Intro

The voting papers are out for the Local Body elections, with voting closing in mid October and I have two strong candidates in mind. We are now required to pick the best board members to serve us for the next three years, so have a look at the local candidates and their campaigns to see who will serve you best. The Unitary Plan (Auckland Future Zoning) prescribes Auckland's growth as "a little bit up and a little bit out," as Auckland gains a projected further million people in the next 30 years. The decision is also made more difficult in that the Unitary Plan attempts to create a balance of traditional suburban living with growing intensification and expansion into rural areas. So after 22,000 submissions, 250 meetings and 11 weeks of public scrutiny, last week the council spent five days redrafting the plan which will be released (hopefully) on the 30th September 2013. The Plan with amendments will be out for public submissions until some date in late January or mid February, to be set by the Auckland Council. Involvement by our Community Board and Council and Councillors will be important. Whoever we elect will need to be a strong advocate for our needs. Without a total commitment by each Board Member to our area, the community will suffer. What is certain is the next 3 years will see the Unitary Plan grind its way through the legal processes before it is enforced. Please do your homework and vote carefully! On a lighter note, spring fever is in the air! Time to clean out those cobwebs, spruce up your home and gardens and get set for a summer of long, lazy days, BBQ's and spending time outside with family and friends....once the weather clears that is. Check your smoke alarms and enjoy the extra time daylight savings brings to us all.

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DECISION TIME AND The Unitary Plan

The voting papers are out for the Local Body elections, with voting closing in mid October. We are now required to pick the best Board Members to serve us for the next three years. That from my perspective is difficult to do, for the first term of the Auckland Council has produced very little in Kumeu-Huapai that the community can see as real progress. That perhaps is not surprising in that the Auckland Councils were settling into the task of combining the old Council and formulating a new direction. The decision is also made more difficult in that the Unitary Plan (Auckland Future Zoning) will be released on the 30th September 2013. The Plan with amendments will be out for public submissions until some date in late January or mid February, to be set by the Auckland Council. Many details of the Plan have been revised with Council, with little contact with the community. The 25,000 feedback submissions were acknowledged, but no contact made with groups. I suspect the time frame set by Council wouldn't allow it. Given that the Government refused the enforcement of the rules from the date of advertising, this has forced the Auckland Council to release the document on election time for a full consultation process. That includes rights of appeal to the Environment Court. That is how it should be! What is certain is the next 3 years will see the Unitary Plan grind its way through the legal processes before it is enforced. Involvement by our Community Board and Council, Councillors will be important. Whoever we elect will need to be a strong advocate for our needs. Without a total commitment by each Board Member to our area, the community will suffer. The Township of Kumeu will have a Supermarket rise out above the timber piles and that will start a summer season of growth. The Huapai North subdivision is waiting for the 1st October start of the earthworks season, so changes will be visible this summer. Vote carefully! We also received an unusual request to help fill up a Steam Engine with water that stopped at Waitakere train station on its way to Helensville. It was very impressive sight and great piece of history to see up close.

SAFER COMMUNITIES

Too many people die in our community. Accidents usually can be avoided with some planning and prevention, Two messages from Kumeu Police and New Zealand Fire Service



A huge focus for Kumeu Police is road trauma and how to prevent it. Too many people die on our roads. Crashes occur for a reason, many of which can easily be prevented. Kumeu Police are focussing on the "fatal five" road policing problems which include Alcohol and Drugs, Speed, Restraints,

Licensing and young drivers and Dangerous/Careless drivers. We will be targeting high risk and repeat offenders and focussing on prevention strategies in an attempt to prevent serious crashes and injury from occurring. Here are some simple tips for you to help us keep our roads safe; don't drink and drive - statistics show more than half of alcohol-related fatalities occur on rural roads, so organise a sober driver, and look after your friends and family. Reduce your speed and drive to the road and whether conditions. Make sure your vehicle is safe and roadworthy. Parents - make sure your kids comply with their license conditions. Wear your seatbelt - it may save your life. Abide by the road rules and be patient and courteous to other drivers. Serious crashes affect everyone involved, so please be careful out there and do your part to help us reduce road trauma and make our community safer. Everyone will be changing their clocks when New Zealand Day Light saving starts on 29 September. Why not take a few moments to test your smoke alarm at the same time? It takes no time at all and could save your life. Fire kills - you can prevent it. Change Your Clock, Check Your Smoke Alarm is a campaign run by the New Zealand Fire Service to encourage people to check and replace smoke alarm batteries when putting their clocks back an hour. The New Zealand Fire Service says smoke alarms act as an early warning device to give people crucial minutes to get out of a burning house. Fires start quietly and grow quickly. When you're asleep you can't smell smoke and can't detect a fire. Without a detection device, a fire could start anywhere in your home without you knowing.

A smoke alarm sounding could be the first warning there is a fire and could be the difference between life and death. So while smoke alarms can't put out the fire, they can save lives. However, a smoke alarm can only warn you of fire if the battery is working. Some batteries need replacing every year. People should get into a habit of checking and changing alarms on a set day, such as daylight savings. If you still don't have a smoke alarm, make this the day to install some in your home – in every sleeping area, living area, hall and on every level of your home. Alarms can be cleaned by vacuuming them gently. As part of the promotion the Fire Service will check smoke alarms, install batteries and provide fire safety advice to householders.

EVENTS AT KUMEU ART CENTRE

Time Space and Flow 7 - 19 October 2013. An Exhibition by Jago Neal at Kumeu Art Centre.



Artist and photographer Jago Neal moved to west Auckland from London seven years ago. Since then he has displayed his work in local galleries, painted public murals, won a Trust painting award and been involved in the Waitakere Open Studios. In this, his first solo show since 2007, he displays a range of work including; drawings, etchings, large mixed media panoramas, black and white film, pinhole and digital colour photographs that focus primarily on natural forms, light, and pattern. Jago says "My intention in creating my images, using all media, is to explore and understand my environment. My starting point in my work is often with photography. I find this enables me to record and later reflect on the world around me. I often incorporate the photograph in my work which I find helps retain the integrity of the image while also allowing me to develop my ideas further, to give a more thoughtful and deeper meaning."

THE WEB - UNSPUN

So far we have chosen our key phrase for our page, tuned our 'Meta Title', 'Meta Description' and 'Meta Keywords' on our page and now we need to carry on with some additional tuning on our page before we look at factors external to our website. In our content area on the page we normally have a heading and then content that follows the first heading. The first heading needs to be the highest level (HTML) heading <h1> which the search engines look for. In this heading you should include your key phrase and in the content that follows 'sprinkle' your key phrase carefully without over-doing it. Any images that you have in your content should have a 'Title' and 'Alt Description' relating to what the image is about which is also much better for SEO. On a WordPress website, the name of the page when creating the page becomes the first heading on the page <h1> so you should tune your key phrase for your page in the name of the page. The image below shows the page title up the top, then the actual page name that appears when you bring the page up in a browser and below, you can see the first heading is the same name on the actual page. HOW DO MOST CHILDREN LEAN TO READ

At Country Bears Early Childhood Centre we hope to encourage parents and whanau to understand the importance of encouragement and engagement throughout all aspects of supporting positive communication/listening skills. Also to recognize how significant their children's feelings are, and take time to listen/explain. If we can work together and have corresponding understandings of how and when, we will empower our children to develop, to learn, to read and write! Reading and writing. At the same time as they are gaining listening and speaking skills, young children are learning about reading and writing. They listen to favorite stories and retell them on their own. They may play with alphabet blocks, point out the logo on a sign for a favorite restaurant, draw pictures, scribble and write letters and words and watch as adults read and write for pleasure and to get jobs done. Young children make numerous language discoveries as they play, explore, and interact with others. Language skills are primary avenues for cognitive development because they allow children to talk about their experiences and discoveries. Children learn the words used to describe concepts such as up and down, and words that let them talk about past and future events. At Country Bears we offer many play experiences that support children's emerging literacy skills. Sorting, matching, classifying and sequencing materials such as beads, a box of buttons, or a set of coloured cubes, all these contribute to children's emerging literacy skills. Rolling playdough and doing fingerplays help children strengthen and improve the coordination of the small muscles in their hands and fingers. They use these muscles to control writing tools such as crayons, markers and brushes. 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TUBE WEAN NZ NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

My name is Rebecca and I am Mum to identical twin boys Caleb and Jayden (now 3 years old) who were born premature at 34 weeks. Both boys had Nasogastric tubes (NG tube) to start with, then Jayden managed to drink whereas Caleb never did. Caleb had a NG for a year and then a gastrostomy (MIC-KEY button). At the age of 14 months Caleb was diagnosed with mild Hypotonic Cerebral Palsy which didn't help with his ability to eat (Caleb also has a life threatening heart condition called Pulmonary Vein Stenosis and Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension). We have worked really hard on developing Caleb's oral skills and he will now eat some food (puree, yoghurt, jelly, ice cream and has just started having plain pasta) but what he consumes orally is not enough to sustain life so he is given a high energy, nutritionally complete drink called Fortini via his tube. We were really hoping that he would be eating properly by now but unfortunately he is not. To say that having a tube fed child has been hard is an understatement.

The level of stress that we have experienced specifically because Caleb is tube fed has been hard to bear at times. Although I have learnt to place a MIC-KEY button myself, it is something that a Mum should never have to experience. When Caleb had an NG tube I spent most of my days watching Caleb to make sure he or Jayden didn't pull out his tube, as the process of placing a tube is traumatising for all of us. Caleb has the ability to eat and the best thing for him would be if he was totally weaned from his tube. In New Zealand we as parents and caregivers do not receive adequate support and advice regarding weaning our children off their tubes and that is why we need a dedicated tube weaning specialist team to be established. Tube Wean NZ is a pro-active group based in Wellington that has been established by a group of concerned and affected Mums who have had or still have a tube fed child. Tube Wean NZ have drawn up a petition to put to the government and proper health officials by early next year. The main objective of this petition is to initiate the support of our Health System to implement an intensive rapid weaning program, based on the Graz Method from Austria. Thank you for taking the time to read our story. We need your help to raise awareness so we can get as many signatures as we can for the tube fed children of New Zealand.

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FAVOURITE STICKY DATE PUDDING



Ingredients: 450ml water 275g dried pitted dates, chopped 1 teaspoon bicarb soda 100g butter, softened 275g caster sugar 3 large eggs 275g self-raising flour 1 teaspoon vanilla essence

For the butterscotch sauce

160g brown sugar 1 cup (250ml) cream 200g butter

Preparation: 20min > Cook:40min > Ready in: 1hour

1) Preheat oven to 180 degrees C. Grease 20cm x 30cm rectan gular baking dish.

2) Bring water and dates to the boil in a medium saucepan. Stir in the bicarb soda. Cool.

3) Beat butter and sugar in a small bowl with electric beaters until light and fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in the vanilla. Stir in the flour and the date mixture. Pour into dish; bake for 40 minutes.

4) For the butterscotch sauce: combine the sugar, cream and butter in a saucepan; stir over a medium until smooth. Bring to the boil. Remove from the heat. Serve the pudding drizzled with the sauce. designhand

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
