Local Board Plan -

Some strong messages came through in your plan submissions: Transport, including roads and footpaths; and Mainstreet upgrades including community led planning and things like toilet upgrades. There were also strong pushes for community involvement in planning around population growth.

The Board is preparing to focus on these things because that's what we've heard from you. However, with the lid being kept on budgets this means some things will need to wait while we invest in the infrastructure you are telling us you want. Once these projects are completed then we can realign our attention.

Personally I am pleased the Board will start to do a few things really well rather than many things just OK and I welcome this realignment of spending focus.

Watercare invests in Rodney -

There's a perception that our rates contribution in Rodney is not matched by spending, so I have been slowly digging the numbers out of the reports we receive. I'm some way from getting a definitive answer on how much we get versus our contribution.

We had a report from Watercare recently

and I was surprised at the level of spending across Rodney – a lot of it on upgrading outdated and failing infrastructure from Rodney Council days – Watercare has invested over \$67 million in Rodney from 2011 to 2014.

# **CAPITAL GAINS TAX**

Properties selling post-election usually involves a catch up period for those who held off buying until the election was over. The best preparation for sellers is to have an up-to-date LIM report. Secondly, it pays to fix things which might be adverse in the purchaser's builder report. Capital gains tax and how it works - any proposed capital gains tax will probably follow the Australian model. This means that the family home is exempt but any second house is not. On balance, it will not make any difference to most purchasers who will only own one house at a time. The capital gain is pegged to a valuation date and will only be taxed when you sell, say at 15%. This means there should be no reason to be concerned if you plan to live in your house for a long time. 
# DANSWAN LAW IS MOVING

# **SAFER COMMUNITIES**

Here are some ways of minimising crime in your area:

- Make sure that all the youth in the neighbourhood have positive ways to spend their spare time, through organised recreation, tutoring programs, part-time work, and volunteer opportunities.
- Set up a Neighbourhood Watch or a community patrol, working with police. Make sure your streets and homes are well-lit.
- Build a partnership with police, focused on solving problems instead of reacting to crises. Make it possible for neighbours to report suspicious activity or crimes without fear of retaliation.
- Clean up the neighbourhood! Involve everyone teens, children, senior citizens. Litter, abandoned cars, and run-down buildings tell criminals that you don't care about where you live.
- Work with schools to establish drug-free, knife-free zones; work with recreation officials to do the same for parks.
- Develop and share a phone list of local organisations that can provide counselling, job training, guidance, and other services that neighbours might need.
- Report a crime if you witness it or something you suspect might be a crime. Agree to testify if needed.

# FROM YOUR COUCH TO 5 KM

A couch to 5km run group kicks off at Kumeu Gym in October. This 10 week block includes a weekly Wednesday night training session, with the package also including a week by week training programme, coach on call plus plenty of essential tips. Kumeu Gym owners, Rob and Cassie Keegan had identified a demand from members for running guidance, advice on technique and a regular group, so they have teamed up with running coach, Claire Smith. A runner for over 20 years and a coach for over 7, Claire believes the 'Couch to 5km' concept is a perfect starting point, especially for this time of year. 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

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
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## THIS MONTHS CATTLE SALES

to sit down and sew. The biggest thing to remember, your child needs to be able to easily reach the foot pedal so make sure the table is the right height. 2. Introduce them to the sewing machine. Explain what each part does and how to thread the machine and wind the bobbin. 3. Provide basic safety lessons. Like keeping fingers away from the moving needle. Show them how to hold the fabric as it is pulled through the feeder. 4. Teach basic sewing skills. Like straight stitch, back stitching and zigzag. 5. Provide fabric and other supplies. Give them some scrap fabric, a small pair of scissors, some cotton thread, an unpicker, pins and needles. 6. Use teaching resources found online. There are some great resources found online for beginners that you can find easily with a simple Google search. Skip to My Lou has printable mazes and dot to dots that are excellent for teaching kids to sew straight lines and pivot at corners. Or come in and I will print these off for you for FREE! # COUNCIL FRONT THE COMMUNITY

About 100 attended the Kumeu-Huapai Ratepayers meeting at Soljans Winery Restaurant on 9th September, to hear from the four Council Representatives. Penny Hulse and Penny Webster represented the Council and Senior Planners Roger Blakely and Penny Pirrit presented the Growth Strategies and the Unitary Plan issues to the group.

What was important was that they confirmed to all that the expected population growth in the area (as a result of the Future Urban Boundary and potential created by it) will give us a population of 20,000-30,000 residents. That is larger growth than first thought and it naturally triggers the urgent need for infrastructure planning.

Penny Webster promised a meeting with Auckland Transport & the New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) before the end of the year. Penny will be held to that! What was clear to all was that the 'elephant wasn't in the room' - namely NZTA

and Auckland Transport - they have yet to surface with how and when the infrastructure will occur, and where.

We will need to ensure the transport group are here after the election so we can make progress. With the population numbers confirmed, the changes needed for roading, schools and Reserves have to be identified early so that long term solutions are transparent to the Community. Structure planning has been confirmed as about three years away, and will only be started after the Unitary Plan is substantially completed. Council staff indicated lack of staff to complete the task as the reason for the delays. With 500 Planners employed it does raise some serious questions about Council's performance and priorities.

Deputy Mayor Penny Hulse confirmed that the four SHA's applied for by land-owners in the District have been declined by the Auckland Council. The progression of these will be as part of the Unitary Plan submissions and decisions. This means the consideration of those areas, which haven't been made public, will come through in the same process as other individual submissions. That is how it should be!

On the 16th September I received information about the concept of the 'North-West Busway Project' being presented to



The proposal links Auckland City to Westgate and the North Shore. The proposal doesn't provide for any consideration of linkages by Buses to Kumeu. The three local Boards at Henderson, Whau (New Lynn) & Waitakere Ranges made comments on the proposal but nothing from our Rodney Board. If appears that Rodney has been left out of being consulted. Given that the growth is projected to 30,000 people in the next 30 years, it makes sense to have Kumeu-Huapai factored into early planning.

Finally I have to say something about the Auckland Council wage costs. Having 1780 staff on over \$100,000 each means we will never have sufficient funds allocated to our Local Board for community projects. Council staff are increasing and so is the overall cost of wages, so the greater the cost of staff overheads the less there is to spend on capital works or infrastructure. No one seems willing to grasp the nettle of having to reduce staff and therefore costs, so the Council can provide value for money. 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














### **DAFFODIL SUCCESS**



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# PEAS AND PLANTS PLEASE

From sowing peas to planting flowers, there is a lot you can do in your garden now that spring is here! Spring is here and your garden should be bursting into life! Get seeds and plants in the ground and give lawns and citrus a feed this month.

Sow peas - Peas and sugar snaps relish the cool of spring but come summer, peas get mildew - so squeeze in one more crop now before it's too late. For a decent feed of podded peas, you need at least 24 plants. Sow 'Dwarf Massey' (Mc-Gregor's, Egmont Seeds) for high yields. Grow peanuts in pots - Frost-tender pea-

nuts need a long, warm summer to produce a crop, so they're easier to pamper in big pots. Sow in potting mix, position in full sun and water regularly. Resist the urge to hoe or fork out weeds around peanut plants as you're liable to accidentally cut the thin, umbilical cord-like stalks that attach the nuts (which form underground) to the plant.

Plant flowers - If you want to grow food, you need to feed bees! Sow phacelia, borage, bergamot and anise hyssop in any gaps.

Feed lawns - A good meal will turn lawns from yellow to green. So if you don't want your grass to resemble an Aussie rugby shirt, take action. Warmer temperatures make your lawn receptive to feeding and that will green up your grass fast. Auckland's turf guru Gerard Dyer recommends Bioboost as an organic slow-release food.

Fertilise citrus trees - Reward your trees after a heavy winter harvest. Sprinkle slow-release food around the drip line and water it in well.

Stake tall plants - Tie up fast-growing or overly lax plants. Dahlias, delphiniums and heleniums will be statuesque in the border over summer, but only if you start training them upright now. But be alert - Stay vigilant for a late frost or a cold snap. Spring may be here but weather is uncertain this month, so don't be in too much of a hurry. Watch the weather forecast and keep frost cloth handy to protect the green tops of early spuds. Don't sow cucurbits (courgettes, pumpkins, cucumbers) until late in the


