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
MEDIATION FOR UNITARY PLAN

The Commissioners have decided to set down a mediation hearing for late November between groups in Kumeu, a decision taken at a pre-hearing meeting on 16th October. The hearing will at least ensure the issues we have raised in Kumeu will be discussed in front of a Court appointed mediator. The advantage of this process is that the submitters can informally discuss their issues with the Council before the Commissioners call for formal evidence. Given that the extent of the 'Future Urban Zone' is still being resolved, this informal approach seems to be a good solution. The Commissioners want to set the outer limits of the 'Future Urban Zone'. Of course, to do that, they have to look at the requests for re-zoning and changes, requested by individuals and groups. One of the anomalies of the new Unitary Plan is the provision of 'Large Lots' as a category. These are sites considered 'Urban' in nature, even though there is no sewerage or water supply. Under the old Rodney District Council Scheme, we simply had a residential site 800m or 'Countryside Living' at 1 hectare – there was nothing in between. Consequently we had small pockets of the residential sites with 'Countryside Living' placed mostly north of Kumeu. The re-think of zones and densities in Kumeu resulted in a mixture of requests from the submitters. The Auckland Council has taken the approach that 'Large Lots', despite having no sewerage and water infrastructure, are inside the 'Future Urban Area' and therefore are grouped with other small sites of Single Lot or 'Mixed Housing, Suburban & Urban Zones'. In my view, the opportunity exists to consolidate some of the existing 'Countryside Living Zoning'into 'Large Lots' without affecting the value or character of those areas. That would help the consolidation of houses that the Council is seeking. At the other extreme, is that a number of owners (on Station & Trigg Roads) where it is still greenfields, are requesting 'Mixed Housing Urban'. This would create a density of one dwelling per 300m. That is a density which we don't have at present, and should not be encouraging, in my view. There are only two 'Special Housing' areas in Kumeu-Huapai which have been approved. The 'Special Housing' office has advised that the Triangle Development plans are on hold pending further information, but are due to be released for public notification in November. That means a possible close off for submissions just before Christmas. The second block is on Oraha Road is not being developed, but is on the market for sale. It appears the sale is based on an unproven value based on a theoretical yield. The other advice we have received is that applications for SHA approval (up to 10, I am told) have been refused by Council. The SHA Manager, Allan McGregor, confirms that there isn't a need for further 'Special Housing Areas) given the existing growth in the Kumeu-Huapai District. They are saying there is sufficient growth for 4-5 years. That being the case, the Structure Planning which we all know is needed



Rubbish fires are probably the calls we dislike most. We often find ourselves "dammed if we do and dammed if we don't" because, if we find it necessary to extinguish a fire, we often wind up with a disgruntled person who lit it. If the fire isn't breaking fire regulations we often raise the ire of the person who had put the call in because we haven't extinguished it.

A simple guide:

You cannot burn waste or rubbish. You can have an outdoor cooking fire such as a BBQ, hangi or umu or a heating fire such as a fireplace or brazier. However only dry, untreated wood can be used and smoke must not be causing a nuisance to neighbours. Fires in the restricted fire season must have an Auckland Council issued permit. Please use the more environmentally friendly ways of disposing of your rubbish, and be aware that all fires should be extinguished by nightfall. If a prohibited fire season is imposed during the summer all fires will be banned. Auckland Council has now issued a pamphlet detailing its reg-

ulations and the information can also be found on its website www.aucklandcouncil. govt.nz or phone: 09 301 0101.

LOCAL BOARD UPDATE OCTOBER 2014

My first year on the Local Board has flown by, while initially it seemed things were going to happen slowly it seems that with a bit of effort things can change! Your Local Board is making a significant shift in focus which will start to become apparent next year. In October we adopted our three year plan for Rodney which will see us concentrate on 'infrastructure' issues that you said were important. This means more attention on things like footpaths and transport projects, planning for growth with the communities who are facing rapid population increases and delivering basic core services and projects cheaper and quicker. None of this is flash or exciting but the overwhelming feedback showed you wanted less fluffy stuff and more 'bricks and mortar' projects in our growth areas. We are also changing the way we work as a Board. Previously we had 18 separate 'portfolios' covering everything from Civil Defence and Arts through to Transport and Facilities. This meant a lot of meetings which made for slow decision making and painfully slow delivery. We have now created two Committees; a 'Transport, Planning & Infrastructure Committee' and a 'Parks, Culture & Community Development Committee'. These committees will have more decision making abilities, meet publically, and hopefully will react quicker to the changing environment Council is working in. I was delighted to be elected as Chair of the Transport, Planning and Infrastructure Committee especially as so much of our work is going to be around the changes taking place in Kumeu and Huapai, and the effect this will have on the other townships in our district. 2015 promises to be an interesting and busy year! A GARDEN OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE

A Georgian styled home is the centrepiece of this large rural garden set amongst the remnants of an old orchard. Behind the house is the formal area. To one side a cottage garden and whimsical garden shed lead to "kissing gates" which are romantically placed under trailing weeping willow. Beyond these are a further four hectares of native walkways, expansive grassed areas, spring plantings of cherries, rhododendrons, camellias and acers, together with a traditional walled kitchen garden, complete with gardener's cottage and Victorian inspired glasshouses. A backdrop of typically Northland podocarp forest adds a different dimension to Mincher. 

INVESTORS MOVE IN AS FIRST HOME BUYERS FAIL TO FIND SUITABLE FINANCE OPTIONS

Property investors are the big winners from the Reserve Bank's mortgage restrictions, while first-home buyers are increasingly struggling to afford a house. The Reserve Bank introduced a limit a year ago on the amount banks can offer to people with less than 20 per cent of a deposit, in an effort to cool the housing market. Since then data from property analysis company CoreLogic has shown activity among investors who owned two or more properties had hit a 10-year high. Big investors with more than 10 properties were the most active, buying about two out of every five homes in August. But those trying to get onto the property ladder had found it harder, with firsthome buyer numbers falling, as had the numbers of people moving from one property to another. Just before the mortgage restriction was introduced there was a surge in first-home buying as people got their foot in the property door. However, the figures showed that had fallen away, with first-home buyers accounting for about 18 per cent of homes bought, several per cent less than before the brief pre-restrictions surge. The figures also suggested people were looking further afield for a first home. Westpac bank chief economist Dominick Stephens said the investor surge was predicted when the loan-to-value ratio restrictions were introduced.

"Our view was it would have relatively little effect on house prices, as property investors would come in and replace the first-home buyers."

The Reserve Bank's actions were about shoring up the banking system by having fewer heavily mortgaged people buying houses. "One of the Reserve Bank's arguments was that it may be saving people from themselves," Stephens said. "If we have people getting in with 95 per cent leverage and there's a 10 per cent drop in house prices, they are 5 per cent under water." Making it more difficult for people to buy in an inflated market had social consequences, but reducing the risk of a future

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banking crisis might be worth it, he said. "It's up to people to assess which is the most desirable outcome."

Nearly half of all sales in greater Auckland from June to September were to investors.

THE IMPORTANCE OF FURNITURE PLACEMENT IN THE LIVING ROOM

A well staged living room is inviting, spacious and balanced. The most common error in furniture placement is to put all the pieces around the wall, thinking that it will make the room larger, whereas it actually makes the room feel smaller and is less usable. A chunky sofa may be comfy, but if it is the only thing that fits into the room, then it isn't in proportion. Group sofas and chairs parallel to each other to create a conversation area, keep your furniture parallel to the walls, this is most pleasing on the eye, however if needed you can get away with angling a chair in a corner. Define a specific area with a change in floor coverings, e.g. a rug under the sofa and chairs. Tall up light lamps look best in corners as they make the room look larger, small lamps work best on side tables next to sofas or chairs. Every room should have a focal point something that immediately draws the eye into the room, e.g. artwork, large decorative mirror, a fireplace, a change in wall colour or texture... 

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

Research in this area has proven that young children grow with more confidence through their lives with an enriched preschool experience. As in the article there are always important factors to consider.

Preschool programs help children achieve school readiness by equipping them with the needed cognitive skills for learning. A new study, published in Child Development, suggests that high-quality preschool programs can have significant positive effects on children's later educational outcomes.

Children's cognitive skills – the ability to process, reason, and retain information – are malleable during the preschool years. A plethora of research has shown that young children with higher levels of early vocabulary, reading, and mathematical skills

Additionally, research suggests that implementing explicit and intentional curricula in preschool programs helps to develop the essential components of school readiness. To test this idea, researchers examined a public preschool program that combined research-based curricula with a coaching system for preschool teachers. The coaching system is an ongoing professional development initiative in which teachers are observed in the classroom and provided with feedback regarding their pedagogy. Preschool teachers involved in this particular program have an educational background of either bachelor's or master's level training. Overall, these results provide further evidence of the benefits of preschool programs for children. Preschool can expand young children's skills and knowledge through purposefully-designed learning environments. Teachers and administrators who provide children with enriching and meaningful experiences prepare children to become successful learners. We believe that not only children learn and develop with support but also the teachers that work alongside the children. Just like children, teachers need to explore new learning ideas so that we can share this with the children. Country Bears believes that children and teachers of today need encouragement to explore outside their comfort zones to simulate a new level of thinking (stimulating new senses). 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














LIVESTOCK SALES REPORT

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


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SWEET LEMON LOAF

Put in loaf tin.



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FROM MY PLACE- DAWN KENDALL

Among Civilisation's advances, the utilitarian chimney nowadays requires an Engineer's Permit. Their origins and development throughout the ages is interesting. Here briefly; a caveman may have discovered it by finding one naturally formed, but igloos and wingwams required more thoughtful and innovative structure. For humble homes stones could be gathered and stacked, or clay bricks made. Draughts thus made fanned the flames, eventually causing discomfort, requiring control. Towns grew, forming serious fire hazards. Chimneys required de-sooting, demanding difficult labour from small bodies, usually poor children - another story completely and well recorded in shameful history, literature and law. The Iron Age brought inovative engineering. Hinged adjustable 'lid' behind a castiron grate. Hearth edgings to control embers and ash, firetongs among hanging cooking vessels. Fireboxes. Air intake control with the 'damper' level for cooking stoves, laundry airing-racks, hotwater fittings and taps. Chimneys and chimney tops became decorative items, especially as status indicators. Then came Permits, Insurance, and Fire Extinguishers! Multiple and elaborate styles are still subjects for artists, photographers, collectors and antiques dealers. And a contrast with Enzed gumdiggers' and bushwhackers' huts built alongside huge corrugated chimneys. 18th century has brought electrical-powered cooking stoves. Today's kitchen chimney? A solar-powered rangehood! Summer comes. Time for chimney cleaning - if you still have one!
