HAVING PROBLEMS WITH YOUR NEIGHBOURS

The best way to deal with an issue from the start is to talk to the other person or people involved and attempt to rectify it in a civil manner, this sounds too easy but it is often never done. The District Council also have many departments designed to assist, such as Noise and Animal Control and provide an array of easy options for you to make contact with them. START THINKING ABOUT A FIXED-TERM RATE

Main point of interest currently is the worsening economic situation in Europe (ie. Greece), which may have a direct effect on NZ housing interest rates. The latest Christchurch after-shocks not so much. There is a 60% consensus from various financial institutions that the Official Cash Rate will start to move upwards towards the end of the year. The strong exchange rate and delays before the Christchurch reconstruction are expected to keep the OCR, and hence floating mortgage rates, unmoved until late 2011. But the RBNZ is still foreshadowing a significant amount of tightening once the rebuild begins, and the shorter fixed-term rates are likely to incorporate this well in advance. The window of opportunity for sitting on floating rates, before jumping into a fixed term, is quickly narrowing.

May saw the annual Westpac rescue helicopter appeal and our target of \$1m was reached again – thanks to all who contributed.

The Kumeu Residents and Ratepayers have confirmed that the mayor, Len Brown, will attend the meeting of the same on Tuesday October 11. He intends to outline the plan for Auckalnd and to obtain feedback from the district directly. As yet a venue has not been selected however this will be advertised to the community in due course to allow as many as possible to attend. Last week at our June meeting we were provided with an aerial view of the motorway extension and the Westgate development. Noel Rugg gave an impressive overview of the developments. This represents a massive urbanization project within 6 minutes from Kumeu. The NZTA representative, engineer Kenny See, had no solution to table over the upgrading required for Kumeu Township but would put us in contact with the engineers responsible. The mpotorway will open in September 2011. On June 15, Chris Welsh, Nick Nobilo and others had a brief meeting with the Mayor to outline frustration over the Winstone Recycling Plant issues and the lack of progress on the Huapai south zoning. The close proximity to Auckland with greater accessibility will put preasure on the district. Len Brown gave a good hearing and advised that he was looking forward to the meeting on October 11. PAGE 8 / CALF SELECTION AND CALF SCOURS

When buying in calves it's really true that you get what you pay for. A healthy calf should weigh no less than 35kgs (average Friesian X bull calf), not have any painful joints or be lame, should have a clean dry navel, bright clear eyes, a dry tail, strong suckle reflex and must have received good quality colostrum (not always the case!!). It's also worth buying calves from as few sources as possible.

The next hurdle will be preventing (and possibly managing) sick scouring calves. These calves need to be kept out of the draught and need lots of supportive care in the form of fluids and electrolytes (4-6 L per day given in 2-3 feeds) – dehydration is what kills them and 95% of scours responds to fluid therapy alone. When mixing up the milk powder ensure you are sticking to exact label specifications - too much or too little water alters milk clot formation resulting in nutritional scours. Feed at regular intervals and don't overfeed. Have a sick calf pen to isolate and treat "poor do-ers" promptly and disinfect between animals. Finally calves should always have ad lib access to fresh clean water and fresh calf meal (pellets) to promote rumen development early on. ORANGE AND CARDAMOM TORTE

This is my absolute favourite go-to elegant tea cake. Loosely based on Claudia Roden's famous flourless torte, but without all the fuss of boiling an orange for 3 hours, it is simply divine. Dense but still light and fresh in flavour, moist, and slightly exotic, it lasts several days. While it is nicest cold with a glass of mint tea, or at the end of a meal with a glass of fine desert wine, it can also be served warm with lightly whipped cream or gently melting vanilla ice-cream. The cake is Spanish in influence and origin; Andalusia experiences the same vibrant burst of citrus in winter as us. I had the pleasure of learning this recipe from my friend Cristina who grew up in a rich cultural and culinary melting pot where the bitter orange's white flowers infused the whole city with the scent of blossom in spring. Cardamom is an old spice, the whole dried pods are almost eucalyptus-like in aroma, while the ground powder has a warmer, sweeter taste. Many cultures chew the pods after meals to freshen breath. You may need to buy the whole pods from one of our local specialty fruit shops rather than the supermarket. I got my last batch from SH 1's Vegeco and picked up some of their brilliant vacuum sealed sundried tomatoes too.

Cake

6 eggs, separated 175g caster grated rind and juice of 1 orange

175g ground almonds 75g day old breadcrumbs flour for dusting the pan

juice of 3 oranges 3 cardamom pods, bruised 50g caster sugar

- 1. Grease and line a 23 inch spring-from tin, dust with flour. Preheat oven to 180C.
- 2. Beat egg yolks, sugar, orange rind and juice until pale and thickened and stir in almonds and breadcrumbs.
- 3. Whisk egg whites until just stiff. Fold one spoon into the almond mixture to loosen, and then gently fold through the remainder.
- 4. Bake for 35-40 minutes until a skewer inserted into the center comes out clean.
- 5. Place all ingredients for syrup in a small pan. Boil vigorously 3 minutes, until syrupy. Spike the cake all over with the skewer. Pour syrup through a strainer over the cake, distributing evenly. Cool. remove gently from tin, slice into thick wedges and serve with fresh raspberries and a little cream.


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
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
