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PHELAN PIRRIE ON SPECIAL HOUSING

Apologies in advance for all the acronyms, Council is drowning in them! Over 180 people attended the SHA (Special Housing Area) public meeting last month in Kumeu. Among the many things that came out of it was the acknowledgement from both AT (Auckland Transport) and NZTA (NZTransit Authority) staff that no planning had been done around the possibility of thousands of extra traffic movements the SHA's would bring. This is not surprising. The 'Huapai Triangle' has been approved for an SHA, it has not be signed off as at the time of the meeting no plans had been presented by the developer. It also became apparent that staff from the HPO (Housing Project Office, the office that administers the SHA program) felt that Area Planning needed to be completed for Kumeu and Huapai. This is why everyone should be concerned. Planning within Council is a slow process, and currently there are huge numbers of plans underway, some would say far too many. We have the Unitary Plan, the Local Board Plan, the Annual Plan, the Long Term Plan and so on. The Local Board has been told there are "no resources" for any further Area Plans. This is Council-speak for no money and no staff. If we are not to end up with a dog's breakfast of traffic hell and inadequate amenities for the growth predicted and people up in arms in five years' time followed by piece meal band aids and further rushed knee jerk planning, then area and transport plans need to start right now! Then there are the budgets, we have a plethora of old plans for the area, which was nice, but there was never any money to implement them so they sat there gathering dust and are now redundant. We need planning and budgets in place for growth, and this work needs to start now. Even if Council starts today, the plans will take at least 12 months to complete, then the budgets will have to be put together and argued over, taking another 2-3 years, by that time there could be another 1000-2000 more houses in the area. The Local Board is planning another public meeting around the SHA and planning at the end of May. If you have an interest in seeing the future of our township prop-

RUNAWAY CHALLENGE MAY 18

On the 18 May 2014. Registration opens at 7.30am at Hobsonville Point Primary School. The Hobsonville Point Runway Challenge has been run successfully for the last 3 years by Total Sport but this year will be a bit different. The Henderson Lions Club have taken over the event and they are keen for it to become a community event for the whole family, have been organising events of this kind for over 53 years and the event is run entirely by volunteer labour. This means that any profits from the event can be given back to children and families in the community. Entrants, either team or individual, can take part in a 3K, 5K or 10K cross country run or walk. Ob-

course to make in more interesting and lots of fun. If you decide to do the 10k, you get to have a go at all the obstacles twice. Every entrant gets a special medal and a goody bag at the conclusion of the race. Over 400 schools and 100 sports clubs have been invited to submit a team of 10 runners in the same event. For every team that schools enter, they go in the draw to win \$1000 to spend on sports equipment of their choice. 



NEW ROOF FOR KCC

This week and next APS Contractors will be replacing the roof cladding on the hall at the Kumeu Community Centre. Thirty-four years ago after a period of major fund-raising in the community the present community centre in Access Road with its two halls, spacious kitchen and storage was opened by the then Prime Minister, Robert Muldoon. It replaced a fairly run-down hall situated on the main road near the present Kumeu Village shops.

At the time the building project received support with materials from some local businesses such as the- then new Particle Board factory and fibrolite cladding from James Hardie. The Super 6 Fibrolite roofing is being replaced due to an increasing problem with leaks mainly caused by sealing failure with the water affecting the permeable particle board interior lining. It is expected that the long-run corrugated colour-steel cladding now being installed will fix the leak problem and last for 50 years.

The present Kumeu Community Centre management committee has been fortunate in receiving a grant totalling \$30.000 from Transpower Community Care Fund and it was one of Transpowers' major grants during 2013. With a \$10,000 grant from the Auckland Council's Large Grants Fund (Community), the management committee has been able to proceed with the project. Mr Colin Tucker whose family had connections with the Kumeu-Taupaki area has been engaged to manage the job.

Management Committee Chairperson, Rinus van Winden says this is the biggest maintenance job ever carried out on the Community Centre although there have been several other pieces of maintenance over recent years including exterior re-painting, polyure-thane on the floors and up-grading of the kitchen and toilets. The painting of the dull interior particle board lining in a pastel shade last year was another improvement that received many positive comments Mr van Winden said. Mr van Winden also added that the

Community Centre in Kumeu was one of only a few halls within the Auckland Council district that is owned and self-managed by the local community with no control or financial input from the Council and it has been that way for the past 34 years. The site, including the parking area is leased from the Council and a new 33 year lease is currently being approved. The annual meeting of the Kumeu Community Centre Management committee will be held in July and as several current members have served from its inception it is imperative that some younger members of the community with an interest in the management of the million dollar community facility put their names forward. Mr van Winden said he would welcome hearing from people.



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MINDFULNESS COURSE MAY 13

Mindfulness teaches us how to quieten the busy mind. It teaches us to become more aware of the present moment and less caught up in in what happened earlier or what is happening next. Cognitive therapists recommend it to those who suffer from anxiety and depression but the practice can be applied to all of us, particularly those who lead busy lives. It is a practice that helps us deal with the stress of our daily lives. The facilitators who are local residents received such a great response to the course run in September that they have decided to run courses for locals on a regular basis.

The next 8 week course which comprises 2.5 hour sessions once a week starting 13 May 2014. There is also a one day retreat (weekend) during the 8 week time frame. Mindfulness teaches us to be more present. The course teaches meditation and other practises which help calm the mind and relax the body. Although meditation is helpful in achieving mindfulness, the ultimate goal is to help us pay attention to what we are doing. We can work mindfully, parent mindfully and learn mindfully or we can be distracted. The course aims to help participants lessen the distraction that dominates our lives and provides tools to slow down and pay attention in a way that lessens our stress. Mindfulness is based on the work of Jon Kabat Zinn from the University of Massachusetts developed in the 1980's with patients who suffered from depression and debilitating pain.

The practice is now taught to a much broader community including anyone who wants to reduce their stress either at home or at work. The last group of participants in our September programme were all locals who all had levels of stress that they needed assistance with. Some had medical issues and were referred by their GP's. Our teacher/ facilitators have all attended Mindfulness teacher training run by the US based Centre for Mindfulness and the Australian organisation Open Ground.

They are Dean Stewart (Kumeu), Helen Bowen (Muriwai), Juan Aguilera ((Huapai) and Mel Cash (Whangaparaoa).

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

LEAKY BUILDINGS - LIMITATION PERIODS

This month we briefly discuss commercial disputes in the context of leaky building claims and, in particular, the importance of limitation periods for such claims. I have been involved in acting for claimants and respondents in both large-scale and small-scale litigation, including both multi-unit developments and single dwellings. I am therefore in the fortunate position to understand the wide range of arguments that are run on both sides of a leaky claim. From my experience, one of the most important issues that continually come up in leaky claims is the issue of "limitation periods". A limitation period is basically a time limit by which a claim must be issued. If a leaky claim is issued too late, the limitation period can provide a complete defence. Limitation periods therefore need to be guickly and accurately assessed for each claim (or potential claim). In this regard, two key limitation periods to be aware of are the six year and 10-year limitation periods. The six year limitation period (in respect of a claim for negligence) effectively means that a claim needs to be issued within six years from the date that the defects/damage became reasonably discoverable. The 10-year limitation period is addressed under the Building Act 2004 and effectively means that a claim in respect of



building work must be issued within 10 years of that relevant building work being carried out. There are other limitation periods to be aware of, and it can become a complex issue. Nonetheless, given its significance, the issue needs to be carefully considered by all parties to a leaky claim. Furthermore, owners of leaky buildings (or suspected leaky buildings) that have not yet made a claim should be seeking advice very quickly. 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
