STAY WARM IN WINTER

As energy bills rise, we suggest you don't have to spend more on electric heating to stay warm this winter. Here are some tips that may help. Wear several thin layers, rather than one thick layer. This is because they trap warm air close to the body Go for clothes made from wool, cotton or fleecy fabrics, if possible draw your curtains, as soon as it gets dark to stop the heat escaping and the draughts coming in keep any windows and internal doors closed when it's cold - this will keep heat inside, where you most need it A lot of heat is lost through the head and neck, so if you're chilly indoors, try wearing a hat and scarf Your body keeps warm by burning food you've eaten, so make sure you have regular hot meals that contain carbs, such as potatoes, pasta, bread and rice.

Try porridge with hot milk for breakfast and soups and stews for lunch and dinner. If you're sitting down, a shawl or blanket will provide extra warmth. You should also try to keep your feet up, because air is cooler at ground level.

Wear warm clothes in bed. When it's really cold, wear thermal underwear, bed socks and even a hat. It is not hard to keep warm but you need to plan what to do and how to do it.

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SAFER COMMUNITIES

Kumeu currently has a number of scrap metal traders travelling door to door and Police are fielding numerous calls from residents concerned about the safety of themselves and their property. This is due to the operating procedures adopted by some of these traders who will only continue to operate as long as there is a current market for them within our community.

While it is up to you should you wish to deal with them, Police advice is that if you have scrap metal to dispose of you should find a reputable dealer from the Yellow Pages who will arrange a suitable time to uplift from your location. Should you be visited by any scrap traders who appear suspicious or intimidating obtain as many details as you can, i.e. Registration plate, business name, phone numbers etc. As a rule of thumb if they do not wish to give them to you then we recommend you ask them to leave, then promptly call the Police who can then investigate their legitimacy.

Fire Brigades throughout the Auckland Region have very busy dealing with outdoor fires that have been causing smoke nuisance or inappropriately placed. The following activities are allowed in an open fire season:

- fires for cooking bbqs, hangis and umus
- small heating fires outdoor fireplaces and braziers

• burning dry untreated wood, paper or well-seasoned vegetation, burning of up to 1.5 tonnes per day of dead on-farm animal stock

Fires should only take place in suitable weather conditions e.g. low wind or settled conditions. You should locate the fire as far away from adjacent buildings as practical and supervise the fire at all times, Do not locate fires within close proximity to property boundaries, buildings, trees, hedges and shrubs, Smoke must not cause a nuisance to neighbours, For large land clearing burns during an open fire season please contact the Auckland Rural Fire Team to advise of length and location of burn. Before lighting any fires check with Auckland Council whether you are in a rural fire zone and what the current fire

season is by visiting; www.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/ruralfire or by emailing ; ruralfire@aucklandcouncil.govt.nz

FAMILY TRUSTS -ARE THEY STILL RELEVANT?

Most lawyers are unanimous that putting a house in a family trust is the best way of protecting those assets from your business creditors. However, you will not automatically get a rest home subsidy just because your house is in a family trust. The provisions in the Social Security Act 1964-may mean such assets are added back on to your non-trust assets for the purposes of any asset testing. This is because the government's view is that you may have otherwise deprived yourself of assets needed to pay for your retirement care. This is a matter for careful legal advice specific to your situation. There may be a number of other helpful things a lawyer can do for you to plan your retirement arrangements. YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE POWER-LESS NOW THE COOLER WEATHER IS HERE.

If you've got money worries, getting your power disconnected because you couldn't afford to pay the bill might be the last straw – especially if it happens in the middle of a cold snap." Apart from the terrible inconvenience of not being able to cook on your stove or heat your home – on top of all that, you will receive a hefty reconnection bill as well", says Joy Florence of Citizens Advice Bureau Helensville. "You really want to avoid getting disconnected. It's important to tell your electricity provider if you are a vulnerable or a medically dependent consumer, as the power company has to follow certain guidelines regarding what they should do before taking that final step of disconnec-

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tion. This includes trying to find alternative ways for you to pay, or referral to a budgeting advisor or Work and Income (with your consent). You would qualify as a medically dependent consumer if someone in your household depends on mains electricity to power critical medical equipment (such as a ventilator). You would be a "vulnerable" consumer if you have genuine difficulty in paying your electricity bills due to financial hardship or if disconnection would threaten the health or wellbeing of someone in your household (such as someone who is elderly, has health problems or is a very young child). "If you are having problems paying your bills, don't just wait for the disconnection notice to arrive - tell your power company that you're having trouble or get in touch with us. We can help you to know your rights and entitlements (for example as a vulnerable consumer and/or someone eligible for financial assistance from WINZ). We can also help if you have a problem with the way your power company is treating you and want to make a complaint. Come and see us at 27 Commercial Road, Helensville. ELECTRIC MOTOR CONTROL.

Accurate motor control can save electricity and reduce wear on machinery, both of which can save money. For example: An electric motor drives a large water pump. The pump was designed to ensure that in peak times it was big enough to do the job, which means that under normal operating conditions it may be working too hard which results in 2 things.

1: it may be stopping and starting more often, resulting in excessive wear on equipment.

2: it runs faster than required so uses more electricity than usually required. In this example a pump is used but this can also be a fan or conveyor etc. One solution would be to slow the motor down using VFD technology so it consumes less energy and incorporate a pressure transducer in the water line so the pump could speed up and deal with the peak demand when required. Solutions like these can save a great deal of electricity and wear when designed and commissioned correctly. Below is a quote from the EECA business:

'Three-phase motors account for around 24% of New Zealand's total electricity use. Typically, these motors are more than 10 years old and up to 14% less efficient than new motors on the market.

CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

As Auckland continues to rapidly develop, it seems timely to look at some of the law relating to the construction industry, and in particular, the Construction Contracts Act 2002 ("CCA"). The CCA reforms the law relating to construction contracts by facilitating regular and timely payments between parties to a construction contract; providing for quick resolution of construction contract disputes; and providing remedies for recovery of payments under a construction contract. Broadly speaking, the CCA applies to all construction contracts (although there are some exceptions), and cannot be contracted out of by the parties. One particularly important aspect of the CCA relates to "payments". In this regard, a payee may serve a "Payment Claim" requiring payment of a sum under the construction contract within a specified timeframe. If the amount is disputed, the payer must serve a "Payment Schedule" within a specified timeframe, otherwise the payer will become liable to pay that amount. There are strict formalities that both Payment Claims and Payment Schedules must comply with. The CCA also deals with a number of other aspects of construction contracts, including Adjudication of disputes. The CCA is currently undergoing significant amendments and it is expected that those amendments will come into force on 1 November 2014. It is therefore important for those involved on both sides of a construction contract to be familiar with not only the current provisions of the CCA, but also the proposed amendments so as to ensure compliance when those amendments take effect. THE SECRET TO GETTING CHILDREN TO HELP WITH CHORES

Assigning age-appropriate chores teaches children important lessons about responsibility and following directions. However, repeatedly trying to get children to participate in simple household chores can be exhausting. Well, the secret may have been uncovered. A new study finds that parents' word choices can make a big difference when encouraging young children to help with chores.

Children are significantly more likely to help adults when the word "help" is used as a noun. For example, when the researchers referred to pre-schoolers as "helpers," children actively participated in chore work rather than if the word "help" was used a verb. The study, which appears in a forthcoming issue of the journal Child Development, looked at the behaviours of 150 3-to-6-year-olds from a variety of backgrounds. The children were divided into two groups: one in which helping was refer-



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enced with a verb (e.g., "Some children choose to help") and the other in which helping was referenced to with a noun (e.g., "Some children choose to be helpers").In



each group, children began the experiment playing with toys. During this time, a researcher provided the children with four opportunities to stop playing and help pick up a mess, open a container, put away toys, and pick up crayons that had spilled on the floor. The researchers also gathered data as to what extent a child chose to help an experimenter when helping was never mentioned. The results showed that children who heard the noun "helper" assisted significantly more than children who heard the verb "help." In fact, the children who were spoken to using the verb form didn't help any more than when the researcher never brought up helping at all. Using the noun "helper" may imply something positive about a child's identity, which in turn can motivate children to help more. Children who help around the house often feel needed and that they are making a contribution to the family home. Furthermore, the lead researcher explains, "These findings suggest that parents and teachers can encourage young children to be more helpful by using nouns like helper instead of verbs when a making a request of a child."So go on, give it a go!! WINTER PLUMBING TIPS

New Group Fitness Classes are now on The arrival of the winter season and cold weather invite a multitude of potential plumbing problems into our homes. Cold morning showers, flooding, and leaks are just a few of the many unwanted plumbing issues brought on by cold winter weather. Fortunately there are things that you can do to prevent or minimize the likelihood of these winter plumbing mishaps. Preventing Clogged Drains: Once a week, treat your sink and bathtub drains to this quick, safe and environmental-

ly-friendly cleaning process. Make up a mixture of 1 cup of salt, 1 cup of baking soda, and 1/4 cup cream of tartar. Pour equal amounts into your various drains and follow it with 2 cups of boiling water for each drain. Pipe Insulation: Use foam padding sleeves or special insulating tape to guard your pipes (both hot water and cold water) against freezing. Running Water: Be sure to run water from every valve in your house at regular intervals throughout the winter. Be Careful with Cooking Fats: Cooking grease and oils put a real strain on drains, pipes and garbage disposals. Grease and oil are more likely to collect and clog when your plumbing is cold, so do your best not pour down the drain. Also, refrain from putting hard to grind objects or stringy substances down into the disposal. Always run cold water through the disposal for at least 15 seconds before and after each use. Be sure to turn the disposal on before filling it with food debris. Spread Showers Throughout the Day: At least 10 minute intervals between showers is optimal to maintain hot water and proper pressure. You may also want to turn up the water heater during the cold season as well; to prevent burns, do not put it above 125 degrees fahrenheit. Eliminate Drafts: Check around your home for areas where water supply lines are located in unheated areas and take measures to prevent the flow of cold air in these areas. Examples: basements, crawl spaces, attics, garag-





, and under kitchen and bathroom cabinets. Both hot and cold water pipes in these areas should be insulated.
