked to housing affordability and banks are taking three to four weeks to process applications and being over opinionated about risk profiles.

Household interest rate expectations are that interest rates will fall and House prices will be volatile. We have an unprecedented situation facing the NZ economy and Reserve Bank. The Bank's key policy rate (wholesale money rate) has been lowered as far as it can go and government bond purchases are now the Reserve Bank's weapon of choice. We expect the Reserve Bank's policy rate to remain at 0.25% for many years although banks will continue to stress test their clients to as much as 7.9% based on mortgage approvals.

Our suggestion to struggling home owners remains the same, squeeze your bank but get your assets ready. If you need to create cash-flow, make decisions early. With an election and the potential for more economic outfall you are best to act sooner than later, lead

the conversation and stay positive. Let's look at the sales results:

in the event of our demise to family and loved ones as well as who will care for our children. Many issues can come into play including de facto relationships, blended families and family disagreements. Good practical legal advice can help you strategise to ensure your wishes are carried out (and by whom).

If you do not have a will then the Administration Act 1969 will determine where your assets will go. This may not be what you intended and requires additional steps to administer your estate resulting in delays and additional costs in distributing your assets, as well as distress for family members. Also, without a will you have not specified who will receive particular items, for example jewellery or tools or whom is appointed for guardianship.

#### **Quinovic Property Management**

The date for Healthy Homes compliance reporting on rental properties has been postponed due to the Covid -19 lockdown affecting landlords' ability getting access to have properties inspected

1st July 2020 was to be the date that landlords had to provide a comprehensive report with any new tenancy agreements or fixed term renewals this date has been postponed to the 1st December 2020.

The Healthy Homes Standard is a collection of performance standards that rental properties will need to meet in order to be able to tenant them, the standard encompasses 5 categories; Draught stopping, Heating, Insulation, Moisture ingress and Drainage and Ventilation.

Landlords are required to provide a detailed report that shows how the rental property complies against the standard with any new tenancy or renewal commencing from the 1st December 2020

Rental properties are then expected to fully comply with the standard with any new tenancy or renewal after 1st July 2021 with a 90 day grace period, if a tenancy does not roll over then the 1st of July 2024 is the ultimate date for compliance

Detail of the actual criteria can be found on the Tenancy Services website if you Google Healthy Homes standard, there are PDFs that can be downloaded from the Government website as well as an online calculator required for the heating criteria which is certainly the most complicated aspect of the whole standard.

The general best practice is to engage an independent inspection company to provide a detailed report, this should cost about \$200-\$300, and some suppliers are offering free reports however an obvious concern is that a conflict of interest could lead to over prescribing of remediation. Landlords can self-report but there is the equally obvious concern of a landlord being overly pragmatic in the assessment of the property and a maximum penalty of \$4000 in exemplary damages could be incurred if challenged at tenancy tribunal.

One piece of good news for landlords is that the IRD are allowing discretionary expenditure up to \$5000 to be claimed as a write off for the current tax year only (another Covid-19 measure) this means that Landlords investing in up to \$5000 on property improvements this year will get the same tax treatment as generally applied to repairs and maintenance as opposed to having to claim it as depreciation, Of course you should check this with your own tax accountant first.





#### **Growing citrus trees**

No orchard is complete without some citrus trees growing. Awa Nursery recognises this, and we have just received our new season stock, newly bagged up and ready to go into your gardens. If you are after a mature readymade fruit tree, we have those in stock as well.







Our citrus have just been wrenched, which is a process where the roots are cut without lifting the plant, then uplifted and bagged up. You will find the soil is loose in the bags and the root ball quite small. This is normal, and your plant will thrive provided it is planted in good free draining soil.

Dig a hole approximately twice the depth and width of the bag and partly fill with garden mix. Place your tree in the hole and fill the remaining hole with soil. Make sure your soil is no higher than where the soil came to when it was in the bag. Stake the tree until it is established. Be sure to water your tree if there has been no rain every three days or so until established. Mulching the area around your citrus tree is a good idea also. Again, keep the mulch away from the trunk.

Citrus trees like to be fertilised regularly especially in spring and summer to encourage maximum fruiting and flowering. Awa Nursery has a fertiliser specifically catered to citrus should you require a bag. Phone Awa Nursery: 09 411 8712, email info@awanursery.co.nz or visit www.awanursery.co.nz.



Plant hardy winter veggies like kale and radishes and get summer flowering bulbs sorted.

#### Fix the lawns

Lawns that look unhealthy (yellow, sparse growth) can be given a pep up with Prolawn Garden Supreme which is a quick-acting fertiliser ideal for a late winter boost.

This fertiliser is good around the garden too.



#### In the Edible Garden

- Place seed potatoes in dry cool areas garage, carport, under eaves, to begin sprouting. Planting is generally 6-8 weeks from now
- Make sure broad bean plants are well staked
- Planting of kale, cold hardy lettuces such as cos and sowing of radishes and carrot seed can be done in sunny areas
- Stick to liquid fertiliser over the foliage and into the roots of vegetables, as it can be used more quickly and effectively during the cold season



Sharpen secateurs and loppers for fruit tree pruning and copper spray your trees to help smother the fungal spores and bacteria that cause diseases like leaf curl, bacterial blast and leaf spot.

#### The rest of the Garden

- Time to buy dahlia, gladioli, and lily bulbs when planning for bold colour in the summer garden. Lilies are excellent in pots, but choose dwarf varieties that are more compact
- Prune roses and hydrangeas, removing any dead or old wood. A copper and oil spray over pruned roses provides early resistance to disease and disrupts any scale forming on the canes
- Plants damaged by frost: the burnt leaves should be left on the plant, to protect healthy growth beneath.
   The leaves can then be removed in early spring



#### Dealing with heavy clay soils

When planting add a handful of gypsum in the planting hole before filling with a mix of existing soil and Garden Mix.





### Mouse and rat poisons: The risk to your pets

At this time of the year rats and mice come sneaking into the house to avoid the cold and look for easy pickings. There are just a few things to know before you reach for the rat hait

Poisoning from rodenticides are one of the most common types of poison cases seen



Ensure they are put away in secure cupboards, remember that cats can climb and even if they don't eat the poison they could knock it off the shelf where it could be made available to the less discerning pet (or child). When placing the bait ensure it is placed in a secure

careful with the use and application of the poisons.

container that only rats and mice can get into.

The identification of what your pet may have eaten is paramount to enable the vet to treat your pet correctly. Take the container, packet, bottle with you so that they can identify the poison and treat accordingly.

Remember that our pets can also be poisoned by eating a rat or mouse that has ingested poison. So watch for symptoms and if you have any concerns take your animal straight to the vet.

Symptoms differ depending on the type of poison, the amount ingested, the size, age and health of your pet. Many poisons have an anticoagulant that prevents the blood from clotting, causing hemorrhaging and death. Signs can appear over a period of up to 4 days after ingestion. It may be seen as breathing difficulty, seizures,

diarrhoea, vomiting, fever, blood in urine, faeces, very pale gums, vomiting and more.

The new baits that are available can stay for up to 4 weeks in the animal's system. They can be treated with an antidote, vitamin K, blood transfusions but unfortunately this may not work.

You will be surprised at the number of everyday household items we are keeping in our home that are poisonous to our animals.



#### Theft of sight

Glaucoma NZ are asking Kiwis to have their eyes examined, saying that 50% of people with glaucoma don't know they have it.

This "sneak thief of sight' starts in your side-vision and initially may go unnoticed. The cause is not related to ill-health; it's a physiological accident. Your eye is inflated with gel/fluid to keep its shape, and correct eye pressure gradually creeps up if vital tiny drainage-valves block up or collapse. High pressure causes nerve damage which can't be reversed, and



while treatment to restore normal pressure will prevent further loss from occurring, it must be started early to save sight.

For Eyes in the Kumeu Village have excellent equipment to test for glaucoma and can even monitor the nerve layers in your retina. So take Glaucoma NZ's advice and book an examination with Matthew or Molly Whittington to keep this 'sneak thief' away from your sight! Phone 09 412 8172.

# Why shouldn't I sleep on my back when I am pregnant?

From about 16 weeks the size of the baby and reorganisation of your organs creates increased pressure on your blood vessels (specifically the inferior vena cava and the aorta) when you lie on your back.



This extra pressure may impact the blood supply to your heart

and may limit blood supply to your placenta. When this decreased blood flow occurs it is called Aortocaval Compression Syndrome (ACS). Symptoms of ACS include initial racing heart followed by a slow heart, pallor, nausea, dizziness, low blood pressure, and sweating. Every pregnant woman is different so some woman will not experience symptoms of ACS where others may experience extreme room spinning/dizziness within a few seconds of being on their back.

Whether or not you experience symptoms of ACS it is wise to avoid




lying on your back past 20 weeks in your pregnancy. You may not be able to feel symptoms of decreased blood flow to your placenta, but your baby will.

If you wake up in the night and you are on your back, don't panic, just roll on to your side, problem solved, easy. Don't beat yourself up about it, these things happen occasionally. If you are struggling with being comfortable on your side then put a pillow between your knees and behind you to prevent you rolling in your sleep. If you are still struggling getting comfortable after trying the pillow trick then give me a yell, I am here to help. ### Mental resilience: The role of nutrition

No one is exempt from stresses and mood fluctuations. But if we have mental resilience, then those stresses and fluctuations do not need to "sink our boat". I like the concept of resilience more than mental "health" which implies that if we are not feeling 100% then there is something wrong with us: we have a disease. Recently, DSM-V classified grieving after the death of a loved one as a disease if it lasted more than 2 months. Grief is a natural response to loss. Resilience on the other hand is successfully riding out the waves of good times and not so good times, and being okay with that.

Proven strategies to improve mental resilience include meditation,

exercise and nutrition. The core of nutrition is a good diet. However, in times of stress we often need a little more nutrient support. My favourite supportive nutrients are listed below.

Magnesium - Magnesium would be number one on my list of nutrients to support mental resilience. Magnesium improves neuronal plasticity (the ability of the brain to grow and adapt), modulates the synthesis and release of most brain chemicals (neurotransmitters), and protects against traumatic brain injury.

What many people find is that using a good form of magnesium decreases headaches, makes stressful situations more manageable, improves sleep, and memory.

Fish Oils - Taking fish oils improves the balance of good versus bad fats. A modern diet is very high in inflammatory fats, so most of us would benefit from a rebalance. Supplementing with fish oils may be beneficial in several brain conditions including depression, anxiety, epilepsy, brain injuries, migraine, Parkinson's disease, schizophrenia and Attention Deficit Disorder. They are pretty important for your heart and joints too.

Et al - There are many other nutrients that can support you in your quest for mental resilience. B vitamins, levocarnitine, theanine, SAMe, tyrosine, tryptophan, turmeric, zinc and copper would all have their place in helping to keep you in control. Everyone is different. # Not just athletes get Achilles tendon pain

The Achilles tendon is one of the strongest tendons in the human body. It attaches the calf muscles to the heel bone of the foot, helping you to run fast, jump high, and change direction quickly




But while many think it's only

elite athletes who suffer from Achilles tendon issues, a fifth of the over-50 population actually suffers from Achilles tendinopathy (pain). And while very few of these will be ruptures, the pain can be frustratingly persistent and limit our ability to exercise and enjoy life.

Research has found a painful tendon is not like a torn rope at all. It's more like doughnuts stacked on top of each other. Even though changes in tendon structure are seen as a "hole" in the middle of the tendon, there is still a lot of delicious doughnut (in other words healthy tendon) surrounding the damaged area.

The tendon adapts by getting thicker, making it stronger and allowing you to exercise.

Critically, pain poorly reflects damage. Tendon pain is not present



because the tendon is damaged, weak or hanging on by a thread. Most people who experience this type of pain are aged 40-64 years.

That's because the Achilles tendon bears the brunt of the load

throughout life. Being overweight, having diabetes, and high cholesterol all increase the risk of developing Achilles tendon pain.

The good news is that painful Achilles tendons rarely rupture. Some 80-90% of people who rupture their tendon have never had Achilles tendon pain. Your brain is clever as it uses pain to protect your Achilles tendon by changing your behaviour. But it's easy to become overprotective.

Completely resting the tendon, either by using crutches or a walking boot, is one thing that should be avoided. This is because of the "use it or lose it" principle. With even two weeks' rest, your tendon and calf muscles become weaker, meaning a longer recovery time.

Just like muscles, tendons get stronger with exercise. Starting exercise that produces no or minimal pain and progressively increasing the intensity of exercise is by far the best option, based on research.

Your physio should be able to guide you through a graduated pain free exercise programme.

# Have you tried the "anti-fragile matrix"?

Movement is the currency of health. In order to function well, we need to move our bodies. Since we are often 'time poor' anything we can do to add some movement into our day is going to beneficial. This is what the "anti-fragile matrix" does, it gets lots of movement into your body in a short space of time. Here is how to do it.

- 1. Lay onto the ground on your stomach, stand back up
- 2. Lay onto your back, stand back up

- 3. Lay onto your left side, stand back up
- 4. Lay onto your right side, stand back up
- 5. Do a 4 second plank

# Shoe Talk's guide to foot problems

Shoe Talk's guide to foot problems that can be caused through wearing tight footwear.

You know the feeling, you are in the store, you try on the footwear and your feet start going numb, or there are bits that hurt, the shoes feel tight. However you think that the



shoes will "stretch" to fit. Leather footwear does stretch in width however it is normally only 2-3 mm not cm.

Damage to the feet can be permanent through wearing shoes that are too tight:

- Bunions A bunion is caused when pressure is placed on the toe area through there not being enough toe room, it causes the toe to go sideways towards the second toe and pushes the ball joint out of line. Some people also experience pain. The only fix if they get bad enough is surgery.
- If your toes are crushed in your shoes with no room to wiggle then you can also cause friction which can also result in corns.
- Hammer Toes I see this one more in the ladies and it is usually caused through wearing high heels that are too tight in the toe box area, instead of the toes lying flat they will end up curling and one will curl over the toe of the other. Again this damage is not something that can be fixed without surgery or using aids to hold the toe in place.
- Ingrown toenails due to shoes not having a roomy enough toe box the shoe pushes against the toenail which causes it to grow inward into the skin = painful'

• Finally pressure points can also cause nerve damage which is normally referred to as a neuroma which is when you get a benign growth of nerve tissue along a nerve pathway that causes pain and often a burning sensation

So if the shoes hurt, feel too tight or just not "right" when you try them on, look for wider fitting ones, or ones with a rounded or more square toe.

#### Osteoarthritis of the Foot

What is osteoarthritis? Osteoarthritis (OA) is the most common form of arthritis. OA is caused by the degeneration of articular cartilage and synovium. Articular cartilage is a spongy substance which covers the ends of the bones and aids in shock absorption and bone movement. The synovium is a slippery substance which helps lubricate the joint and reduce friction. As the articular cartilage and synovium wear away, the jagged and rough and the protective space between the bones narrows. This results in bone rubbing on bone, and produces



osteophytes (bone spurs). Your foot is composed of 28 bones and 33 joints. The joint most commonly affected foot joint is the 'big toe joint'. Other joints which can be affected by OA include the midfoot, ankle joint and knee joint.

What are my treatment options for OA in my foot?

There are many treatment options available to slow the progression of OA, prevent OA and relieve pain and symptoms.

Correctly Fitted Footwear will help to reduce the amount of load through the affected joint therefore alleviating the pain and symptoms of OA. The right shoe will also help alleviate rubbing and friction against any bony prominences.

Orthotics can help provide cushioning and support to the joints affected by OA. Orthotics help to redistribute pressure away from the affected joints and provide relief from painful joints.

Foot Mobilisation Therapy is a hands-on manual therapy which aids in reducing connective tissue restrictions, enhancing flexibility and restoring function to stiff joints affected by OA. Releasing these restrictions restores joint function, improves range of motion and quality of movement through the joints. Keeping your joints flexible and mobile can help slow the onset of OA.

Low impact exercise can help reduce the amount of stress on the joints of your feet. Exercise such as; swimming, water aerobics, cycling tai chi and yoga are all examples of low impact activities.



### Which is the best pillow?

People often ask what would be the best pillow for them to sleep on. There are so many options on the market no wonder one can get confused. There no single answer unfortunately. People have different mobility in their neck, different sizes of their shoulders, different hardness of their mattresses...We usually



recommend getting medium size feather down pillow and see if it works for them. For the majority of people it will be comfortable. If the feather down pillow is uncomfortable, then it is worth trying memory foam pillow, shaped pillow or even a buckwheat pillow. Sometimes the body needs about a week to adjust to the new



pillow, so don't give up after the first night.



a man named Tyler of HydroVac was working during stormwater renewal activity at the SH1 Wilks Road South Pond. Tyler came across, much to his surprise, a turtle that had made the motorway pond its happy home. Knowing that the pond was not going to be a



safe habitat during the renewal works, Tyler recovered the turtle and promptly contacted his manager Mike, who in turn notified ASM Stormwater Asset Manager Peter, of their find, and to enquire "what shall we do with it"?

Mike thought, I'll take him home. His wife Nikki and their 3 boys housed the turtle in their bathtub for the night, and then asked Country Bears if he could have a new home here. The children have been thinking of new name for their new turtle and after a diverse range of choices, deliberation and a vote, the motorway turtle is now called "Covi".

#### Phelan's Local Board Update

Progress on one of our area's most needed transport improvements.

Plans for an alternative state highway to SH16 between Brigham Creek Road and Waimauku are progressing with a preferred route expected to be confirmed to property owners around the middle of next year.

Property owners were told last year that they were in a 'study area' for the proposed new state highway. The study area is much wider than the land that will be required for this new transport route.

The Supporting Growth Programme team, who are leading this planning work on behalf of Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency and Auckland Transport, have sent letter to the property owners contacted last year to update them on progress and timeframes for what happens next.

The team have told me they're currently refining the route and will ask to meet late this year with property owners still affected once the refinements are done. They then expect to be able to confirm that route in mid-2021.

The next step will be for the route to be finalised by a designation process, which could take two further years.

The alternative state highway is set down to be built in line with the anticipated rezoning and land release timeframes of the wider Kumeu-Huapai areas later this decade.

As well as improving congestion and travel times, the alternative state highway means the existing SH16 through Kumeu-Huapai will become a really important part of those revitalised town centres, with much-reduced through traffic.

The Supporting Growth team is also progressing the planning for a network of new and upgraded public transport connections, walking and cycling paths and roads for the north west in the long term, and will be talking to communities as these progress.

Challenging Few Years Ahead with Council's Emergency Budget.

Councillors will shortly be making a decision on the levels of rate increase (3.5% or 2.5%) and wrestling with the implications of a predicted \$500m fall in revenue on the coming years budget. What is not widely known is that property rates only provide 40% of Auckland Council's income. With the sharp drop in revenue from fees and charges, dividend payments from shares Council owns in Auckland Airport and Ports of Auckland, there is now not enough



money to fulfil all the previously proposed budget spending. Increased borrowing is not possible as it would inevitably lead to a lowering of Council's international credit rating and push up the interest rate paid to borrow money that would mean more income would be diverted to repayments at a time when that income has fallen.

Council has moved swiftly to reduce spending shedding 1100 staff in the last few months making it second only to Air NZ in terms of job losses. More of this and budget cuts will follow.

At a local level we are still working through what this will mean but it is going to see projects delayed for a year or longer.

Having spent the last six years battling for infrastructure to meet growth and parity of services with the rest of Auckland this is a frustrating time. The next three years were going to finally see the delivery of some larger projects and these may now be delayed or cut depending on how large the cuts are. Progress on some local projects is contingent on the Government stepping up with 'shovel ready project' funding which will plug the yawning hole in Council's budget.

Credits have been difficult to use to receive a similar value to the flight originally purchased. Customer loyalty has taken a hit by not being customer obsessed.

It is not only customer facing staff who need to be customer obsessed, it needs to run right through the business. Ask yourself for example:

- Do my products/services truly add value or solve a problem for my customer?
- Do my products/services meet the social, ethical and environmental standards my customers want?

- How easy is it for customers to find information on my products/ services?
- How easy is it for customers to buy my products/services?
- How easy is it for customer to pay for my products/services?
- How easy is it for customers to get a problem fixed if something goes wrong?
- Am I continuing to innovate to find ways to delight my customers?

Without customers you do not have a business. By putting customers first you are driving value into your business, and ensuring that your customer base continues grows with minimal churn.

# Four reasons to try an outboard hydrofoil

More stern lift, improved stability, handling and fuel efficiency sounds amazing right? It is, and outboard hydrofoils like Permatrim can deliver that on the right boat and motor set-up.

Hydrofoils are the plates that bolt on your outboard cavitation plate, which increase the surface area of the plate. They work by lifting the boat out of the water as the boat gathers speed, creating less drag. This helps to increase acceleration, giving you more power and reduced strain on the engine. The faster you go the more lift the hydrofoil gives.


A correctly fitted foil has numerous benefits like the ability to plane at lower speeds and increased trim control, which is especially important as sea conditions change. Plus, they can stop a boat porpoising – i.e. bouncing up and down at high speeds.

While they don't look particularly impressive, they can have a big impact on boat performance.

So how do they work? This basically boils down to fluid dynamics - water moves faster over the top of the plate than the bottom creating a drop in pressure below the foil, which gives it lift.

To help determine if a hydrofoil will help, we'll ask the following four questions: Is your boat lazy to get on the plane? Does your boat porpoise? Have you noticed your boat tends to fall off the plane at low speed when conditions are rough? Is your boat stern heavy?

If any of this applies to you, chances are a hydrofoil will significantly help. However, bear in mind that they affect every boat and motor differently and it's not a one-size-fits-all fix. The only way to know for





sure is to trial it. When sea-trialing always make sure you do this with the load and crew you're likely to take the majority of the time as this can have an impact too.

Also, the smaller the boat the more significant the effect of the hydrofoil is. They cost approximately \$38-\$200+ depending on the size and type. However, you're likely save money on fuel and wear and tear on the boat anyway. And it's a small price to pay for more enjoyable boating.

#### Sayers Says It

By Councillor Greg Sayers, Rodney ward. There is strong disgruntlement from our local community about Auckland Transport's announcement this month that the Coatesville Riverhead Highway is to have its speed limit reduced from 80km/h down to 60 km/h. The justification from Auckland Transport is this will reduce the deaths and serous injuries which occur along the road. This is a policy being driven by central government which Councils are having to implement.

This disgruntlement is largely around the reduction being considered as excessive and that travelling at 60km/h will create its own safety issues through frustrated drivers taking risks and making reckless decisions.

People feel they have not been listened to when Auckland asked for public feedback on its proposal to change the speed limit. This has added to people's discontent.

When Peak Road is to have a speed limit of 80km/h and the Coatesville Riverhead Highway is to have a speed limit of 60km/h the logic becomes confusing. The Coatesville Riverhead Highway is a much better road.

Friends in Riverhead tell me they are so annoyed that they plan to sell their homes. Putting up with the fiasco of the traffic jams on SH16 is hard enough to live with, but adding a 60km/h speed limit on the Coatesville Riverhead Highway is too much for them to bear.

Auckland Transport says the decision has been made and they intend to go ahead and make the speed limit changes regardless. They advise that no changes to their decision would be possible without following bylaw change procedures. The only way to review their decision would be when a second set of roads elsewhere in Auckland go out for public feedback about having their speed limits also reduced that the Coatesville Riverhead Highway is included. This is planned to occur 30 November. Furthermore, the Auckland Transport Board of Directors would have to give specific permission for the Coatesville Riverhead Highway to be re-included in such a

consultation process.

With other roads across Rodney the feedback about speed reductions has been generally extremely well received. However, I am hearing enough incensed outrage to fight to have a second review done of this particular road.

Thus, I have written to the Chair and Chief Executive of Auckland Transport formally requesting the decision around Coatesville Riverhead Highway be reviewed. In addition, there needs to public support behind having the review done, so I have started an online petition. Please Google the "Petition against 60km/h on Coatesville Riverhead Highway" to register your support or nonsupport.

Perhaps a 70km/h speed limit could be an acceptable compromise. Saving lives and people from serious injury should always be of top importance.

If the Coatesville Riverhead Highway speed limit was reserved, this would mean safety features along the road would also have to have money spent on them and be upgraded.

#### **Comings and Goings**

It's that time again! With an election now just around the corner, you'll be hearing from politicians of all stripes about why you should vote for them and their party!

Rather than get into predictable partisan politics, though, in this column I thought I'd take the chance to explain what's happening with the boundaries and name of the Helensville electorate.



The background is that following each national census, a review is conducted of electorate boundaries to ensure that each has a roughly equal number of eligible voters. Given the constant shifting of populations due to internal migration, overseas arrivals and new residential developments, considerable changes can occur.

We've been advised that the Helensville electorate will be changed in a few key ways, including that the area will no longer include the Waitakere Ranges, including various west coast beaches, and much of Coatesville, Dairy Flat and surrounding areas.

On the other hand, the electorate will gain territory in the vicinity of Massey at the West Auckland end and also large areas to the north, such as the townships of Wellsford, Warkworth and Matakana.

Many of the issues of Auckland's rural north are similar to those currently on my radar, just with different projects needing to be completed (or started, in some cases!) in different areas.

It's also worth knowing that the name of this electorate will change, from Helensville to "Kaipara Ki Mahurangi". It's a long name, which I suspect will commonly be abbreviated to "Kaipara" or "KKM", but simply means the land mass between the Kaipara Harbour and Mahurangi coast.

All these changes will apply for the upcoming 2020 election and beyond (at least until they change again!) but for now I remain, with a mixture of pride and humility, your local Member of Parliament for this Helensville electorate.

Recently in my capacity as a Health and Safety Consultant I have had to deal with another unseen enemy, electricity.

Like Covid 19 it can be deadly.

The first encounter was in a fish 'n' chip shop and a lead trailed across a wet floor to a machine. The lead became a trip hazard and could potentially cause an electric shock.

The second was a worker had an electric shock whereby they drilled into a concrete wall and you could tell that the wall had electrical cables hidden in the wall.

The wall was at a commercial site and no plans were drawn up for the job even though the risk was known. The plans would be called a JSA or Task analysis.

While electricians and plumbers and other tradies drill holes in walls





every day, they run the risk of an electric shock as well and simple steps can be taken to avoid a shock. Having a plan is one and the second is isolating the power to the wall is possible as well in order to avoid an electric shock which can be fatal. It may be inconvenient at the time, but mistakes happen and it is better to plan to turn the power off to an area that being badly burned or killed.
