Greetings

Auckland's development is moving closer.

A "framework" plan has been suggested by the Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association (aka Kumeu Community Action) to help control the area's development.

That looks to be more urgent that ever with Fletcher Living's plans for Taupaki and Riverhead, while other projects are also coming.

One is a proposed Westgate/NorthWest Shopping Centre-like development just to the northwest of the latter across State Highway 16 known as the "Spedding Block".

A rezoning of the 52-hectare block bordered by SH16, Brigham Creek Road and Trig Road in Whenuapai is proposed by Oyster Capital from Future Urban to Business-Light Industrial.

Supporting documents from 2020 indicate Spedding Road would be extended to Brigham Creek Road, and be connected via a new arterial road across SH16 from Fred Taylor Drive from the Supporting Growth Alliance (SGA) - presumably using the abutments which have already been built adjoining SH16.

Submissions on the Spedding Block private plan change proposal (PC 69) close with the Auckland Council on November 8.

Areas involved include 23-27 and 31 Brigham Creek Road, and 13, 15-19 Spedding Road, the rezoning aiming to create a new precinct with the Auckland Unitary Plan (operative in part) 2016.

The land in question involves some rural residential properties, pasture and crop land and is expected to be at least partially (if not fully) developed by

About 20% is proposed as light industrial manufacturing, 50% as distribution centres/high clearance warehousing and 30% as multiple units of between 400 square metres to 1000 square metres.

What about the associated traffic?

A transport plan provides for freight, walking and cycling links, and more.

Supporting documents say the proposal mitigates traffic impacts with the Spedding Road extension to Brigham Creek Road and that future links embrace the precinct's integration with the wider Whenuapai and Redhills precincts.

Meanwhile, COVID-19 restrictions might have seen a slight lessening of traffic congestion on and around SH16.

But don't expect that easing to continue - at least not with the all the area's growth and development.

And this will by no means be the last major project proposed for the area.

Bring on the framework plan – the sooner the better! Geoff Dobson, editor



# Northwest homes in national awards

Local builders are among those in the Top 100 Homes up for the Registered Master Builders House of the Year Competition national awards in November.

Allan Wallace Builders has a Riverhead home in the national awards in the Resene



It's billed as "Riverhead Inner Beauty", with photos taken by Melissa Thomas.

The 425sqm home has cedar cladding and a schist feature wall, while is it also described as "intelligent, economical, efficient and future-focused too".

The automated smart-home system allows the owners complete control over comfort and functionality from an app or central touchscreen.

This home is energy efficient with solar-powered heat pumps, a solar-heated pool, underfloor radiant heating and prime positioning to maximise the sun.

From low-VOC paint, sustainable timber and stone, through to low-

water usage fittings, every product in the build and within the home was considered for its ecological impact and sustainability of its supply.

Maddren Homes in Kumeu has three homes in the Top 100 for the nationals.

These include Auckland/Northland/Coromandel region Gold Award winners a Milldale show home and a Huapai home in the Group Housing New Home \$450,000-\$750,000 category.

It has another which won a regional silver award in the New Home \$1 million to \$1.5m category.

A Coatesville home has earned Glover Homes the regional Renovator \$500,000-\$1 million category Gold Award and it is in the Top 100 as well.

Registered Master Builders Chief Executive David Kelly says the awards have been recognising the very best houses, quality builders and craftsmen across New Zealand since 1991.

"Each year, we are blown away by the levels of craftsmanship and innovation delivered by Master Builders across the country. The awards are an opportunity to recognise their skills in delivering quality homes for New Zealanders."

This year the regional competition had more than 347 entries across 11 regions.

Excellence Award, and Kitchen Excellence Award.

Judges have commented on the impact COVID-19 has had on the homes they are judging, particularly with the more recent renovations.

"Since our first lockdown last year, we are seeing more people pay more attention to their homes and creating a space they can not only live in but enjoy," they say.

"We are seeing the integration of more smart systems in the home, as well as homes offices or working spaces.

"Energy efficiency and sustainable homes is another trend that has been front of mind for homeowners and builders throughout the country."

Judges won't be re-judging the Top 100 homes because of COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, instead basing them on regional scores.

While a National Awards Gala is planned on Saturday, November 20, at the Cordis Hotel in Auckland, the region's continuing restrictions may mean a virtual event could be needed.

The awards also recognise the building and construction sectors' contribution to the New Zealand economy.

"We play a vital role in New Zealand," David says.

# Riverhead old schoolhouse restoration

Tradies and those with renovation experience are needed to help restore Riverhead's old schoolhouse at the Riverhead Community Courts which will play a key role in Riverhead School's 150th sesquicentennial anniversary in March 2022.

An "Ode to the Old Girl" starts the weekend of activities on Saturday, March 19, the "Old Girl" referring to the school's original building which was relocated to the

courts to serve as clubrooms, allowing expansion of facilities at the school to cater for a rapidly increasing roll.

The March 19 events include a meet and greet at the "Old Girl" from 1pm-2pm where a coffee cart will be available during the afternoon.

Meanwhile, the Riverhead Community Courts Club (RCCC) is hard at work fundraising for the old schoolhouse's renovation, which includes running a Givealittle page with the goal of raising at least \$30,000 towards repairs, mainly for its wooden sash windows.

"Every little bit helps, whether it is for the windows, interior and exterior painting or connecting vital services (plumbing, wastewater)," RCCC chair Rachel Spencer says.

"If local painting businesses would like to give quotes or donate materials or labour please get in touch."

In addition, there is an orchard and patio, pergola and barbecue area proposed for the exterior. These additions will better connect her to the wider Riverhead War Memorial Park redevelopment and provide a focal point for community gatherings in future years, the committee adds.

The RCCC is passionate about the restoration and preservation of the community-owned Riverhead School historic schoolhouse for locals to enjoy now and for generations to come.

In 2009, the schoolhouse was relocated from the school grounds to her current site in the Riverhead War Memorial Park adjacent to the tennis courts to make way for new classrooms at the school.

The building is now owned and managed by an incorporated society (the RCCC) for the long-term use by the wider community.

The RCCC committee (including some of its members pictured) is a small group of passionate local volunteers who have taken on the responsibility and care of the schoolhouse, with the aim of raising sufficient funds to turn the building into a highly usable asset for the community.

Since relocation, the building has been used by the Riverhead Tennis Club, a group of local crafters, and temporarily as a storage facility.

It is currently not able to be let due to the lack of sanitisation (toilet and running water) and the further deterioration of the front windows which has become a health and safety concern.

The "Old Girl" is in a prime location within the Riverhead War Memorial Park but needs some love and attention to restore her to her former glory, the committee explains.

Mainly original inside - right down to the old blackboard and wooden sash windows - she is crying out to be restored to her charm of yesteryear, its grand history filled with the sound of children's laughter.

"We want her story to be continued and for her to play a larger part in the community," the committee says.

Different from the Riverhead Citizens Hall in terms of size and character, the old schoolhouse complements the offering of the larger hall.

"Once the basic work is complete, we envisage the schoolhouse being made available for the following clubs/groups: Art and/or craft classes, Yoga, Senior citizen group/youth group/parent and baby group, Gardening club, Dance classes, Small parties, Local get-togethers, Karate/Judo or similar And continuing as the base for the tennis club."

The adjacent tennis courts are well utilised by the community.

"We see the courts and the building as intrinsically linked, along with the connection to the skate park below the building," the committee says.

The courts are used by many different groups - tennis, basketball, netball, scooters and learn to ride, for instance.

# Kumeu Showgrounds events delayed or cancelled

Continuing COVID-19 restrictions in Auckland have forced the cancellation or postponement of various events scheduled for the Kumeu Showgrounds.

These include the Monster Fireworks Display which is a major fundraiser for Taupaki School.



Organisers say they've made the very hard decision to cancel the display and associated rides and stalls this year because of the uncertainty around COVID-19 levels and associated gatherings, adding they would need to be comfortable at level one to run the event - which now seems unlikely.

The event, which was intended for October 29 and usually includes a Halloween theme, is now planned for late 2022 instead.

The Food & Vines Festival scheduled for November 13 has also

And a fundraising luncheon initially planned for October 15 then November 26 is expected to be rescheduled again to February 2022 due to COVID-19 level uncertainty and the availability of keynote speaker former Prime Minister and former Helensville MP Sir John Key.

The Crusty Demons motorcycle stunt show on November 20 has also moved to February 5, 2022.

Kumeu Agricultural and Horticultural Society secretary Lizelle Westman says whether other events planned for December and January need to be rearranged still has to be determined.

### Pat Delich tribute

Local identity Patrick (Pat) Delich has died aged 84.

The former Rodney District western ward councillor of nine years (2001 to 2010 when the Auckland supercity was formed) had served as the council's works committee chair, duties including getting the Northwest's roads sealed, was a roading contractor for 50 years, grew tomatoes (Delco) at Kumeu, did a stint in real estate sales, and tackled many other tasks in his time.



Born on April 8, 1937, Pat was the youngest of 12 children to Mate and Mary Josephine, and started his schooling at St Michael's Catholic School in Remuera before completing his high school years at St Kevin's College in Oamaru, near his eldest sister Joy in Dunedin.

Pat's mum was in poor health throughout the late 1940s and early 1950s and died in 1951 when Pat was 14.

After leaving school at 15, Pat had many different jobs, including being a "grease monkey" in a garage, bus driving in Wellington, to



working in his dad's haulage business in Auckland.

Pat later worked with Bitumix on road construction around the North Island in the late 1950s and early 1960s, marrying Margaret on May 1, 1965, after which Pat bought his first truck – a TK Bedford, later sold and replaced with a Commer truck for his work in road construction, his family recall.

Sons Dominic and Damian were born in late 1965 and late 1966 respectively while the family was living at Bucklands Beach in Howick.

Pat and Margaret bought a bare four-hectare Kumeu property in 1969, intending to build a home but first putting an old railway carriage on the property with bunks at each end for weekend use while developing the place.

"Around 1970/1971 we moved up to Kumeu and rented a house on the main road while the house was being built," Dominic recalls.

"In 1971 dad sold the Commer and brought a 1969 International six-wheeler, known as a 'butterbox' because of the shape of the cab. The truck is still sitting in the shed to this day and is now over 50 years old."

The house was built labour-only as Pat sourced all materials due to his industry contacts, and used the services of a local plumbing company where a young apprentice Darryl McDonald worked, the pair remaining firm friends.

Pat continued working for Reliable Roads while glasshouses were being constructed on the Kumeu property to grow tomatoes, the first crop produced in 1979, Pat eventually winding down his trucking business in the 1980s to focus on tomato production before a bad back started to slow him down.

After many years in real estate, Pat became a Rodney councillor - always getting his point across and never avoiding controversy either, while being renowned for his dry sense of humour.

He fought for a decade to get the roundabout at the Taupaki Road/ State Highway 16 intersection, working closely with Taupaki resident Wayne Ryburn.

Following his sons' early rugby playing days in the 1970s for the then Western United Rugby Football Club (Kumeu and Helensville), Pat had a long association with the club which later became the Kumeu Rugby Football and Sports Club at Riverhead, and he was one of the founding members of the North Harbour Rugby Union for which he was made its first life member in 1996.

He was deputy chairman in the 1990s and was on the Super 10 competition organising committee with top clubs from New Zealand, Australia and South Africa.

Dominic, living in the United Kingdom, was surprised by Pat returning from one of the competitions.

"I was at home as I had broken my ankle playing the previous weekend."

Dominic recalls his parents having many dogs over the years, while Pat also loved opera music and history.

"During the years since he finished work, dad enjoyed nothing more than spending time tinkering in the shed, making things, bodging things and trying to repair things he originally bodged."

While Pat died in September, a service couldn't be held for him until October 6 at Davis Funeral Services Henderson - and it was then limited because of Auckland's COVID-19 restrictions, which included Dominic having to spend time in managed isolation and quarantine (MIQ) after travelling from the UK.

### Huapai-Kumeu Lions projects on hold

Projects planned by the Huapai-Kumeu Lions have been thwarted by the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown.

A joint project scheduled for September with hot rod enthusiasts involving members and their vehicles fronting a street-by-street canvas seeking donated non-perishable items



for the local food bank could not proceed.

In October, Lions had arranged to give support to Women's Refuge by promoting a fundraising concert performed by Kumeu Vintage and Brass bands, which also had to be cancelled for this year.

It is hoped that circumstances will allow both projects to proceed in 2022 as club members are keen to give support to worthwhile local causes working in partnership with organisations that attract community participation, the club says.

In this respect, Riverhead Scouts will be partnering with the club for their popular Lions' Book Fair scheduled for May 28 and 29 next year.

Lions Clubs NZ is part of a world-wide organisation with more than three million members offering support to worthwhile community organisations and people in need.

New members are welcome at the local club which has a dinner meeting on the first and third Tuesdays of each month in the Kumeu Community Centre.

### **Counting the cost**

Many Northwest homes and businesses affected by the late August flooding are still battling to get their properties shipshape.

One Kumeu couple are in temporary accommodation as their two-storey home is being almost completely rebuilt, and they're hoping to move back in before Christmas.

Kumeu Community Action chair Guy Wishart covers his and others' situation in his follow-up report in this edition, including the problems in getting tradies and materials.



The Kumeu pair, who we won't identify for security reasons, say they were insured but that all-up costs are running into hundreds of thousands of dollars.

They say flood waters were up to 1.7 metres high (well over head height) in some parts of their property and they lost everything, including vehicles.

The husband says the two were at home when flood waters started rising on the night of August 30, but they managed to wade to safety in just what they had on with his wife rescuing only her handbag.

After many years of living in the district, they say the flooding was the worst they had seen.

Like some 54 West and Northwest properties listed in the latest Auckland Council flooding report their home has been given a yellow placard, meaning access is restricted and that electrical systems could have been compromised.

Five properties have red placards, prohibiting entry because they're unsafe due to significant structural damage.

Losses are put at about \$56.5 million from just over 2400 claims, according to the Insurance Council of New Zealand.

About 30 industrial and commercial buildings have been checked by council building inspectors in Kumeu, most on Main Road and Shamrock Drive. Of these, two have yellow placards but no red ones have been issued.

The report says nine families were registered with the Temporary



The Rodney and Waitakere local boards considered support for flood impacted communities, and another recovery report is expected in November.

An integrated works programme that strengthens the disaster resilience of people and places is being explored as part of the local boards' 2022-2023 financial year work programmes.

Streams are in the process of being cleared to reduce any further impacts, the report notes.

Storm debris was able to be disposed of free at the Waitakere Transfer Station up to October 17 with about 103,660kg delivered.

### Kumeu Christmas parade cancelled – again

COVID uncertainty has forced cancellation of the Kumeu Rotary Christmas Parade for the second successive year. And this time a Christmas at the Showgrounds event at the Kumeu Showgrounds won't be held either.

The popular parade along Main Road (State Highway 16) through Huapai and Kumeu is usually held near the first Friday in December (December 3 this time) but co-organiser Dale Wallace says it's now planned for the end of next year. She says the cancellation is very upsetting, especially as children will have missed the opportunity to participate in the parade two years running.

But Dale says uncertainty around gatherings under COVID-19 pandemic restrictions and the Government's change of tack towards a 'traffic light system' for handling the Delta variant outbreak mean parade organisers cannot ensure complete safety around both events.

The Christmas at the Showgrounds gala which replaced last year's parade and included school performances, food trucks, a market, and a visit from Santa won't be held this time after a survey revealed most respondents still wanted a parade.

"Many people put great effort into making their floats," says Dale, adding the parade takes nearly a year of organising by a small group of volunteers. She praises the support of many, including the Auckland Council and Rodney Local Board events manager, Traffix NZ which works on road closures around the parade, people who sent in entries, the Kumeu Showrgrounds, and others involved. "This community event is worth continuing to run - hopefully, we can try again next year."

### North West Country Business Awards 2021 delayed

The popular North West Country Business Awards have this year been postponed until around Christmas due to the uncertainty with COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

"We hope to have the awards ceremony in some form towards the end of this year," North West Country Business Association chair Mark Dennis says.

Having a virtual awards event doesn't quite cut the mustard for the association, which has previously hosted the annual presentations at The Riverhead.

People enjoy attending the ceremony, mixing with others and to have a photo opportunity with others, Mark explains.

He says the COVID-19 restrictions also make it difficult to run some other aspects of the awards, such as the "secret shopper" portion which provides judges with feedback on award entrants.

The COVID1-19 restrictions (now flagged for lifting if enough people get vaccinated under a new COVID-19 Protection Framework), along with recent flooding, are another "kick in the guts" for businesses, some of which are struggling to survive, Mark adds.

He says the association will keep businesses informed.

Meanwhile, the North West Country Business Association is surveying local businesses in a bid to request the Minister of Small Business Stuart Nash to provide more certainty around getting businesses open, especially in the hospitality industry and health care.

Mark says issues include mask mandates and vaccination requirements such as people presenting a proper certificate to show they have been double jabbed, for instance.

He says businesses also want to avoid any risk of people altering or faking vaccination certificates.

North West Country Business Association manager Phelan Pirrie says after spending several weeks talking with businesses that remain closed he says the situation has become "pretty dire".

Many are unable to afford staying closed for months with little or no income and the wage subsidy not meeting all their costs such as rent, services, and more.

Mark says the lead-up to Christmas is usually the busiest time for many businesses and provides the chance to make some money to help keep the business ticking over for the next year.

He worries COVID-19 restrictions may dent that opportunity, particularly for those reliant on seasonal trade.

"They can't sell enough in many cases, even with contactless systems in place, plus there's often delivery costs and other factors involved.

"We need to be open now."

#### Flood funding

About \$8000 has so far been paid out to eight business (\$1000 each) and some to families affected by the late August flooding.

The money has come from the North West Business Association's own instant flood fighting fund and via a Givealittle page which has so far raised about \$6500 on its own.

Marks say while many businesses were probably covered by insurance for the flooding, some found the payout insufficient and in most cases also had to meet an excess payment.

"Contractors and materials have also been hard to get," he says.

Mark is pleased with the reaction to the Givealittle page, saying many people made donations which has enable some businesses to get ready for reopening.

"We haven't officially closed off the funding so people can still donate," he adds.

Mark encourages people to shop locally and support local businesses.

"It will help them to survive, and many of the local businesses provide support in some way to their local community as well."

Digital vaccination certificates are due from the Ministry of Health in late November through "My

Covid Record", or you can request a vaccination confirmation letter before then which can take up to 10 working days.

#### **COVID-19 Protection Framework announced**

A new COVID-19 Protection Framework has been announced by the Government which aims to deliver greater freedoms for vaccinated New Zealanders.

It provides pathway out of lockdown and ability for businesses and events to re-open to vaccinated New Zealanders, the Government says.

The simpler framework is intended to minimise COVID cases and hospitalisations without use of widespread lockdowns.

Auckland will move into the new framework when 90% of the eligible population in each of the three District Health Boards (DHBs) are fully vaccinated.

Up to \$940 million per fortnight is available in a Business Boost package, and \$120 million is earmarked to accelerate Maori vaccination rates

Cabinet will review COVID-19 vaccination progress on November 29.

"Our current alert level framework and elimination strategy kept us safe and the economy functioning while we vaccinated, but now as more Kiwis are protected by the vaccine we need a new plan to that moves away from lockdowns as our primary defence against the virus," Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern says.

"The simplified framework has three levels - green, orange and red. Vaccine certificates will provide greater freedoms at each level, and there will be extra public health precautions built in at higher levels to minimise the impact of COVID-19 and suppress the spread of the virus."

The new traffic light framework will allow businesses previously considered high-risk to fully open to vaccinated customers at green and orange and continue to operate with some restrictions at red. Businesses that choose to open to the unvaccinated will face restrictions to suppress the virus amongst those most likely to have it.

"Fully vaccinated people will be able to reconnect with family and friends, go to bars and restaurants and do the things they love with greater certainty and confidence. The framework also provides businesses greater certainty to plan and grow," Jacinda says.

The framework maintains the ability to move up levels when needed to control an outbreak, but is more flexible than the current alert level system, she adds.

Testing, contact tracing and isolation will continue as key tools to minimise virus spread, and localised lockdowns will still be an option if rapid growth in cases is seen in areas with high levels of unvaccinated people.

Just when the traffic light system applies isn't yet known but it's widely expected to take effect before Christmas.

# Safer Communities



Welcome to Spring!

It's a good idea to talk to your children about fire safety, how to avoid starting fires, and what to do if there's a fire in your home.

Children as young as five can learn what to do in a fire emergency. This is lifelong learning that they will take into adulthood. Children also need to understand that fire can be dangerous.

Talking about what to do in an emergency

If a fire starts in a room, a person has about 3 minutes to get out before the room is engulfed in smoke or flames that will kill them.

Teach your children to get out and stay out if there's a fire. If they see a fire or hear a smoke alarm, tell them to:

- Get out of the house FAST (using your escape plan)
- Shout "Fire Fire Fire!"
- Go to the safe meeting place that you have practiced going to with your children

Talking about fire

When talking about fire, children might ask about people dying in fire emergencies. You should provide truthful answers without making the child afraid.

You can tell your child about firefighters and how they rescue people in fires. However, sometimes firefighters might not arrive in time to rescue everyone. A fire can also be burning so fiercely that it's not possible to rescue people.

That's why it's so important to have smoke alarms and an escape plan to



know what to do in a fire. Remember, get out, stay out.

With the start of daylight savings don't forget to test your smoke alarm by pressing the button to sound the alarm. Remember you can't smell smoke while you are asleep.



A bear with a story to tell...

Our lives are made up from thousands of micro-moments or stories. Some stories we want to hold onto, to relive the feeling of and cherish forever.

It may be the story of marrying your soulmate, bringing your babies home, their first day of school, your first school ball or snuggling into daddy's shirt.

Sometimes, when it's hard to let go, it pays to have something to hold on to. One more lasting hug, reminding us of when we were able to do it in person.



On my 7th birthday, a gift arrived from my grandparents in England. The brown paper parcel, wrapped in string, was handed to me. With wide eyes I tentatively untied the string and unstuck the paper, being careful to preserve it, even though it was just brown paper. Beneath its brown paper exterior, after peeling back layers of tissue, cocooned inside was the most glorious golden teddy bear. My love affair with soft toys, tissue paper, brown paper, and string, began.

While most refer to this time of forced quarantine and isolation as "lock-down", I prefer to use the Māori word "whakahoki mai", which means to restore. This time has been a pure gift and I have used it to restore my energy and rediscover my creativity.

"Ātaahua" is the Maori word for 'beautiful'. Each doll and bear are carefully and beautifully handcrafted, using only quality fabrics. My desire is to preserve precious moments, to carry the memory of a departed loved one, or cement the relationship between parent and child by using an article of clothing that represents that special person. No two bears will ever be the same, because we are all unique and our stories different.

The delight these bring is tangible and people are often moved to tears when receiving their precious bears. They mean everything to people and I LOVE being the temporary custodian bringing to life a memory, treasured for a lifetime, and beyond.

By Robert Baden-Powell, it began as an experimental camp with just 20 boys.

The camp was a great success and proved to its organiser, Robert Baden-Powell that his training and methods appealed to young people and really worked. In January 1908, Baden-Powell published the first edition of "Scouting for Boys", and has since sold over 100 million copies, making it one of the bestselling books of all time.

Since then, over 500 million people have been Scouts, including prominent people in every field.

The first World Scout Jamboree took place in 1920 with 8,000 participants, and proved that young people from different nations could come together to share common interests and ideals. Since that first World Jamboree at Olympia in London, there have been 21 others at different locations. The last World Jamboree held in North America in 2019 was attended by 45,000 Scouts, that's more than the population of Te Atatū Peninsula, Te Atatu South and Henderson combined.

The Early Scout Programme - Scouting began as a programme for boys 11 to 18 years of age. Yet almost immediately others also wanted to participate. The Girl Guides programme was started in 1910 by Baden-Powell who designated his sister Agnes to manage it. In 1915 Robert Baden-Powell became Chairman of the Girl Guides Association, and his wife Olave, whom he married in 1912, became the new Chief Guide in 1918.



### Property market report

Activity levels and prices impacted by lockdown

Median prices for residential property across New Zealand increased by 25.5% from \$677,400 in August 2020 to a record \$850,000 in August 2021, according to the latest data from the Real Estate Institute of New Zealand (REINZ). Auckland again underpinned the strength in the New Zealand median, hitting a record median house price in August of \$1,200,000 - up 26.4% from \$949,500 in August 2020. This growth was reflected throughout the region with 5 out of 7 districts reaching new record median prices - Rodney District (\$1,280,000), Manukau City (\$1,157,000), Waitakere City (\$1,120,000), Franklin District (\$950,000) and Papakura District (\$940,000).

House prices have once again risen across the country, with every region seeing a year-on-year increase from August 2020. This latest lockdown has not dampened demand for, or confidence in, the housing market as we saw in early 2020.

Auckland has seen another record median price, the ninth record in the last 12 months - this growth is spread across the region with five of the seven districts reaching new record median prices in August.

While value is up, volume is down, with the number of residential properties sold in August across New Zealand decreased by 26.5% when compared to the same time last year (from 7,828 to 5,753) - this was the fewest properties sold for an August month since 2014. In Auckland, the number of properties sold in August decreased by 12.8% year-on-year (from 2,689 to 2,346).

With a scarcity of properties available to purchase in this market and the previous limitations of level 4 and level 3 lockdowns, the market is set for a crazy ride of low stock numbers and insatiable demand, so don't hold out for bargains in the next six months, it's the fast and the furious out there as we come to the end of the current growth cycle.

# Interest deductibility rules for property investors

Tax Deductions for interest expenses on rental properties will be restricted from 1 October 2021. This would mean that if you acquire a residential investment property on or after 27 March 2021 interest will not be tax deductible from the income you earn on your investment. The interest deductibility for residential investment properties acquired before 27 March 2021 will gradually be phased out between 1 October 2021 and 31 March 2025.

However, new builds will be exempt from these interest deductibility rules. For instance, if the property got its code compliance certificate on or after 27 March 2020 the interest will be deductible for up to 20 years from the time that the code compliance certificate is issued. The exemption will apply to both the initial purchaser of the property as well as any subsequent owner within the 20 year period.

### **Property Titles**

The New Zealand property system offers indefeasible title which means you have a right or title in property that cannot be made void, defeated or cancelled by any past event, error or omission in the title. There are different types of Title. The best form of Title is a Fee Simple Title and you can use the land as you please (provided you comply with Council Bylaws). The title for town houses and apartment buildings are Strata or Unit Titles. These can deal with as few as two units or a complex of apartments in a multi-level building. A Unit Title is ruled by the Body Corporate



which establishes their own set of rules for occupants to abide by, and charges a levy for the building maintenance, insurance and administration costs. A Leasehold Title is a right to occupy for which rent is paid and you lease the property.

Another common form of title are fee simple cross-leases which are a hybrid of the fee-simple title and the leasehold title. You own two interests in the property. Firstly a share of the fee simple title in common with the other cross leaseholders; and a leasehold interest in the particular area and building that you occupy.

The rights of each owner depend not on settled legal rules, but on the terms of the particular lease. The lease is of only the original building site. In the building is altered/extended a new flats plan needs to be deposited and new leases registered otherwise an owner has no lease of any addition - horizontal or vertical - provided they are fully attached and fully enclosed. When the owner comes to sell, the existence of such additions are a defect in title. This can only be remedied by the expensive process of cancelling the lease





### Sharing the cost of your fence with your neighbour

The Fencing Act 1978 provides that neighbours must each pay half the cost to do work on an adequate fence. This includes building a fence where there isn't one, replacing a damaged fence, or doing repairs. Neighbours can often agree on these matters without further assistance. Any agreement is enforceable and may be registered as a fencing covenant on the properties' titles.





The notice should also be clear that your neighbour has 21 days to serve a 'cross notice' or else they will be deemed to have accepted the terms in the fencing notice, including liability to pay the amount proposed. Time to plant melons, pumpkin and corn, beans and salad greens.

It's also time to stake up tomatoes, cucumbers and beans and add some summer colour by planting flowers into your garden and in hanging baskets.

#### **Spring harvests**

Harvest spinach, spring onions, lettuce and broccoli. Strawberries are ripening too so keep an eye on those. Use bird netting to make sure you eat them before the birds do!



#### The fruit and vegetable garden

- If there's room, sow corn and plant out melons and pumpkins in well composted soil. Plant a climbing bean at the base of each corn plant, the plant acts as support for the beans and they grow happily together. Try planting pumpkins in the same area as a groundcover
- It's time to sow French or runner beans if you don't have a large frame for them to climb on get dwarf varieties and grow on bamboo hoops or small teepees.
- Plant basil beneath tomato plants it's a gardening marriage made in heaven. Putting in a few marigolds alongside helps keep pests at bay too
- Keep a regime of liquid feeding and watering going during this growth period. Placing pea straw around plants in the vegetable garden helps limit evaporation
- Stake, tie up or train climbing plants along wires.

  Tomatoes, cucumbers, beans and zucchini can be grown like this, and it aids production in a small space
- Keep those summer salads going by planting salad greens such as lettuce, mesclun, radish and spring onions frequently

#### The ornamental garden

- Hanging baskets are easy: place a plastic saucer in the base of the basket to help hold water, fill with good potting mix and pop in the summer flowering plants. Liquid feed after planting and hang in a sheltered, sunny spot, watering and feeding regularly
- Plant hostas, astilbes, clivias, renga renga lilies and pulmonarias in shady areas of the garden, to brighten dark areas. Keep the slug bait around them while they establish
- After flowering keep an eye on the foliage of kowhai trees - this is the time when the voracious kowhai caterpillar starts munching. Spraying with a control (organic or chemical) will help keep the leaves in place
- **Drought proof plants for pots** Geraniums, pelargoniums and succulents need very little watering to survive, perhaps once a week at most. Just plenty of sun.
- Petunias are star performers for summer colour.
   Plant in a sunny position in the garden or grow in pots or hanging baskets



### **Rhododendrons at Awa Nursery**

Rhododendrons do well with direct light for at least part of the day and prefer dappled shade rather than excessive shade. Protection from the wind is also preferred. Ideally soil should be

Be sure not to pile the mulch right up to the trunks though. The mulch will help in keeping the soil moist and cool, provides nourishment, and limits weed growth. Prune your Rhododendron after is has bloomed to shape your plant and remove any damaged branches. ### Tips for a great lawn over Christmas

Spring has arrived and with it the grass has taken off - it's thick and lush. When freshly cut it's a pleasure to walk over. To be sure it is ready for the summer use, there are a few things you can do. Have a look at your lawn. Do you have any thistles? What about Onehunga weed prickles? They can really spoil your enjoyment of your lawn. Is the grass looking good or do you have dandelions, daisies and other weeds popping up? What about the grass itself? Have you let it go a bit over the last few months - maybe it needs a bit of a pick-me-up.

Now's the time to take action for a beautiful summer lawn. Start now and those annoying thistles and weeds can be gone and your lawn look and feel lush and beautiful when you want to be out and about on it.

Start with a targeted flat weed spray to kill those weeds (but not the grass), and then maybe a de-thatch to remove excess thatch, a little grass seed in any holes where the weeds were and then fertilise the whole lawn to promote healthy regrowth. Then arm yourself with some Onehunga weed spray and you can spray out that annoying pest before the little yellow flowers and then prickles start to appear.

If it's got away on you and is looking ready for the hay baler. It'll take several good mows to get it back under control - don't cut too much off the first time as you will remove all the green leaf and the plant will suffer due to a limited ability to feed itself, and it'll look brown and stalky. Use 3 or 4 mows in a short period of time to progressively



lower the height and the grass will adjust to the new height. Then remember the lawn golden rule - little and often.

If you or your kids love to have bbq's, games of badminton or cricket, a bit of back-lawn camping, or just general running around on the grass, then these straightforward treatments and mowing tips will see your lawn thrive and be that ready for you to enjoy through your summer.


- 1. Appliances short-circuiting: Older switchboards have a tendency to 'trip' or short-circuit when they are overloaded. This is a mechanism designed to protect the circuit from overheating and resulting in an electrical fire.
- 2. Flickering lights: While flickering lights may be caused by loose lightbulbs that need to be tightened, they can also be due to loose wiring in an old or damaged switchboard.
- 3. An overcrowded appearance: If your switchboard's wiring looks overcrowded, it probably needs upgrading. This is particularly important if you plan on introducing additional devices to your home such as spa pools or air conditioning units. These require dedicated circuits to power them and prevent your switchboard from overloading.
- 4. Your Switchboard still has fuses: Ceramic fuses are outdated and are a sign that your electrical system is at risk. While they function the same as a modern-type circuit breaker (shutting power off in the event of short circuit or overload), they cannot do it at the same speed And the faster the power is terminated, the less damage will be done.

An upgrade of your switchboard is not a big investment for the sake of your family's safety.

### **Woolly nightshade**

Woolly nightshade is a spreading, capsicum-smelling shrub or small tree growing up to 10m tall, with all parts covered in dusty hairs, and whitish, branching, soft-woody stems. It was originally from South America. Velvety, oval, grey green leaves are whitish underneath with prominent 'ears' at the base which clasp



the stem. It is usually quite easy to spot as it is paler than surrounding plants. Dense clusters of mauve to purple flowers with yellow anthers are visible year-round and are followed by clusters of round berries that ripen from hard green to soft, dull yellow.

It is a nasty weed and spreads quickly, forming dense stands which crowd out other plants. Even though the berries are poisonous to people, kererū and other birds can safely eat them, spreading seeds

over large areas through their droppings. Each plant produces thousands of seeds, which also fall and grow around parent plants. The dust from the leaves and stems can irritate the skin, eyes, nose, and throat. Woolly nightshade grows in a large range of areas locally, including gullies, roadsides, farms, and wasteland, all well as urban areas - anywhere that birds visit. ### Kanika Park Cat Retreat

The cat (Felis catus) is a domestic species of small carnivorous mammal. It is the only domesticated species in the family Felidae and is often referred to as the domestic cat to distinguish it from the wild members of the family. A cat can either be a house cat, a farm cat or a feral cat; the latter ranges freely and avoids human contact. Domestic cats are valued by humans for companionship and their ability



to hunt rodents. About 60 cat breeds are recognised by various cat registries

The cat is similar in anatomy to the other felid species: it has a strong flexible body, quick reflexes, sharp teeth and retractable claws adapted to killing small prey. Its night vision and sense of smell are well developed. Cat communication includes vocalisations like meowing, purring, trilling, hissing, growling and grunting as well as cat-specific body language. A predator that is most active at dawn and dusk (crepuscular), the cat is a solitary hunter but a social species. It can hear sounds too faint or too high in frequency for

human ears, such as those made by mice and other small mammals. It secretes and perceives pheromones.

### Lockdown blues

Again it looks like we are going to be stuck here for a while. So here are a few tips to help keep you, your family and delivery persons coming to your home safe.

In lockdown 2020 reports from the UK showed a huge 400% increase in dog bites. Many of our dogs are used to us being



out during the day so when we are all stuck at home, the kids are bored and as working parents we are trying to get our usual amount of work done as well, we may see some behavioural changes in our pets. Where once our dogs had been happy and comfortable around family members some may start to move away, many may became more attention seeking and because of our stress levels and uncertainty our dogs can pick up on our feelings and change as well. Just like us our dogs like to have time alone and if we don't give our dogs space we may see some aggressive behavioural changes.

Please remind your children that if your dog moves away and is trying to rest, leave it alone. Give them comparisons such as if they are watching their favourite TV programme and someone keeps interrupting them or annoying them how does it make them feel.

Tips for all:

A wagging tail - many of us have been told that this is a sign that the dog is happy. Unfortunately this is not always true. Research has shown us the tail wagging shows that the dog is engaging with something in its environment. They could be engaging in a positive or negative way. The Dog Safe Workplace has videos of aggressive dogs with their tails wagging.

Rolling on its back - again many of us think this is because they want their belly rubbed. Again not true. They are actually telling us that they are scared and small so please don't hurt me.

Bringing you their toy - yes they are showing you their toy and want you to play with them. Not always true. They may want you to play with them. Though this is not always the case and if you go to take the toy or pick up the ball they may try to snatch it back which could result in a bite. Also there may be certain rules that need to be followed or commands given when playing with that particular dog.



# Hibiscus and Rose Tea Jelly Tipice creams

A perfect recipe for those warmer summer days that are on their way to us.

The flavour from the hibiscus flowers and rose buds in the jelly part of this ice cream are really quite stunning and delicious. You could use any tea flavours you like to make



the jelly, or even use wine, cider or kombucha along with tea.

Jelly ingredients: 3/4 cup water,  $1\,T$  rose buds (heaped),  $1\,T$  hibiscus flowers (heaped),  $2\,T$  maple syrup,  $2\,1/2$  teaspoons cornflour to thicken the mixture.

Ice cream ingredients: 175g frozen banana (approximately 2 medium bananas), 162g (approx.) frozen pineapple juice (take 1 tin of pineapple pieces, strain the juice off and freeze in ice cube trays, use all of the frozen juice), 2/3 cup coconut cream, 80g pineapple pieces, 1 T icing sugar (this makes an excess of ice cream which can be frozen for future use or made into a daiquiri by adding some Bacardi).

Chocolate coating ingredients: 2T dark cocoa, 2T maple syrup, 4 T coconut oil, (or for a richer and thicker coating, try Whitakers 72% dark chocolate instead).

Method - jelly: 1) Make the tea by adding the boiled water to the hibiscus and rose buds in a heat proof jug. 2) Stir and allow to steep for 5-10 minutes, then strain and add the tea to a small pot, along with the maple syrup and bring to a boil. 3) In a small dish, add 2 teaspoons (approximately) of cold water to the corn flour and mix well. 4) Turn the heat down on the stove and stirring the tea vigorously, slowly pour in the corn flour mixture. 5) Keep stirring until the mixture becomes clear and thickens. 6) Remove from the heat and allow to cool to a luke-warm temperature. 7) Divide the mixture between four ice block moulds and freeze while you make the ice cream.

Method - ice cream: 1) Add all of the ingredients to a high-speed blender and on a low setting, carefully blend everything until it is well combined. You'll need to use the tamper to push the mixture down into the blades as it will become very thick. 2) Spoon the mixture on top of the jelly mixture in the ice block moulds. 3) Add your ice block stick to each ice cream at this point. 4) Return to the freezer and freeze for several hours or until hard.

Method - chocolate coating: 1) Melt the coconut oil, then add the maple syrup and cocoa powder. Mix well. 2) Have a baking tray lined with tin foil ready to go so you can place the coated ice creams

on there. (Due to the tricky nature of the chocolate coating and the melting ice cream, you may have to keep the tray in the freezer and 'ferry' each newly coated ice cream to the freezer). 3) Run the ice block moulds under hot water to loosen them, and carefully pry them out as you need them. 4) Spoon the chocolate coating over the ice cream until it is well covered. 5) Freeze until ready to eat.

Notes: If the jelly tip falls off the ice cream when you attempt to chocolate coat it, simply sit it back on top of the ice cream and gently push it together. The chocolate will help to hold it in place.





N-Acetyl cysteine (NAC) has a "gazillion" health benefits. Ranging from improving mental health to fighting viral infections and much more in between. Which makes it interesting in today's environment of high stress caused by a viral pandemic.



Mental Health:

Preventing post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is one of NACs likely mental health benefits. And most of us are experiencing some form of stress currently. NAC has also shown benefits in helping with

age-associated memory impairment, manic depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder, Parkinson's disease, and schizophrenia.

What about the immune system benefits?

"Google" NAC and Covid and you will get a heap of information on the effectiveness of NAC which I haven't had time to properly review. However, I am aware that NAC may improve the function of many immune cells like white blood cells such as lymphocytes, neutrophils, and phagocytes. There have been studies showing benefits in influenza and AIDS.

The Respiratory System:

NAC may produce benefits in preventing and treating acute respiratory distress syndrome. It has also been used in conditions such as asthma, bronchitis, pneumonia, and pulmonary fibrosis. It breaks down mucous in the lungs which makes it quite helpful.

I have even read somewhere that when applied to the skin it can prevent wrinkles.

The human body makes it for its own use. To do this, you need to eat adequate amounts of protein and the supportive nutrients like the B vitamins. But you can take extra NAC in capsules, in powdered form, or intravenously.

Hospitals use intravenous NAC to treat paracetamol overdose. The reason they use it in intravenous form is that NAC has a slight, sulphur-like flavour which many people don't like.

You must be careful about your source of NAC, as it only has to meet food standards which are not as high as medicine standards, and it is very susceptible to moisture.



Plastic! Okay so they primarily use plastic dredged from the sea or recycled- but now its in circulation its just as important to keep in there and not in landfill. ## The lowdown on protein powders

We all know how important! protein is and I have written about this before.

To recap, we need protein for the structure of our body for the growth, maintenance and repair of all our tissues and to transport our nutrients to our cells. If you haven't got around to getting your first shot yet, I'd really encourage you to get out and get it done, so that you're fully vaccinated in time for summer.

Even if you didn't make it along to Super Saturday, getting vaccinated is really easy to do: you can book online at bookmyvaccine.nz or by calling the COVID-19 Vaccination Healthline on 0800 28 29 26.

Some vaccination centres don't even require a booking - you can simply turn up and get your shot when it suits you. Check out covid19.govt.nz to find somewhere close to you.

If it's been more than three weeks since your first dose, you take advantage of the chance to get fully vaccinated - there's no need to wait the full six weeks until your original appointment. Just make sure that if you do get your second dose before your scheduled appointment you cancel your booking so someone else can take the spot.

More than two million New Zealanders are now fully vaccinated, and if you're one of them, there are still ways you can support our vaccination rollout. You chat with family members about getting your vaccine and encourage them to get theirs, or offer to book an appointment for someone who is having trouble doing it on their own. Every extra person who gets vaccinated is another layer of protection for our communities, so your actions will make a difference.

## Phelan's Local Board update

The announcement that both Labour and National have agreed to enable three-storied housing to be built bypassing Auckland Council's Unitary Plan is yet another blow to efforts to address the yawning gap in infrastructure across Auckland.

While Local Board's aren't responsible for transport infrastructure, we're already way behind the level of investment needed for community infrastructure such as improvements to our towns, parks, and sports facilities. There is little to indicate where the money we need is going to come from, we are entering another year with very limited capital spending and all we're really doing is trying to keep our existing assets maintained.

National's Special Housing Areas (SHA) kicked off the current situation. It didn't do a thing to address housing affordability and simply created a mess by overriding the structure plans for Kumeu & Helensville and used legislation to force Auckland Council to accept more housing despite it there being no funding to provide the infrastructure this new housing would need.

That was 2013, here we are heading into 2022, nine years later, and none of the roading agreed to at the time with the government has been built. The traffic and associated issues have grown worse, little to none of the funding needed has been spent and

the government's latest bi-partisan solution is to put in yet more housing while ignoring the infrastructure funding issue.

Auckland Council's Unitary Plan provides a clear blueprint for growth, within the plan, there is provision for hundreds of thousands of new homes across Auckland. The plan allows for growth in appropriate areas where the infrastructure can be provided within the limits of Auckland Council (and ratepayers) ability to fund it. Places to build houses, including much-needed high-density houses around planned transport corridors, isn't the problem, funding the public transport, roads, water, sewerage, and community infrastructure are.

It now appears this is all being thrown to one side. That would possibly not be a bad thing were the government to have come up with a realistic infrastructure funding plan. Unfortunately, the \$3.8b funding package announced earlier in the year is for the whole of the country, not just Auckland, and we need three times that amount just to catch up with current needs.

Sadly, successive governments led by both major parties have gone for the easy announcements such as the latest one and avoided making the tough calls about addressing the billions of dollars required to provide a liveable city.

What does this mean locally?

Based on our experience to date it means more traffic misery, insufficient public transport, local parks and facilities not coping with the demand, and more frustration and anger directed at a council that has been removed from the ability to influence the outcomes for the community's benefit. It certainly isn't making for a liveable city.

# Flood reflections – the aftermath

Kumeu Community Action (aka Kumeu-Huapai Residents and Ratepayers Association) chair Guy Wishart reflects on the weeks since the Kumeu and surrounding districts flooding.

It has been two months since the devastating flooding in the Northwest and West of Auckland.



Few people seemed to be unaffected. My dentist mentioned flooding issues at his Henderson home, the flooring company giving quotes telling me they still had their showroom walls cut open. Our electrician told me his mother's Housing NZ home in Ranui was condemned and her valuables left in the rooms were stolen after she was moved to emergency housing.

Most of us affected were likely insured, some were not insured enough or some not at all. We all found out that flooding was not considered a natural disaster by some insurance companies.

The railway line and signaling into Kumeu were damaged along with millions of dollars in damaged property, stock and household items.

It turns out that if you have never been involved in a large event like a flood, earthquake or fire, you have no idea just how difficult the process of getting your life and property back together is.

How does the process work? Who will be assessing the damage? Who is drying your property out? Who pays for the skips that contain the sodden and damaged remains of what were your walls, carpets,

beds, fried electrical gear, and more?

I must admit that when we moved to Kumeu eight years ago, with two hectares, a barn, big garage and more space around you, the temptation to keep "useful" stuff for use at a later date appealed to a not so sensible part of me.

Family and friends who realised you had more storage than them started dropping "useful" stuff off that they had no use for or space to keep it in. This meant that on the morning of August 31, most of this "useful" stuff like Gib board, fridges and general garage and barn stuff was lost in the dirty brown water that surged its way through our property.

We were told that we had a "replacement" insurance policy, but we learnt that this didn't apply to everything and that the "present day value" of some of your prized "personal effects" like my favourite Doc Marten boots was not that great when depreciation and their age was added in, making them difficult, if not impossible, to replace.

Cars and tractors that are insured for third party, fire and theft are not covered by "natural disasters" such as floods as presumably these are too common.

The ABS, brake and airbag lights on the dashboard of flooded vehicles stayed on for two cars, meaning you can't get a warrant and registration. You are forced to sell them for parts. Those that are fully insured need to be assessed, but at level 4 that wasn't possible.

At level 3 the garages opened and then came the news that most of your vehicles' wiring and computers will probably stop working soon as they are corroding away with quiet menace.

The car/4x4 must be replaced - don't consider that it is working now or that this is a car that is hard to replace as later this year it probably won't be working anymore. By this time there could have been other factors that contributed to its demise.

There is a shortage of builders and tradies out there, so not many flood affected properties or houses have started having their insulation, Gib, plastering, painting, flooring, plumbing and electrical reconnections done as yet.

Shortages also exist in the supply of flooring and other imported and local building supplies. We are told there will be a delay of months to get matching flooring for our place, meaning sometime next year things may be back to where they were on the night of

The anxiety around rainfall has induced a type of extended trauma in some of us. We now look at the rain radar and weather warnings with a greater level of concern.

On the evening of September 23, another larger slow moving low pressure positioned itself over the upper North Island. My neighbour and I found ourselves outside at 3am checking water levels and I drove to Taupaki to see how far below the bridge the water was at 4am.

We are waiting for an early flood warning system that we desperately

need so our low-lying areas don't have to imagine what is happening in the depths of the night.

We also need increased budgets for the unclogging and widening of the waterway and streams that carry the bulk of the flood waters. If the recent flooding of the Northwest and West of Auckland is not enough to prioritise Auckland Council budgets to deal with this huge issue, it is hard to imagine what would.

## Sayers Says It

Mayor Phil Goff has been enjoying my full support around his decision to give the thumbs down to the government's Three Waters Reform programme.

The government wants to take control of all of Auckland's water assets. Working collaboratively, we also both agreed the reform should not be allowed to be made mandatory. This was eventually supported unanimously by all of the councillors.

I also worked closely with the Mayor to gain a greatly increased budget for upgrading the unsealed roading network from \$1 million per year following the "Emergency Budget" to \$12 million per year. This being critically important for health, safety and environmental reasons

Abruptly, however, the government has redirected its share of Auckland Transport's funding from new roading projects into cycleways, walkways and public transport.

This has scuttled the \$12 million a year budget, with only \$4 million per year able to be salvaged, funded from the regional fuel taxes and rates.

Although the Mayor expects me to consistently hold the flame to his feet about employee costs, getting back to core council business, and stopping wastage and overspending, there is a healthy professional relationship between us which is overall important for Rodney.

The Mayor also knows my stance about him either wanting to increase rates above 3.5% next year, or alternatively sneaking in yet another targeted rate. My concern is substantiated by the persistent trend, year upon year, of the council reaching ever deeper into ratepayers' pockets. Few elected members have proven they are prepared to hold the Mayor to account.

The Rodney Local Board has been delivering strongly on its

objectives. This is good news for our communities.

Although the Rodney Local Board transport targeted rate remains controversial there are positive urban based projects being completed, primarily supported from the budgets allocated to them in partnership from the Mayor and councillors.

I do have concerns about a growing inequity gap between our urban and rural communities. Our rural families pay their rates, the council's targeted rates, the regional fuel tax and the Rodney Local Board transport targeted rate, along with other council charges.

However, the majority of the rural money collected is not spent back in the rural areas, but rather is used to support the growth in our urban centres.

This is why I am working hard to get the road sealing and unsealed roading maintenance budgets up. I take great encouragement from the citizens of our townships who agree and who are appalled at the state of the rural roads.

Rodney people have always stuck together and we must continue to do so.

New Zealand is still going through difficult and unprecedented times with the outbreak of the Delta variant. I know many of our people in Rodney may be feeling overwhelmed at this time.
