PAGE 2 I STRANGE VEHICLE AT YOUR NEIGHBOURS?

Do you phone 111 or don't you? This is the question most people ask themselves when they see something that is a little out of the ordinary. There are many scenarios that could be considered but one that pops up regularly is if you spot a strange vehicle in your neighbours drive. In this situation don't hesitate to call 111. Police would rather find the vehicle and occupants to be legitimate than to be phoned by the homeowner at a later time advising of a burglary at the address. The time it takes to check out suspicious vehicles is far less than the time it takes to investigate a burglary. Should the vehicle leave the address prior to Police arrival note the direction that it leaves in, obtain the best description you can and update Police. If you are not still on the phone call back as these updates are vital for Police to quickly locate the vehicle.

It could be the builders who built your new deck or the bin company that supplied them the bin. One of the staff at Kumeu Gym, it could have been the guy that delivered your water when you ran low last year. What about that guy you see walking every morning around the block, it could even be the guy that services your aircon at your office building. He may also just tiled your bathroom or did some investigative work for you. You could of spoken to her about job recruitment or he may have spoken to you in his line of work as a policeman. If you had the flu you probably bought a product from his pharmaceutical company and if you have been in hospital you may of used another members medical supplies, the nurse may even be a member of our brigade, or the power supplied to your medical equipment was controlled by our brigade members company. If you have had to deal with a death in the family, he would of had a hand in the crafting of the casket. If the only thing that has died lately was your car, he could have been on the end of the phone sorting out the parts to get you back on the road. MAYOR LEN BROWN VISITS KUMEU OCTOBER 11. 2011

Our Mayor Len Brown has just released his view of Auckland.

It shows the overall vision of how Auckland will look over 20-30 years. The big items – 2nd Harbour crossing, the Waterfront development and the inner city rail loop will, if they proceed will soak up much of the rates revenue of the new Council. Our area won't see much financial benefit. The new Plan identifies Kumeu as a 'satelite area' floating off the edge of the urbanisation of Westgate and Hobsonville. Kumeu must ensure its rural feel remains, whilst providing lifestyle blocks in basically a rural area. Our district survival will be around our ability to protect and enhance the tourism potential and our viticulture base. The Mayor will be with us at Soljans on 11th October at 7.30pm. I would hope many of the ratepayers take the opportunity and attend. If you have issues you wish to raise please email them to me. (email below)

Turning to the unfinished business of Huapai North zoning, you will recall the Rodney District Council in almost their last act approved the Scheme Change 127. That change was released by the new Auckland Council some ten month later in early August of this year. The stormwa-

ter ponds and the ownership maintenance and acquisition was left to 'developers sort it out approach' rather than the Council acting responsibly and resolving what in effects is a wider community problem. The Association have appealed that decision to the Environmental Court to try and obtain some common sense to enable landowners in that area to proceed with some certainty and fairness. I would like to think that the new Auckland Council Engineers will take a much more practical approach to the stormwater issue. See you at the Mayor's meeting on October 11 at Soljans 7.30pm.

PANNA COTTA WITH PISTACHIO

Panna cotta with Pistachios and Strawberry Coulis Serves a small dinner party of 6-8...or two greedy sisters.

Panna cotta, Italian for "cooked cream", hails from Piemonte in Northern Italy. There are now many variations, the only prerequisite is attaining a divine unctuous texture. This method is my friend Monica's. In winter she serves hers on creme anglaise and infuses the hot mixture with 4 tablespoons of instant coffee powder or a touch of cinnamon to taste. Experiment yourself, I have had beautiful pana cotta made simply with a twist of lemon zest or more surprisingly with organic lavender blooms steeped in the liquid and drizzled with floral honey syrup. It is a dessert that lends itself well to creative ingredients. Be mindful that the panna cotta itself is not meant to be overly sweet, it is the accompaniment that should add the sugar boost, along with depth, and in summer a zing of freshness. With the first Queensland strawberries in the shops, try serving a simple coulis as a partner. When I test ran the recipe, my sister and I had our first taste at lunchtime and somewhat shamefully had polished off the entire thing by dinner. Serve in 8 ramekins or shaped glasses, as a long thin log on a platter, or turned out on individual plates.

6 tsp gelatine

150g raw pistachios (optional), lightly toasted and roughly chopped 1 litre cream

100g caster sugar

1 vanilla bean and/or 4 tsp ground cardamon

1 punnet fresh strawberries

50g caster sugar

Soak the gelatine for 15 minutes in a little cold water.

Split the vanilla bean in two, and place in a pan with cream and 100g of the caster sugar. Add half of the pistachios and bring to the boil slowly, stirring to prevent cream from burning. As soon as the mix-

ture boils, remove from the heat. Squeeze any excess water from the gelatine and add to the pan, whisking until smooth.

Pour the mixture into moulds or ramekins. Allow to cool at room temperature and then place in the fridge for at least two hours until cold.

To make the coulis, core the strawberries and quarter. Place in a small pan with the remaining sugar and bring to a simmer. Remove from heat. Puree. Chill.

Either turn the cream out on individual serving plates or one platter and drizzle with coulis. Garnish with remaining chopped pistachios. Alternatively, dollop the coulis into each ramekin or glass and sprinkle with pistachios and perhaps some additional plain softly whipped cream.

DOG WELLNESS CHECKS

Here at Kumeu Vets we've just wrapped up a successful new promo of geriatric dog wellness checks. Many ailments were caught early on and nipped in the bud, or otherwise management strategies were put in place. In fact the promo was so successful that we've been asked to run a similar geriatric cat promo which will be on until the end of October. For \$40 your feline friend will get a thorough check up (normally \$52) and if any additional diagnostic work or treatment is needed this will be at a reduced rate.

Sadly a common ailment that vets are seeing more and more of is obese pets. In the past it was thought that fat cells didn't do much except for storing fat – but it's now well known that stored fat actively secretes inflammatory cytokines which affects many body systems. Being overweight puts a great deal of excess stress on joints, cruciate ligaments and intervertebral discs. It also leads to a raft of hormonal imbalances, respiratory problems, certain cancers not to mention heat and exercise intolerance ... quite a scary list, not to mention some of them can be very expensive to manage! Just like it's easier for us to lose a couple of kilos during the warmer months, if your pooch doesn't have a waistline or your cat is one big wobbly ball consider putting a couple of changes in place this spring. There are many easy things you can do and as always we're happy help!

VINEYARD HEPPENINGS AT KERR FARM WINE

September and October is when the new growing season starts again in the vineyard. All the winter pruning and the taking of cuttings should be finished. I was running a bit late this year so some of my later varieties did not get finished until the middle of the month. As the soil and the air temperatures rise and the days get longer budburst is stimulated. The buds that have been hiding all winter, begin to emerge from the canes of last year's fruiting wood. If the winter has had a few cold snaps and some good frosts, budburst is usually quite even and the shoots grow at a similar level of development. However if the winter has been warmer this is not the case and budburst can be uneven and therefor the shoots will be at different levels of development. This may not seem very important, but it is. If the shoots grow evenly, the grapes, the important part, ripen

evenly as well. At harvest time all the grapes will be at a similar stage of development and nice ripe fruit makes good wine. If budburst has been uneven the fruit will also ripen unevenly, so there will be ripe grapes and some not so ripe. This makes winemaking more difficult.
