SHOW ME THE MONEY - HOUSE HISTERIA



The housing market in Kumeu continues to heat up as demand peeks in the residential market and buyers continue to feel the squeeze. Properties sometimes last as few as two days or two weeks but demand ensures that the money drops onto the table and buyers are almost relieved that they have secured a home. Fuelled by a lack of rental properties in the area the demand has seen property prices in Kumeu continue to push up, with the median price for a three bedroom home at \$535,000.

VICTORY FOR KUMEU-HUAPAI RATEPAYERS

Finally I can report that the Association and Maddren's have an agreement to settle the appeal made to the Maddren/Foodstuffs scheme change. The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets in place how the details of the new Town Centre and Supermarket are to progress. Before this Maddren's couldn't or wouldn't produce any layout plans of what was to occur in the development. They put to much reliance on the rules to hopefully control the form of the development but there was no control over the standard or appearance. That was of concern to the Association. The pragmatic approach has been taken! - A Liaison Group has been agreed between Maddren's and the Association, this group consisting of two from each group will meet to go over any designs or building permits produced by Maddren's or the incoming owners. The requirement is ongoing in that if Maddren's have a joint venture or sell completely, there is a legal obligation to consult with the community before the applications are made to the Auckland Council. The Liaison Group will come back to the community when there is some design to report on.

BE CONSIDERATE WHEN LIGHTING UP

From the 1st April the Fire season is open which will allow you to have an open fire on your Rural property. Remember open fires are not allowed in urban areas at any time in Muriwai, Waimauku, Huapai, Kumeu or Riverhead. A permit is still required if your property is within 1km of Woodhill or Riverhead forests, call the Rural Fire Officer at Auckland Council for more details. To rid your property of unwanted vegetation other options to consider other than a fire are:

- cutting it up for your home heating needs.
- having it chipped and using it for mulch around your garden
- or having it removed off your property

Waiting till the vegetation is dry and not green greatly reduces the effect of smoking out your neighbours (and creating a fire callout for us to investigate) and creating hours of visual and air pollution in our beautiful surrounding countryside for the community and tourists to see.

Whatever you decide, be considerate of your neighbours and thoughtful of your environment.





CHOC—COCONUT RUM BALLS

Make these chocolate, coconut-coated rum balls at least a day before serving to allow them to firm up and allow the flavours to blend. Word of warning; not to be made if you're watching your diet, these are VERY addictive!

Makes about 30 rum balls.



Ingredients

250g Nice biscuits (I used Arnott's brand)
3 tablespoons cocoa powder
1/2 cup desiccated coconut
395g can sweetened condensed milk
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract (1 teaspoon natural vanilla essence)

1 1/2 tablespoons rum (for flavour, I prefer 2 tablespoons)

2/3 cup, lightly packed sultanas

about 3/4 cup desiccated coconut, for coating

Place biscuits and cocoa in a food processor or blender and crush until very fine.

If you used a blender, pour the crushed biscuit and cocoa mixture into a large bowl and stir in the remaining ingredient (except the coconut for coating). If you used a food processor, you can add the 1/2 cup coconut, condensed milk, vanilla and rum to the biscuit crumbs and process until the mixture is well combined. Then add the sultanas and process on very low speed until just combined. Place mixture in refrigerator or freezer until it is firm enough to roll into balls (about 30 minutes in the refrigerator). If the mixture is too soft, it will be sticky and difficult to roll properly and the rum balls will not hold their shape. Sprinkle coconut for coating onto a plate or into a flat-bottomed dish. Roll generously heaped teaspoons of mixture into balls, and then roll in coconut. Store, preferably in a single layer, in an airtight container in the refrigerator (also freeze well) and for those who prefer, there are organic options also. READING DIFFICULTIES MAY BE EYE RELATED

Children with reading difficulties may benefit from coloured lenses, studies in the UK have shown. Matthew Whittington from For Eyes in the Kumeu Village attended a seminar in Australia recently where the use of precision tinted lenses to remedy reading problems was discussed. The secret appears to be in finding the exact tint to suit the individual child – hence the term 'precision tinted lenses'. The science behind the success of the lenses is that visual processing, which occurs in the brain, can cause hyper-stimulation of some visual cortex areas, resulting in processing errors. Selectively calming these 'hot spots' in the visual cortex by filtering out the select bands of colour that cause the over-stimulation makes print easier to see and process, increasing reading speed and accuracy dramatically. CHECK YOUR RAGS BEFORE YOU BIN THEM


A number of fires in the area have been sourced to the use of chemicals, oils, stains and lubricants on rags. It is sometimes overlooked that chemicals, oils, greases, waxes, stains and thinning compounds are highly dangerous because they generate heat when condensed, mixed with other substances and left in tight confined areas. Over a period of time this will lead to the chemicals reacting and generating significant heat build up leading to smouldering and in turn small pockets of charring leading to combustion. At times the heat build up can be developed over hours in others over days, however the result is almost inevitably the same, a fully involved fire. ON THE LOOKOUT FOR MUDFEVER

We're halfway through autumn now and we're starting to see some seasonal problems in horses associated with the wetter ground. Mudfever is a bacterial infection of the legs normally starting at the back of the pastern which then spreads upwards causing swelling and discomfort. The key to treatment is removal of the scabs and keeping the horse out of the mud allowing aeration of the legs. We have skin creams available; however some particularly bad cases don't respond and need a vet check and antibiotics. Hoof abscesses are another common problem when the ground is wet. Hoof abscesses often cause a hopping 'three-legged' lameness and the sore hoof will feel hot with a bounding pulse in the leg. We can confirm it by hoof testing and can often alleviate the horses' pain with medication and release of the pus which has built up in the foot. Early treatment often means a quicker recovery!.
