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MOANA'S MUSIC

Moana Maniapoto sings what she thinks.

The Muriwai Beach musician, known for her band Moana & the Tribe (and formerly the Moahunters) is passionate about Maori culture. And if that means spreading it through her music then so be it.

Recently inducted into the New Zealand Music Hall of Fame (some family said "abducted" or "indicted", which she used in her acceptance speech), Moana is about to release a new music video. Fire in Paradise, filmed at Muriwai Beach, includes hip hop dancer Kaea Pearce and Jamaican dance hall artist Skarra Mucci.

"All I had to do was sit and look regal while Kaea leapt about," Moana laughs. An incoming tide added to the drama.

This month Moana is spending a week at Stanford University in San Francisco, facilitating a session with young indigenous leaders from New Zealand, Alaska and Hawaii.

In January, award winning film-making team Moana with partner Toby Mill, head to Finland along with musician Paddy Free. They'll be playing in a festival inside the Arctic Circle. "I'd been there about 12 years ago and this time I'll be more prepared for the cold," Moana says.

She returns for 21 performances with Arts on Tour across the country in April and May. So why did Moana and Toby decide to live at Muriwai Beach?

"Quite happy" in Grey Lynn, Moana says they were fantasising about a second property and saw a home for sale at Muriwai. "I'd lived in Auckland most of my life and had never been to Muriwai," she says. They knew one local family, so decided to sell and shift.

She helped form the Waitangi Day festival there but was unable to find a school with a Maori language immersion programme for the youngest of her two children. Her 8-year-old now carpools with another Muriwai family to Westmere School. "We're

te reo refugees," Moana says. She speaks Maori to her children and wants to see the language even more used in New Zealand society. Well-travelled, Moana says Maori culture is popular at large overseas events, but she struggles to get Maori language music played on commercial radio here. "People overseas love the sound of it," she says.

Moana says Maori is gaining more acceptance at home, with many Pakeha children becoming versed in the language and culture.

She received a New Zealand Order of Merit for her services to music and Maori, was made an art laureate by the NZ Arts Foundation, and has received widespread recognition for her work. Now in her sixth year living at Muriwai Beach, Moana is involved in many other events too, including the Iron Maori triathlon style event in Napier in which she has entered three Muriwai teams this year.

So if you mention you are good at swimming, cycling or running, you might find yourself drafted into a team next year.

HISTORY GROUP PLANNED



A Kumeu-Huapai History Group is proposed to help preserve the area's heritage and stories.

Bunty Condon of Huapai has gained support from the West Auckland Historical Society for the venture and is keen to see who else in this area is interested. Although based in Henderson, the society has a wide interest in the greater west Auckland area as far as Helensville and the Kaipara Harbour. Establishing a Kumeu-Huapai group is an exciting undertaking and one the society is pleased to support, society president Gai Bishop says. "Few documented materials exist on this fascinating and diverse area with so many other stories to tell," Gai says. One exception is Deborah Dunstan's 2002 publication 'Doing it themselves: The story of Kumeu, Huapai and Taupaki'.

Others focus on the Kaipara and further north, like 'Tall Spars, Steamers and Gum' from Taupaki's Wayne Ryburn, published in 1999.

Gai says Kumeu seems destined for great change and there is urgency in capturing the stories and lessons of the past before they are overtaken by that future. Older community members have much to offer in the form of oral histories and recorded memories too, preferably done sooner. Photos and other materials also need to be safely stored for future generations, Gai

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says.

Bunty says during 23 years in the area she has always been interested in its history. She was involved with the Waitemata Hunt for much of that time and researched its origins with people in the Kumeu-Huapai and Whenuapai areas. She also participates in other clubs and is The Jowett Car Club of NZ Northern Branch secretary. Her 1951 Jowett Jupiter is called "Jezebel" pictured. Rodney Local Board workshops last year showed people want to preserve this area's heritage and history in the face of increasing development, Bunty says.

"People are talking about it potentially being lost if nothing is done. I need the help and support of others who would also like to see a historical society developed for the area."

Bunty says Rodney has a heritage trail brochure but it does not include any Kumeu-Huapai destination.

KUMEU CARE CENTRE

Craig Waymouth found an urgent need for more continuing care facilities for the elderly in the north-west while trying to find one for his mum Heather.

"When you get old why can't you live in the community where you spent your life?" he says.

So the Muriwai Beach resident got in touch 10 years ago with long-time friend David Lowry, who'd had 30 years' experience in the aged care business. The result is a proposed \$75 million 259-bed facility near the Taupaki Rd/State Highway 16 intersection

A day care centre catering for 100 children was approved this year for the site under David's Kid Country Holdings, which also includes The Fire Station early learning centre at Te Atatu.

David says having child care and elderly care on the same location is new to New Zealand but has been a successful mix overseas.

Kumeu Property Ltd, of which David is also a director, proposes three buildings of three storeys each on a 3.8 hectare site at 455 Taupaki Rd for the continuing care services. They are designed to resemble "large farm estate buildings". About 80 per cent of the land would be open space and includes "traditional rural activities". That means residents would have a nice rural outlook, with the views maximised, David says, pictured left with Craig. The independent Auckland Urban Design Panel has given the project design the thumbs up and says larger buildings won't be "overly dominant when viewed from SH16". The building site would be dug down to four metres and set back from the road to reduce visual impact, the application says.

A bowling green, recreational walkway and seating, extensive planting and 27 car parks for the child care centre and 80 for the aged care facility are included. On-site servicing is planned, including bores and rain storage.

A car crash stopped the Local Government Commission holding a Kumeu drop-in day on Auckland governance, but staff involved managed to get to a public meeting the same night. The Coatesville-Riverhead Highway head-on crash earlier in the day left two women staff members unharmed and their car badly damaged. That meant cancellation of a Kumeu Library drop-in day to discuss community views on Auckland local gov-

However, a Kumeu Community Centre meeting led by commission chairman Sir Wira Gardiner proceeded, although only 14 residents attended. Most were keen to discuss a Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association (KHRRA) submission to split Rodney into northern and southern wards, with a councillor and local board of five to six members each.

Many wanted change and were unhappy with super-city aspects, especially around coping with rapid growth and associated traffic, grappling with administration, and dealing with landfill operations and ad hoc pocket development.

CREATIVE TOUCH

Mike Simpkins is a creative genius. And wife Annette puts it all together. Toasting the success of their Kumeu Valley Estate weddings and function centre near their Waimauku home, the couple has even more creative events in the pipeline.

But for now the Simpkins are concentrating on their Old North Rd venue where actor Keisha Castle-Hughes was married. When it was known as Rivermill, the estate hosted golfer and caddy Steve Williams' wedding, attended by Tiger Woods. Mike and Annette also run Carrington's Pumphouse in Mt Albert. Their move to operating venues has been interesting, to say the least. Mike started out running billboard business Graphics Outdoor. He sold that, and when he took a fun cruise around the Caribbean he met Annette, the on board food and beverage administrator. They married on the ship a year later. The couple then ran Cafe88 in Helensville before venturing into themed events like medieval banquets.

Their Creative Functions business came about by accident. A friend hosting a corporate event asked for ideas. That's when Mike's creative side blossomed.

"I booked a train," Mike says. "We had different coloured tickets and separate carriages, each with a different theme like a Mexican fiesta, a French wine and cheese, and a German beer festival." The 200 passengers got off near the Kumeu Showgrounds where they were seated on hay bales and treated to a Wild West hoe down with cowboys, spit roasts and more.

"From that we got three referrals, and we got the same compa-

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ny for years in a row," Mike says.

Creative Functions was born and grew quickly, catering for medieval style banquets featuring knights, games and team events.

Other events followed, like indoor beach parties. They were all so successful that a big team was needed to run them, with sometimes different ones on the same night. Then Mike developed the Floating Pavilion function centre at the Viaduct, buying it off Oracle.


A contract with Tourism Australia saw many big events hosted in Auckland, including Australia's Longest Lunch at the Viaduct. Entertainers at one time included Dragon and Neil Finn. The move to Kumeu Valley Estate and Carrington's Pumphouse followed.

Annette and Mike added a big barn in keeping with the estate's rustic charm, and got rave reviews. They won the Wedding Wise web site people's choice, editor's choice and venue of the year titles last year.

"It had good bones here, so we added on to make it a more flexible all-weather venue," Annette says. They also provide for 21sts, corporate functions and more.

The Simpkins admit it's been hard work, often involving seven day weeks, but during that time they've managed to have five children. Married for 23 years, the couple did their own New Zealand wedding on their 15th anniversary for family and friends. "I decided we should get married here but told guests 'don't tell my wife," Mike laughs.

Mike still finds time to help Kumeu Rotary with events like the mayoral candidates' debate at Soljans Estate. So what's next for this enterprising couple? Watch this space.

MAKING KOROWAI

By Alison, Shar, Brodie, Rachel & Jo, Teachers at Waimauku Kindergarten. It has been a very exciting time at Kindergarten. Thanks to a donation from the Duckworth family in early 2016 we purchased a korowai (woven cloak). Korowai are the most highly prized of all traditional Māori garments and are regarded as family



and personal heirlooms. Children will wear the korowai on special occasions, particularly their 5-Year-Old leaving mat time. It is worn as a mantle and speaks of honour, dignity and respect. When we introduced our korowai to some of our children at mat time they immediately knew something special was happening. We could see how proud they were to be wearing it. The introduction of the korowai sparked the imaginations of the children and inspired many of them to make their own korowai. We had been given beautiful fabric from the Mitchell family, which had now found its purpose at Kindergarten. Children started by choosing the fabric they wanted to use to make their korowai and the teachers helped cut their material to size. From there some children spent a long time planning and designing where their decorative pieces were to be placed. Others just set straight to gluing. All took ownership and were rightly proud of their work, showing their korowai off to others at Kindergarten. Once the korowai were made some children didn't want to take them off and wore them as they played, proudly modelling them at mat time and home. The introduction of what a korowai is and means has further developed our commitment to biculturalism and allowed the children to develop an understanding and respect for korowai and their place in Aotearoa New Zealand and our Kindergarten. 

CONSTRUCTIVE TRUSTS ON TRUST OWNED PROPERTY

It is commonly thought that trust owned property is not relationship property. However, making improvements to or maintaining the trust property by someone who is not a beneficiary of the trust can sometimes open the door to the court imposing a constructive trust over some of the value contained within the



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In essence, a constructive trust is another sort of trust on trust owned assets. An example is an ex-partner relationship partner who has built a house from relationship resources on trust owned property or has just maintained the gardens and house. The Courts have shown a tendency to do this sort of thing up to the present time. For this reason, it is often necessary to make a property agreement (often called a prenuptial agreement) with any potential claimant against trust property. The property agreement is written to make it clear to any of the parties that any trust owned property is not, and can never be in the future, relationship property. This is an area where specialist legal advice is always justified if you have a concern.

SPRAY FREE WEED CONTROL ON YOUR LIFESTYLE **BLOCK**

Spring is here, although one could be fooled with the mercurial weather we have been experiencing locally. The upside of this weather is we have had great rainfall and as I drive around the district working in real estate I can't help but note how green the pasture is.

Unfortunately growing alongside that lush pasture is a variety of weeds which will need to be controlled. Is there a more environmentally friendly method to address this problem? As you know, there is a huge and bewildering array of herbicide available to kill just about everything, is this the way to go? Chemicals are expensive (very), need to be stored safely, unused chemicals and containers need to be disposed of responsibly and in some cases at cost, to an approved disposal facility.

The alternative to this approach is mulching should your terrain allow this. Flail mowing (mulching) is a great way to clean up your pasture, not only does it chop up the grass and weeds into smaller particles to allow for better regeneration it also does not leave ugly windrows all over your paddocks as traditional slashing does. If you are preparing a property for sale, mulching the paddocks will make your property shine and could be the difference when buyers are deciding on which property to purchase. There are a number of lifestyle block maintenance companies out there who can provide you with advice and this service if you do not have the equipment to do it yourself. If you organise a mulching regime, timed around the emergence of particular weeds you will find after a couple of years they will not be the problem they once were and you will have achieved the result without resorting to costly chemicals.

HOW TO HIDE THAT ANNOYING TV

If this post caught your eye, it's because, like me, you enjoy watching TV but don't want it to be the focal point of your living room. I find when I do



my in-home interior consultations, this is one of the main issues people struggle with.

First tip: The easiest and most affordable method to hide your TV is distraction. Your main goal is to distract the attention away from your TV. Firstly, disguise your TV by painting the wall behind it in a darker colour. Then use objects in the space with pull power; contrasting prints staggered up the wall, books, photos, a feature coloured chair, vivid greenery, vivaciously loud cushions and so on. This will distract the eye away from your TV.

Tip two: When you walk into your room does the furniture layout say "conversation zone" or is it purely arranged for watching TV? To pull off a social space, you need to have seating that faces each other in a layout conducive to having a good chinwag. There are many ways you can do this without making the space look cluttered. One option is to select a slim line sofa with legs and modest sized arms. Combine this with light, versatile seating that can easily be moved closer like occasional chairs, ottomans, foot stools and oversized floor cushions.

Tip three: I've also seen some pretty cool feature cabinets that simply have hinged doors to conceal a TV. View examples of these cabinets on the digital version of this blog located on my website www.loubrown.co.nz.

Tip four: Another option is using mechanical lift systems, which come in a myriad of options. They are generally recessed into a custom-made piece of furniture or wall cabinetry. You simply push a button and hey presto, your TV lifts up and out of your cabinet top. You can even get TV lifts that come out of your floor, ceiling or under your bed!











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Another option is using a sliding panel mechanism. It allows you to hide your TV in a wall cavity or cabinet with sliding panels. You can get creative with this mechanism by attaching a piece of art as the sliding panel. When it's closed, you'd never know there's a TV hiding behind it.

SPARKN UPDATE

We hope everyone enjoying the slightly drier weather! The water tanks are full up again. Now is the time to consider outdoor lighting and sensor lights. Lighting is the biggest deterrent to opportunist theft at night. It also makes your home safer; with the days getting longer and warmer some general outdoor ambient lighting would be a nice touch if the evening goes into the small hours as it can with good company. We can also provide more decorative lighting for driveways and gardens.

Do you have lights in a hard place to reach? With the cost of LED lamps and fittings it is very cost effective to replace or relamp fittings. The average pay back (based on energy saved) is approximately 1 to 2.5 years. This may sound like a long pay back, but generally LED's are rated to 25,000 to 50,000 hours (10-25 years), your old filament lamp is typically rated at 1000 – 2000 hours, so they will ast quite a bit longer after the two years. Even compact fluorescent lamps are worth replacing as they



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are rated to about 8000 hours and use twice the energy of an LED while the LED has the advantage of instant full brightness without the warm-up.

EXPLORE NEW WALKS WITH YOUR DOG - FIVE MILE STRIP AT MURIWAI

Time to walk: this walk takes about an hour 10 minutes going at a good pace. You can add extra time to your walk by heading to the beach at two separate opportunities for a play.

Distance: 9K's

Difficulty: moderate, there's a lot of deep sand to walk through. Extra reasons to love this walk: great bum and thigh workout!



Watch out for: possible horses on the track. Head to Muriwai opposite the horse park, past the golf course.

Walk along coast road over the bridge and continue along until the road bears right and you have reached the beach. You can head up over the dunes on to the beach here for the dogs to have a play. You'll need wet weather foot wear to enjoy it with the dogs, otherwise watch from the dunes as they frolic in the stream.

When you're ready, call your dog and head back on to the gravel road for about 100 metres and you will see a white marker directing horses heading to the left through bush track. Head in

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here and follow the track meandering right. This track takes you through varied terrain and quite deep sand. There's greenery in the dunes, loads of beautiful bush and trees and I love listening to the waves crashing nearby as well as all the bird song from tuis and other natives.

Continue along for about 4.5 kilometres then bear left on the track, taking you on to the beach. The dogs appreciate the water at this point and it's nice to take a breather here. As you're quite far north at this point the beach is nice and quiet too.

When you're ready head back on to the track and continue north then take a right fork which takes you back out to coast road where you can enjoy an easier flat walk back to the car park. (You can add extra to this walk and stay on the track, it will eventually take you in to thicker bush, you can head over the steep dunes back on to the beach or follow your nose right and on to coast road).

Don't forget water for you and the dogs. Poo bags. Sunscreen, a hat and mosquito spray in summer. Do you have a dog that needs walks like these ones but you don't have the time yourself? DOG BITES — WHY ARE WE NOT LEARNING?

With dog bites on the rise in New Zealand we need to all take a more active role in education and learning about what our dogs are telling us. There has been a concern of late that some information being given to children is out dated and potentially dangerous.



If you school is offering education in dog safety please

ensure that they are getting given the latest information and that it is being delivered by a qualified educator. It was brought to our attention by a concerned parent recently whose daughter was told to yell at the dog if it ran up to her. As an adult I may be able to get away with this – but when it is a 4 year old girl it is wrong and potentially dangerous.

There are 3 golden rules that all of us should remember no matter the age.

1. Always ask permission from the owner and never approach a dog that is alone. You don't know how this dog is going to react. It may be scared; it may not like people in glasses, or hats or



people holding umbrellas. The dog may be unwell or deaf. Fear can cause a dog to bite. As an adult it is our responsibility to educate children in how to keep themselves safe in all situations including how to behave around a dog.

- 2. Once permission is given by the owner, and the dog knows you are there, then stand to the side of the dog and touch only its shoulder or side. This reduces that chance that you or the child will make eye contact with the dog. It allows the dog to move away should it not want to be touched. Don't stand in front of the dog and try to touch its chin or chest. You wouldn't stand behind a horse; would you. So why stand at the pointy end of a dog?
- 3. Stand like a tree if a strange dog approaches you. This turns you into something uninteresting and the dog may lose interest and just walk away.

Dogs have many subtle ways of telling us that they don't want to interact with us. It is our responsibility to learn what they are saying and how to behave around them. GINGER, PEAR AND CARDAMOM CAKE

Pre heat oven 170°C 50gm butter - melted ½ cup brown sugar

1 tsp ginger

3 pears - peeled, cored and sliced

Line a 23cm round tin and pour the melted butter into the bottom. Combine the brown sugar and ginger together and sprinkle over the butter covering the base. Arrange the sliced pears in a circular pattern on top of the sugar.

125gm butter

2 cups sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla essence

2 1/2 cups flour

4 tsp Baking powder

½ tsp salt

1 ½ tsp ginger

1 tsp cardamom

1/2 tsp mixed spice

1 1/3 cup milk Cream the butter and sugar, add the eggs and vanilla essence and beat well. Sift all the dry ingredients together and add alternatively with the milk. Mix until smooth. Pour over Pears and bake for 1 hour until skewer comes out clean. Serve with cinnamon cream and poached pears.

Cinnamon Cream:



300ml cream 1tsp cinnamon 1Tbsp sugar Whip together to form soft peaks

Poached Pears:

In a saucepan bring 3 cups of water to the boil with ½ cup of sugar, 2 tsp cinnamon and a few cloves. Peel pears, cut in half and core, place in saucepan. PATE RECIPE

500 gms chicken livers

- 4 tbsp brandy
- 125gm butter
- 1 lge diced onion
- ½ cup cream
- 2 tbsp. fresh thyme
- 125 gms mushrooms
- 1 bay leaf

6 rashers bacon extra 200 gm butter and bay leaves for decoration

3 tbsp Port



- 1. Soak Chicken livers in salted water for 1 hour and then drain
- 2. Heat butter in pan, add finely diced onion, thyme, bay leaf and finely chopped bacon. Sauté slowly until tender but not brown
- 3. Add livers, simmer for 7 min or until cooked. Put cooked mixture into a big bowl. Then add mushrooms, S&P, cream and alcohol to the frying pan. Stir, bring to the boil and simmer until reduced by almost half. Add liquid to cooked mixture. Blend in batches until smooth; if desired pour into individual bowls and place bay leaf on top. Melt the extra butter and spoon a little over the surface of each pot while still warm. Serve with crusty bread, crostinis or crackers, Alongside NoShortcuts Tamarillo Chutney or Feijoa & Ginger Jam.

DO YOU GET 'KNOTS' IN YOUR MUSCLES?




SPICE IT UP - SWAP SIDES OF THE BED

We are such creatures of habit, yet if we were not, and occasionally swapped sides of the bed, it would give our bodies a break from the potential likelihood that you may have Geopathic Stress (GS) where you sleep. If you do swap sides and feel it does feel better (or worse) than where you were sleeping then this will be a good sign that maybe you do have GS in your home. HOW TO MANAGE ECZEMA

Have you ever suffered from dry itchy skin? It may be that you have eczema. This is a bothersome skin condition which is common in New Zealand. The pattern of eczema is a little different at certain ages, but typically occurs behind the knees or on the inside of the elbows in older children and adults; and often on the faces or trunk of babies. It occurs when the skin becomes irritated and dry. No-one actually knows why some people are susceptible to eczema, but it is possible that genetic factors play a role. It may also be caused by an allergy. Eczema often co-exists with other conditions such as hay fever or asthma. Sometimes eczema can compromise the skin so much that the skin can become infected. These infections are usually due to bacteria (but can be caused by viruses). Infected eczema can become oozy and sore. Patients with infected eczema can occasionally get a fever and become very unwell. To prevent this from happening, it is important to manage eczema properly. The two most common treatments for eczema are emollients (a bit like moisturisers) and topical steroids (which are applied to the skin). Emollients are very important in the management of eczema. I tell all my patients who suffer from eczema to put them on as often as possible during flare-ups or otherwise. This may be up to four times a day. Emollients are safe, they improve the integrity of the skin and help to prevent dryness and cracking. It is important that eczema sufferers use them even if the skin is looking healthy. Topical steroids are mostly used during flare-ups. It is important to try to limit steroid use. Indeed, there are different strengths of steroids available, and your doctor will tell you which is best for your skin. Talk to your doctor about when and how to use these, and use them only as prescribed.





Side effects can include thinning of the skin. There are other treatments available for more severe cases, and your doctor will decide whether referral to a specialist for further treatment is necessary. Another thing to remember about eczema is that soaps and shower gels can often make it worse because they dry the skin. There are creams available which can be used as soap substitutes and can be prescribed by your doctor. It takes a bit of time and effort, but proper management of this skin condition can have good results, prevent the discomfort of itchy skin, and prevent infections. HAVE YOU GOT YOUR BEST LIFE?

Big question. Most would probably agree it's a work in progress. To love ourselves unconditionally is to know how worthy we are of abundance. Intention is the foundation of anything wonderful. Getting the balance between having intentions and loving ourselves and being in the present moment, is a tricky one! I recently went to see Ben Warren speak, an amazing nutritionist who founded Be Pure. He believes that every single one of us deserves a body that functions at the highest it can. And that a lot of us are putting up with not 100%, and we don't have to. And I think the same about life. Every single one of us deserves to have the different aspects of our lives ticking away nicely but yet sometimes we put up with not quite OK. If we truly understood that we are in charge would we let this happen? Yes, life will throw us a curve ball every now and then (welcome to earth) but for the most part we are utterly worthy of having things the way we want them - and the journey is an inner one.

MIND SHIFT. We have all heard before that we can choose our thoughts. In any given moment we can choose our reaction to

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understand this concept. If we truly understood that we are creating our lives with our thinking, then we probably wouldn't miss a day. Until we are pulling ourselves up on every thought that doesn't serve us, we still have stuff to learn (I'm still learning)! When clients come and see me, it's not until we reach the 2nd part of the session that a person can really see where and how they are affirming exactly what they don't want. When you really see 'who' you were being before, the thinking you don't want becomes very clear. We usually don't see 'who' we are being as it's so habitual and normal it hides from us. When we start thinking equal to that which we want, then look out – because life wants to love you and you've now started opening the flood gates.

GETTING BACK TO BASICS — GROWING VEGETABLES

At Country Bears we are very fortunate to have space, so gardening and growing of vegetables, flowers and herbs are a very popular activity for our children. Ask a child where potatoes come from, and their response



might possibly be "the supermarket". As each generation passes by, it appears that life is getting busier, so convenient, quick access to food becomes the norm.

Using a bag made from recycled milk bottles (see photo below) and our numerous gardens around the centre, we are teaching the children how to grow, maintain and watch the growth of our gardens. Potatoes were recently planted in the recycled

bag, which has a window flap at the bottom so the children can see the roots grow as well. Throughout this experience, the children were using mathematics, science, communication, numeracy and information, problem-solving, social, co-operative and physical skills. We had to measure the right amount of dirt to plant the potatoes in, and then measure again the amount of soil to cover. The children took turns with their peers, followed instructions from the teachers, and used their whole bodies to dig and transport the heavy soil into the bag and gardens. We have been watching the sprouts appear and measuring their growth, and waiting patiently until the time is right for us to dig them up.

Our on-site cook, alongside the children, will wash and prepare them, and we cannot wait to eat them! I wonder what the children will want to make with the potatoes – mashed, whole, baked or maybe just plain old fashioned chips?

There are a few things to consider to make online shopping a little safer so here is some handy tips Shipping is expensive especially when you live in a rural location – not only that but it is slower What is common practice is that the rural postie signs



for your parcel from the main courier and then drops it at your place on their behalf.

Invariably, if you're not home they will just leave the parcel on the deck / front door with no signature needed.

Now here is the worse part – thieves operate in our area all the time but in the next few months they scale up their activity.

They drive round in what can pass as a courier van and follow the rural postie, watching where they deliver parcels and a short while later they steal your online purchase. You won't know for a few days until you try and track it and as far as the courier company is concerned it has been delivered. This could be a valuable item money wise or more importantly a sentimental item that you can't put a dollar value on – either way you might get your money back from the courier company but you won't always replace what you bought.

Why not think about having our online purchase delivered to work or use the free e-pack service "epickup" just buy online and have the item delivered to e-pack on Shamrock Drive. Once it arrives they will text you and you can swing by and pick it up, they open from 7.30 till 4.00pm Monday to Friday and will arrange out of hours collection in special circumstances. This saves rural courier fees and delivery time and more importantly your purchase will be safe.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFORM FOR AUCKLAND COUNCIL

The Local Government Commission met in Kumeu to discuss

with local representatives the proposed breakaway applications made by the Northern Action Group (NAG) and Waiheke Island submitters. Those two applications had to be advertised as directed by the High Court, so that other Auckland Council ratepayers could comment on the proposals. Both applications sought self-governance on North Rodney and Waiheke respectively.

The Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association made a submission on the NAG proposal but made no reference to Waiheke. Our association made an alternative proposal to the NAG one. In essence, the area proposed by NAG sought total autonomy from the Auckland Council to form a stand-alone council from north of the Makarau River across to Waiwera and all land to the Kaipara District Council area in the north.

This would mean a new area of local government centred on Warkworth. What that would do for South Rodney and the wider Kumeu-Huapai, Waimauku, Riverhead and Coatesville area is what we were concerned about. If NAG is successful, the southern area (Kumeu) could be forced into the Massey-Henderson area, because of the size of the area left in South Rodney.

The association looked carefully at what would be acceptable to the district. The problem of a spread out Rodney Local Board area with serious growth nodes at Warkworth and Kumeu, with an hour's travel time between each centre, will result in a split board area. Each area will be competing for funds and with no central area for administration. The association has promoted a twin board concept, one based on Kumeu and the second centred on Warkworth. The members would be reduced to 5-6 members for each board. We have suggested that, as each area has different demographics and needs, that an Auckland councillor be appointed for each area.

At the public meeting, commission chairman Sir Wira Gardiner asked if he could attend a further meeting in Kumeu to listen to



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residents' concerns. That meeting is at the Kumeu Community Centre on November 2 at 7pm. The formal submission process closes on November 11.

Please attend the additional meeting and advise the independent commissioners what concerns you.

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


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
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CHRISTMAS BOOK FAIR

WHY MATHS AT PRESCHOOL IS IMPORTANT

Research clearly shows that positive and meaningful early experiences in mathematics are important for future success in education. In fact, studies suggest that acquiring early skills in mathematics is clearly linked to later academic achievement.

Adults that may have struggled with maths or school (or perhaps just plain disliked it!) sometimes think that working with numbers is boring or, at least, not fun, and that pre-schoolers shouldn't be subjected to this form of mild torture. In fact, the opposite is true. Many young children are fascinated by numbers – they know that these digits mean something, and are keen to decode the mystery of how to use numbers to communicate and understand information. Early mathematics is not just addition, and subtraction. It includes looking at patterns, measuring, sorting, locating items, counting, grouping and identifying shapes. These can all be taught through a wide range of activities and play. We have a strong focus on numeracy, and hands-on learning using all of the senses. By making maths fun, children become enthusiastic about numeracy, and in so doing, learn organically about numbers, quantities and much more.

The Education Review Office advise that the best environment for learning is one where there is a balance between activities

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that are teacher initiated and activities that are chosen by the children, but have a clear learning intention.

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


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
