KUMEU TOWN CENTRE GETS THUMBS DOWN

The four day 'Resource Consent' hearing was held on 22-25 August at Soljan's Restaurant. The applicants took 2 days to produce their evidence on Traffic & Urban Design and reasons for the substantial Scheme Change'. Apart from some oblique photographic examples by Foodstuffs executive, Tony Catton as to what the 4000m 'New World Supermarket' would look like, no other layouts or roading pattern or housing types were produced. The community are still quessing as to the form of what is likely to occur. NZTA representatives were very reluctant participants but finally agreed that the only and preferred entrance to the development is through the now abandoned 'Placemakers' site, which is now owned by 'Foodstuffs'. They have indicated they want to be establish with the Supermarket within 2 years. The lack of layout Plan has made it very difficult for the Association to readily see the form of what will occur within the Scheme Change. The applicant, represented by Doug Allen Solicitor, made it clear that they only want to deal between the designers and the Council staff. They refused community involvement. A situation totally opposed by the Association. Ratepayers position was made clear to the 3 member commission at the Development Concept Plan the developers have to provide has to be notified for community involvement and participation. ...cont pg 4

A recent law change has highlighted the risks associated with driving whilst under the influence. If you are under the age of 20 your breath alcohol reading must be zero. Some other driving issues impairing judgement includes:

- prescription and recreational drugs
- cell phones
- applying make up (generally not the blokes)

- sleep deprivation
- and getting dressed

- Child locked in Bedroom; I am sure we all at one stage in our lives have had to deal with that one. -Bird Stuck in Tree; (one of my 1st calls 10 years ago). That's something to tell the grandkids. Don't Birds usu-

ally sit in trees? -Plane in a Tree; this will be a big one. Model glider caught up in branches. Send up the newest Firefighter, up

the highest ladder to retrieve for the concerned owner. -Car stuck in Drain; early morning call. Turns out Driver was best to have slept off his night of having a good time, before heading home. He called 111 hoping we could tow him out so he could get home. Handed to Police. -Fat Cat stuck in Drain; sometimes just more hands on the job and a second opinion gets the job done in the end. Winston, the cat, was not to impressed with the extraction technique, but the owner and crew were happy to see Winston meander off into the paddock (a little wetter than usual).

ZINC PREVENTS THE COMMON COLD

If you take zinc regularly you can reduce your risk of catching a cold, and if you start taking zinc when the cold catches you, you will beat it quicker. A large review of 15 clinical studies totaling over 1300 people found that zinc supplements significantly reduce both symptoms and severity of illness. Zinc has been shown to support your immune system and may even be directly antiviral.

Taking zinc within 24 hours of the start of symptoms was found to cut the risk of still having symptoms at day 7 of a cold by about half. And for prevention taking zinc for at least 5 months cut cold risk by a third. People who took zinc also had significantly lower rates of school absence, and prescription of antibiotics.

A safe amount of Zinc to take as a maintenance dose through winter is 15mg daily. However it is very safe to take 15mg three times a day whilst you are fighting a cold/viral illness.

The risk is that the community will have no say and that the design will be handled as a non-notified Resource Consent (shades of Winstones Recycling Plant). The Consultant Planner for the Auckland Council recommended that the Concept Plan be notified and that the Residential Density be 400sqm minimum. That recommendation is consistent with the Associations position on density and process. Maddrens are still pushing 200 sqm minimum section size which will result in 3 storied housing on extremely small sites with little or no amenities. That form of development is not appropriate in the Associations view. The hearing chaired by Greg Hill, Planner and Commissioners, Leigh McGregor and John Kirikiri has been adjourned. They advised that the decision will be out soon probably within a month. I believe the Association had a fair hearing but we are in the Commissions hands for the decision. I can see a appeal looming if the non-notified approach is taken. Watch this space. 

Hoppy beer curbs the development of fat inside the body, researchers at Japan's top brewery have found. A team of researchers reached the conclusion after feeding a group of mice with high-fat feed containing isohumulones, an important component of hops that creates the bitter taste, and another group with plain high-fat feed. After six weeks, the group that was given the isohumulones-free feed grew 22 percent fatter than the other group. Kirin researchers believe the hoppy/bitter component of beer help the development of fat-dissolving enzymes. 

Of late, virtually every magazine you pick up lists the "superfoods". Eating these regularly promises glossy hair, plump skin, a better attention span and improved resistance to disease. With little variation, they include salmon and oily fish, berries, nuts, broccoli and leafy greens. Unfortunately most of these items fall into the luxury category for many households. Probably the most prosaic candidate, broccoli, is typically the only vegetable making the list that is regularly priced reasonably. However, even the biggest vegetable devotee, can tired of frequent servings of steamed/stir fried/blanched broccoli. Pondering how to make something a bit different I broached the subject with the owner of a popular Sydney delicatessen. To my delight she suggested a simple method to make an interesting salad component or side dish. This presents a more unique and grown up alternative to the standard smothering in an unctuous blanket of cheese sauce. Not that I'm knocking cheese sauce. A lot of mothers owe their children's tacit acceptance of a variety of vegetables to cheese sauce. For over 10 years that was the only way I would eat cauliflower. This method gives broccoli the gourmet treatment, maximizing the flavour and avoiding any trace of sogginess. You are left with a semi-caramelised robust accompaniment, or a fabulous base for a warm winter salad. To fill

The only way to travel

So you've just come home from work, it's getting dark and the heavens are threatening to open up at any minute. You rush down to the horse paddocks to give them a feed and put their rugs on when you notice one of the ponies is literally stuck in the fence, or has a massive bleeding injury – every horse owner's nightmare. First thing's first – stay calm yourself. Before you rush up to the house to frantically call the after hours vet try to assess the situation. Even if a wound is bleeding you'd be surprised how much blood they can lose before you need to worry! Unless severely lame, try to get the horse somewhere clean and dry where it can be examined properly, ideally with light and where a wound can be given a good flush. Remember that a cast or stuck horse will be stressed so keep clear of its legs and use ropes (looped not tied) around legs to try to move or flip a horse. Try to determine which structures may be involved; is it skin deep or is a muscle belly or tendon involved? How close to a joint is the wound? Is there one main wound or multiple? The more information you can give us over the phone the better. If there is an actively bleeding wound grab some thick towels and apply pressure until the vet gets there.

Did you know?

- A horse can only breath through it's nose
- An average horse has 50 litres of blood

Progress can and needs to be controlled. This is what a democracy is about and what planning should be concerned with. What would it take to persuade the powers to be to complete the wonderful possibilities instead of killing things, concreting things and poisoning the good in this area. I am proposing a HONEY ZONE be established in a garden suburb around Kumeu area, on our wine trail, in our tourist corridor to the amazing and the scenic West Coast. Bee colonies are collapsing worldwide and need our urgent help and protection. They need to be near varied, unpolluted suitable food and water. About 75% of our food depends on pollination. About \$81 million worth of honey is exported per annum plus bees and bee by products. The government is trying to stimulate this industry but having little real effect. We have so much to lose, and we can so easily do things that help:

- Plant bee friendly plants for the coming season
- Leave out small pockets of water
- Leave out small parcels of honey

We gardeners are readily set up but all the community has a responsibility, children have a responsibility. By planting suitable verges, parks, public places, roundabouts and council or government land corridors we can all take a national lead and set the precedent. Kumeu has a winery area, we have a shopping area, heck we have a commercial area, what I want is to have a garden area that can make this community beautiful and have a positive effect on the restoration of our bees. This would accomplish so much in our area including the increase in bee numbers, beautify our town, preserve our green image, maintain our western corridor which minimizes maintenance, encourages tourism, and provides job opportunities directly and indirectly through the increase in bee numbers. 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PRE-SETTLEMENT INSPECTIONS



When you are purchasing a property under the standard NZLS Sale and Purchase Agreement you have the right to do a final inspection of the property prior to settlement (except in the case of some *mortgagee sales*). This inspection gives you the opportunity to carefully check through the property before paying the settlement funds across to the Vendor. In this inspection there are 3 main things you should be checking for:

- 1. Has the Vendor / Tenant moved out of the property?
- 2. Have the Vendors left the chattels as shown on the chattels list of the Sale and Purchase Agreement?
- 3. Has anything been damaged since signing the Sale and Purchase Agreement?

If in your final inspection you find that something has been damaged or removed you need to immediately notify your solicitor who will advise you of your rights and negotiate with the Vendors solicitor to get it rectified. Unfortunately the standard Sale and Purchase Agreement does not stipulate that the property needs to be cleaned prior to settlement. Remember that conditions
