HIGH ON GLOSS - SPARCE ON SPECIFICS

The Rodney Boards Plan is out for consultation. With submissions closing at the Council on Monday August 8. The Board Plan is high on gloss covers and sparse on specifics which can now be seen by the community. The Plan has the same structure and layout as other Local Boards in adjacent areas of Henderson and Massey. In Kumeu a Heritage Park is put forward for us, but little else. There is no provision for extension of footpaths in the area. Likewise the future options for roading alternatives hasn't been costed or really identified. An extension for the Cemetery also has been mentioned but not accounted for in the next 3 year Plan. Clearly we, and hopefully others, will make a submission before the August 8 requiring the Cemetery and bypass roading to be urgently costed into the Board Plan. If enough speak up for what we require maybe the Board will listen. The alternative is that the staff will carry on and do what they think is best!

The trick is to find it, record it and photograph the item. It continues to frustrate Police when hard working, honest members of the community, through no fault of their own, become victims of a burglary and Police are required to take a report from them which has no information that will lead to the identification of their property should we locate it. Set aside a couple of hours this weekend to identify and mark your property in some way. Not only will it help us in identifying your stuff it will also assist in your insurance claims which by my own observations are regularly underestimated. Often the most sentimental and underestimated items taken from a home is jewellery, it is recommended that you photograph it all if you want at least a fighting chance of getting it back. EXPERIENCED AT ANIMAL RESCUES

Animal Rescues - although it is not our core business, animal rescues count for a number of call outs each year. As we live in a rural area it is likely we will continue to have more. Having a fire appliance and crew involved in these types of incidents may delay our crews response time to life or property saving incidents eg, car accidents and house fires. We will always respond to a more urgent incident if at an animal rescue. It is just that we may take a little longer to respond. So, how can you help us? If you have livestock, horses and cattle are our most common, fence off the water ways is the best option. And a couple of ways to do this is - permanent fencing or if it is not practical then temporary fencing can be used. A product I saw at the field days recently was plastic standards - they are made of a light colour so that livestock can see them and don't rust when used in swampy ground. So plastic standards and electric tape should do the trick. The other option is to not place your stock in paddocks which have these possible hazards present. So with your assistance in live stock control Kumeu Volunteer Fire Brigade will be able to focus on our core business - saving lives and property. If you would like to attend a demonstration and workshop on animal rescue techniques from swamps and streams, Waitakere Rural Fire Force will be hosting a free evening demonstration which will provide practical advice and hands on learning. 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SUFFERING A LITTLE GRID-LOCK

Instead of habit forming laxatives why not try kiwifruit? A number of human clinical studies have found kiwifruit a highly effective way to provide relief from constipation. For some years kiwifruit had been anecdotally reported to have a laxative effect so a research group from the Auckland University of Technology, New Zealand conducted a study with older age adults giving them 2-3 kiwifruit a day for 3 weeks. They found that "regular use of kiwifruit appeared to lead to a bulkier and softer stool, as well as more frequent stool production."

A subsequent study in China also found that just 2 kiwifruit a day for 4 weeks relieved constipation, improved general comfort and satisfaction and decreased laxative use. And more recently irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) sufferers who ate kiwifruit (2 per day for 4 weeks) gained relief from constipation and improved digestive health. A DUCKS TAIL

It's that time of year again, a time when you see a mother duck emerge from under a bush with a trail of little quackers waddling behind. Sadly over the next few days it is an all too familiar tale as the numbers of ducklings diminish. 6, 4, 3, 2, none ... let's face it, ducks are not the world's greatest mothers .. They either can't count or don't care, possibly both. It is hard not to interfere when you find an abandoned duckling, Our first for the year was discovered having hatched and then fallen down between the bricks in a retaining wall. It's piercing squeak summoning help and a mother no-where to be seen. One severely pruned shrub and a semi demolished wall later and Floyd was free. (get it? ... another brick in the wall!) Over the years we have become quite proficient at hand raising ducklings. The critical ingredient early on seems to be warmth and getting the new baby to take some food. If you don't achieve this within a few hours then it is likely that the duckling will not survive. Unlike birds such as sparrows that open their beak on reflex when Mum arrives, ducklings have to learn to eat. We find a mash of poultry pellets, tinned cat food and warm water in a jam jar lid seems to do the trick to start with. A really good sign is when they start to preen themselves and of course a few poos in the box are a good sign everything is working!

A large plastic storage box in the bathroom as an ideal "home", a base of untreated sawdust, hay or even newspaper makes for easy cleaning and also retains heat. Maintaining the bathroom at about 25 degrees keeps them happy too. The temperature can be reduced as they gain weight and maintain their own body heat. Singles need a bit of extra special help in the way of a mirror for "company". As babies they haven't developed the natural oils so will sink if left in water (ducklings in the wild get a bit of "waterproofing" by sleeping under an oily mother). Once 3-4 days old we offer them a twice daily swim in the basin, for no more than 5 minutes so they don't lose too much heat. Feeding ... once these little guys learn how to eat they never stop, feeding every three hours. We stick to Whiskas cat food, NRM Peck and Lay and an occasional pinch of calcium powder. We have seen some incredibly rapid weight gains, it is not uncommon to see them double in weight every three days. At 3-4 weeks old they are becoming a bit large (and smelly) to remain indoors and require a suitable pen outside in a warm sheltered spot. A large, but shallow water tub in the enclosure gives them hours of fun and the out-door enclosure also provides an opportunity to wean them from expensive cat food to slightly less expensive full maize / peck and lay mix. At 6-7 weeks they are still developing adult plumage but are big enough to be released. Most of the ducks we raise are Pekins or Rouens ... being flightless they will stay with our flock. Mallards (like our latest guests) are wild and will probably just fly off into the sunset without as much as a thank you guack, but they still make you smile.

Kumeu is fortunate enough to have a core group of passionate members (players and committee) that keep coming back and keeping our club alive. The initial completion date was September however good weather and tight project management has allowed HEB contractors to complete the project over a month ahead of schedule. The link has not escaped controversy with questions raised about why some on and off ramps were not formed and why some of the walkway bridges had become expensive art-forms. 

Beer is a relatively low carbohydrate beverage anyway. Beer has around 3-4 g of sugar/L which is a third of fruit juice at around 11 g/L. Around 80% of the kilojoules in beer come from the alcohol, and 20% from the carbs. So taking most of the carbs out only cuts the kilojoules by about 15%, but cuts the flavour by 90%. If you are thinking about drinking low-carb beer for your waistline, I suggest just don't! Instead come down to Hallertau and drink some delicious full-carb Pale Ale, but just drink 15% less. PERFECT ANNA FUDGE

I came across this triple tested recipe torn out of a magazine by my predecessor. 10 minutes later, gratefully, I had what appeared to be perfect fudge. This recipe is such a delight, there is no tricky timing issues, no incongruous equipment, such as sugar thermometers, and best of all is how special it looks. Pistachios are expensive nuts, but 50g is a small amount and they lend the finished product a gourmet air. It makes a lovely gift if presented in layered tissue lined boxes or small cellophane bags. Chocolate's flavour and quality is largely determined by the amount of coco solids, most good brands such as Lindt now state the amount on the front, so use 60-75% coco solids for the dark chocolate in this recipe for a more decadent fudge however plain cooking chocolate works perfectly well too.

10 Minute Chocolate and Pistachio Fudge - Makes about 50 squares 250g dark chocolate (the best quality you can find), finely chopped 100g milk chocolate, finely chopped 350g condensed milk 1 tsp vanilla extract 50g pistachios, roughly chopped Line a 15 x 23cm tin with baking paper.

Place a pan of water on the stove and heat till simmering. Cover with a heatproof glass or metal bowl and place the chocolate and condensed milk in it. Stir occasionally until the mixture is smooth and shiny. Stir in the vanilla and then scrape into the prepared tin. Smooth fudge and then sprinkle over the pistachios, pressing them in lightly to prevent them rolling off when set.

Cover the tray with clingfilm and refrigerate until set, about 3 hours. This can now be kept in the fridge for up to a month. When ready to serve, cut into 2.5cm squares and store in airtight boxes in fridge or the cupboard for a few days. Alternatively, package prettily and visit a friend for afternoon tea.

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
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LUMPS AND BUMPS AND SKIN CANCERS




Abnormal lumps are very common in our four-legged friends. Many lumps are harmless (such as fatty lipomas) or they may be the result of an insect bite or other such injury and tend to go away on their own in time. On the flipside, many other lumps prove to be cancerous and these are the ones that you want to catch quickly. Some of these nastier forms can begin simply as a change in skin pigmentation or as a small scab. A good example of this is cats with white noses or ears – skin carcinomas in these areas begin as just a small non-healing scab and can quickly invade deeper tissue. It's easy enough to surgically remove these provided they are caught early. Other rea-

sons to get your pet to the vet include any lump that grows quickly, appears ulcerated or bleeding or one that is in an awkward position like on the paw or around the eyes. Remember the team at Kumeu Vets are always happy to chat! Written by Dr Irene van den Berg

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
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MURIWAI SURF CLUBROOMS UPDATE

Construction of the long awaited new surf life saving club and community centre at Muriwai takes a big step forward this month, with Auckland Council commencing work to lay in the access road to the new site. At the same time utility services (water, electricity and telecommunications) will be run to the building site. The waste water plant for the new facility will be installed as the next piece of work, with construction of the building expected to start in September.

Behind the scenes, the trust leading the project, Auckland Council and funding agencies are finalising arrangements around the \$4.1m construction budget. \$3.1m is already committed to the project, with the trust focussed on securing a further \$1m in the next 12 months.

The Muriwai Lifeguard Service, the sports fishing club and other community groups expect to be able to move in to the new facility in June 2012, at which stage the existing surf club building will be demolished and the site reinstated as park land. 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INEYARD HAPPENINGS AT KERR FARM WINE



Winter is the time for pruning grapevines. During winter the vines are dormant, they have lost all their leaves and the sap is retracting back into the trunk and roots. This stored energy is what the vine uses in early spring to push out the new seasons buds. It is therefore an advantage to leave pruning to the last minute before spring sap rise. Practically this is not really possible. The later pruning also helps delay bud burst to some extent for the early budding vines. This gets the vines past the danger of late frosts which fry the new buds. So planning is needed in how you prune your block of vines. Prune the later varieties first, because you know they will not bud usually till the frosts have passed. Prune the early varieties last thus delaying their bud burst as much as you can to get them past the frosts. Next time you are driving past your local vineyards, have a look, some have been pruned, the late budding vines. Those still waiting are the early budding vines. Happy Pruning Jaison Kerr.
